37 Jamaat-Shibir
men held at
Moulvibazar,
arms recovered

MOULVIBAZAR, Mar 7: Police arrested 37 leaders and workers of Jamaat-e-Islami and its student organisation Islami Chhatra Shibir from Jamaat's district unit office here today and recovered huge arms and ammunition.

Of the arrested, four are the front ranking leaders of Jamaat district unit. They are Sirajul Islam Matlab, Ameer of district unit, Md Yunus, Principal of Kari Faruq KG School, Jasim Uddin Mamum and Hafez Nazrul Islam, both are the teachers of Kari Faruq KG School.

Acting on a tip off, police led by a Magistrate and additional SP raided the district unit office of Jamaat-e-Islami at Dewan Manzil in the town at noon and arrested the leaders and workers.

They also recovered huge arms and ammunition from the office.

The recovered arms and ammunition include 20 cocktails, two LG, two pipe guns, 208 ram daos, one axe, 315 iron rods and 12 cartridges. Police also seized an unlicensed motorcycle from there.

Two separate cases have been lodged with Moulvibazar Sadar thana.

JP faction's
council session
April 23-24

The breakaway faction of Jatiya Party yesterday decided to hold a special council session of the party April 23-24, reports UNB.

This was announced at a meeting of the group at a city community centre, presided over by Mizanur Rahman Chowdhury.

Addressing the meeting, Communications Minister Anwar Hossain Manju said: "We want to stick to 'positive' policies of Jatiya Party for consolidating democracy and improving the socio-economic condition of the commonman".

"Our initiative is to ensure the voting right of people, resist politics of conspiracy and grabbing power through illegal means," he added. "Electoral should be the only means to change the government and to go to power."

Addressing the gathering Mizanur Rahman Chowdhury said, their aim was to build a well organised Jatiya Party. The party can't march forward at the free will of one person.

Reading out the declaration of the meeting, Sharifuddin Ahmed Jhantu MP said Mizanur Rahman Chowdhury, Anwar Hossain Manju and Tajul Islam were given the responsibility to call a special council session of the Jatiya Party on April 23-24.

Bombs explode at Udichi function in Jessore

8 killed, over 100 injured

Two powerful explosions at a cultural function of Udichi Shilpi Goshthi in the early hours of Sunday killed at least eight people and wounded more than 100 others, 29 of them critically, at an open air stage at Jessore Town Hall Maidan.

None claimed responsibility for the explosions at an interval of five minutes, that tore through the dais at 1:10 am, killing two persons on the spot. Six others died in hospitals, our correspondents said.

Four of the dead were identified as Sandha Rani Ghose, Sheikh Nazmul Huda Tapan, Ram Krishna Roy and Shah Alam. They were artistes of Udichi that organised the three-day celebrations on the occasion of its 31st founding anniversary and national conference. The three other dead have been identified as Babul Sudarshan, Elias, Noor Islam and Milan alias Minto.

The critically wounded were taken to Khulna Medical College Hospital (KMCH). From there six were flown to Dhaka by a helicopter. They are Ratan Biswas, 30, Monwar Alam, 32, Gokul Majhi, 28, Ali Ahmed, 20, Haran Chandra, 52 and Nahid, 22.

The others being treated at the KMCH include Sarin, 8, Ramjan Ali, 37, Monowar, 30 and Mohammad Ali, 23.

The explosions which police suspect were triggered by a timing device rocked the town, creating panic and leaving people wondering who had caused those.

Police arrested five suspects after the explosions. Army engineers and bomb experts have visited the area to search for clues regarding the explosives and devices used.

Some witnesses and police sources claimed that three hours before the incident, some musclemen kidnapped a young woman from the function after a quarrel with the organisers of the show.

They reportedly had the quarrel on payment of 'toll' to the youths. But Kotwali police were not available for comment.

Hasan Imam, who was re-elected President of Udichi, told newsmen that the attack was carried out in a planned manner, centring the conference of the organisation.

He along with others had earlier left Jessore for Dhaka after addressing the concluding session of the conference at about 10 pm.

Udichi Shilpi Goshthi was founded in 1968 as a cultural front of the Communist Party of Bangladesh. But the organisation

Identify those involved
in bomb blasts: PM

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina has announced that incumbent Mohammad Hanif is the Awami League candidate in the city corporation mayoral elections.

She expressed firm commitment to ensure that the upcoming local government polls are held in a free and fair manner.

The AL chief was speaking at a rally organised by her party in observance of the historic March 7 at Paltan Maidan in the city.

Against a backdrop of the combined opposition's much-propagated stand against the recently staged municipal polls, Hasina said, "They (the opposition) should be ashamed of their resist-polls call, which got no response from people. Even some BNP candidates have got elected in the pourashava (municipal elections)."

As she declared Hanif as her

Govt to take over Kafco,
if needed, says Tofail

The government is willing to take over the debt-ridden, cash-strapped Karnafuli Fertiliser Company (Kafco) if necessary but will not capitulate to undue threats from lenders and foreign shareholders, Industries Minister Tofail Ahmed told a crucial meeting yesterday.

In a strongly worded rejection of the proposed commercial settlement, the key element in the current crisis, the minister said the foreign shareholders were free to buy the government shares to be in full control.

"If the government was to pay under the guarantees, the government could pay off all the lenders. The government shares to be in full control, sources said.

However, the minister later told The Daily Star that the meeting ended in a positive note with consensus on major points of dispute such as equipment problems and financial restructuring. "I am very happy, satisfied. We arrived at a consensus,"

he said, calling it a historic meeting.

"We all agreed to wait for the IFC (International Finance Company) report, its financial restructuring plans, technical audit on plant problems etc. We also agreed that Kafco would pay directly to BGSL (Bangladesh Gas Systems Ltd) instead of through BCIC."

In the two-hour meeting, the minister dictated terms.

"If the government was to pay under the guarantees, the government could pay off all the lenders. The government could take over Kafco, and the foreign shareholders could sell their shares to the government," Tofail Ahmed was quoted to have told the meeting.

"Either the foreign shareholders should sell out their shares or the government

should be allowed to sell its shares and get out of Kafco."

He said the question could come up because Bangladesh had made no gains from the flagship, long portrayed as the test case for foreign investment into a national programme.

The minister began with his observation that the foreign shareholders had been taking the lion's share of the benefits from the US\$ 600 million project, while all risks and responsibility were on the government of Bangladesh.

"But now the lenders were knocking at the government's door, asking for payment under its guarantees," he was quoted as saying.

The meeting between the government and Kafco's foreign shareholders was convened by

AL eyeing one-party rule: Khaleda

Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Begum Khaleda Zia has said the ruling party is conspiring to hold future national polls unilaterally to reintroduce one-party rule in the country.

Holding of municipal polls without the participation of the opposition parties clearly proved that it was also planning to hold the national elections keeping the opposition away so that they can capture power again, she observed.

The Awami League will again amend the Constitution, as it had done in the past, to reintroduce one-party system after holding one-party polls.

Begum Zia said when a delegation of Jatiyatabadi Ulema Dal led by its convenor, Nazibul Bashar, Maizbhandari met her at her official residence yesterday evening.

The BNP chief said this conspiracy would destroy the country and its people and it must be resisted at any cost.

This is why all patriotic citi-

zens and parties have to join the current movement by the Opposition.

Besides, the Ulema and Islamic scholars and thinkers will have to join the movement to foil all "evil designs" of this government, she added.

Turning to law and order, Begum Zia said lawlessness across the country has taken a serious turn and there is no security of life of the citizens.

On the incident in Jessore, she said several people were killed and an unspecified number of people injured in bomb explosions on the concluding day of national conference of Udichi.

Without directly blaming the ruling party for the incident, the BNP chief said Awami League has the past and present records of making bomb and armed attack on meetings and conferences.

Such incidents were taking place in many parts of the country in recent days. "The rulers

Defence continues
questioning
Shazneen's father

Latifur Rahman, father of murdered teenager Shazneen, was cross examined by Mohammad Ali, lawyer of supervisor Badal, one of the accused in the Shazneen murder case, for the seventh day in the Metropolitan Sessions Judge Court yesterday. The cross-examination continued for more than one and a half hours starting from 11:50 am.

All the six accused were produced before the court yesterday. Shazneen Tasnim Rahman, 15, youngest daughter of the Transcom Group chairman, was raped and murdered at their Gulshan residence on April 23 last year. There was one case for murder and another for rape under the Women and Children Repression Prevention Act 1995. Both cases were lodged
