Unite to resist them: PM

Vested quarters out to destabilise society'

JESSORE, Mar 10: Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina today categorically said that persons involved in the Jessore bomb blasts would be dealt with iron hand, reports BSS.

The government will find out the culprits and take stern actions against them," she said while addressing a public meet-ing at Jessore Eidgah Maidan this afternoon.

Hasina, who flew in here this morning from the capital to see the people who have been injured in the blasts and express sympathy to the bereaved families, said "I will always remain with you in your sorrows and griefs."

The prime minister asked the people to unitedly launch social movement against the terrorists and anti-social elements so that they were eliminated from society. "You can face any challenge if you are united," she said, adding "never lose your courage and confidence. Face everything boldly."

Referring to the activities of the opposition parties, she advised them not to play with the lives of innocent people. She said a vested quarter, which does not believe in democracy and does not have faith in the democratic norms and parliamentary system of administration, is out to destroy the peace and stability in the country.

Referring to recent killings in the country including those of JSD leader Kazi Aref Ahmed and the editor of Runner newspaper, she said the vested quarter wanted to terrorise the society and destabilise it for political reasons.

The PM said heinous crimes like killings of artistes at the cultural function might cause fear in the minds of the people. However, she assured the people that her government would always stand by them and take all steps to nab the culprits. She announced that each

10 hurt as drug traders attack police box in city

By Staff Correspondent At least 10 people were injured when a group of illegal drug traders attacked a police box near a slum in city's Kamalapur area yesterday. Of the injured, two identified

as Sohel and Jalal, were admitted to Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) with cracker injuries, hospital sources said. According to local people and hospital sources, the inci-

dent took place after a team of the Department of Narcotics Control (NDC) arrested two drug traders - Babul, 30, and Swapon 22, - and recovered 2027 bottles of phensidyl from their possession from Titipara slum at about 5:30 pm. Some other drug traders es-

caped the scene to avoid arrest. NDC officials kept the two inside a nearby police box. Suddenly the other drug traders attacked the police box and made an attempt to snatch the arrested two.



Sheikh Hasina said, police often feel frustrated as the criminals get bail. She cited one incident in which an accused in a murder case obtained a court order so that police do not "harass" him for three weeks.

She also reminded journalists to maintain caution so that terrorists are not forewarned against combing operations in the southwestern districts. Earlier Home Secretary

Shafiur Rahman gave an account of law and order and said that police was probing Sunday's incident. They would make a breakthrough soon, he said giving details. He also defended the SP of Jessore who came under heavy fire from Udichi leaders for "not being polite" to them and not providing enough security for the con-

The SP is an honest and efficient person, the Home Secretary said.

able to start a new life". Asma said, her mother sitting beside. Equally delighted to see her daughter recover. Asma's mother Zahura Begum said, "I am so happy to see my daughter move, eat and talk the way she did earlier. It's a miracle. thank God for this."

But Zahura regretted that the doctors who crippled her daughter and

killed her unborn child went unpunished. "The 'mistake' they claim to have committed is just an excuse".

Asma Begum, a garment worker from Magura, had gone to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital for an ovarian tumour operation. But her hopes for a normal life had disappeared seven months ago when gynecologists erroneously removed her only functioning kidney.

That was on August 11, 1998. During the operation, Asma's five- month-old pregnancy was also terminated. When all these came to light

and the doctors tried a cover-up, a media focus on this hapless girl led to an official enquiry and her quick transfer to the BMUH on September 7, 1998 for better treatment. But sadly, due to alleged in-

ept handling of her case and

poor attention, her condition

deteriorated, putting her life at

great risk. Asma waited for

more than five months for a

kidney transplantation.

During the painful five months, she survived on haemodialysis - a costly device used to excrete

toxic fluid from body. In a five-hour major operation at the BMUH on February 2. Asma's mother gave one of her kidneys so that her daughter could live.

The transplanted kidney has since been functioning well. But she will have to make regular

visits to hospital for check-up.
"To keep the implanted tis-sue (kidney) match in her body for the rest of her life, she has to continue taking drugs," Prof. Harun-ur-Rashid head of the kidney department at the BMUH said.

Since the kidney transplantation, Asma has gained weight and her appetite has returned to normalcy. The persisting abdominal pain has gone.

The government had formed two separate probe bodies to investigate the matter. But neither of the reports have been made public. Following a flurry of press

reports, a human rights group, Odhikar had filed a writ petition on behalf of Asma seeking prosecution of the doctors responsible and compensation. The accused in the writ are the health secretary, principal

of Dhaka Medical Collage, Director of Dhaka Medical College Hospi-tal, Prof Mahmuda Khatun, Dr Golam Mostafa and Dr Fatema who performed the operation.

Int'l confce ends in city

'Adopt biosafety regulations without delay'

Speakers at an international conference in the city yesterday stressed the urgency of adopting biosafety regulations for the country.

Such regulations are needed especially when Bangladesh is graduating to a new level of scientific advancement both in terms of laboratory research and commercial use of genetically engineered seeds. In short, biosafety means policies and procedures that guarantee environmentally safe applications of biotechnology, panellists

The views were aired on the concluding day of a three-day International Plant Tissue Culture Conference on 'Status of Biosafety Regulations in Bangladesh' at Botany Department auditorium of Dhaka University.

Bangladesh Association for Plant Tissue Culture (BAPTC) organised the conference that drew a good number of experts. scientists and students from home and abroad

With The Daily Star Editor Mahfuz Anam in the chair, the session on biosafety was addressed by Prof Syed Hadiuzzaman of Botany Department, DU. Dr Yusuf Zafar of National Institute for Biotechnology and Genetic Engineering (NIBGE). Pakistan, and Dr AM Abed Chowdhury of CSIRO Plant Industry, Australia. Prof Zeba Islam Seraj of Biochemistry Department, DU, acted as cochairman of the session. Giving a brief preview of a

draft biosafety guideline which is now under government scrutiny, Prof Hadiuzzaman said Bangladesh should have protective measures so that people are not exposed to future biohazards. Generally, biohazard means potential danger posed by a living or biologically derived material.

Mahfuz Anam said the draft regulation should be brought into public domain and it should be adopted as a government policy.

The Daily Star editor spoke

of low-profile status of science and technology ministry. Responding to an idea that to a biotechnology cell should be set up in the ministry. Anam said, "Let's empower the ministry first, then comes the issue of setting up a cell."

Indicating to the tremendous transformation in the area of biotechnology, Anam said, "There is no choice -- we have to know, we have to learn." He expressed concern at the mindset of the politicians and policy planners who have failed to prioritise real issues and rather indulged in rhetoric.

Dr Abed Chowdhury emphasised maintaining bioethics and taking the religious implications into account while Dr Zafar stressed serious study by Third World nations on plant genetic rights, intellectual property rights and other is-

year. But, sources said, the pre-

sent distribution network will allow the demand to rise to only 2500 MW -- 2550 MW. The load shedding situation in last summer was worse. With occasional countrywide black out, load shedding level had reached 600 MW -- 650 MW at


