On the issue of granting bails to 1200 people, the court noted that "it is almost physically impossible" to deal with so many cases in such a short period.

"We were quite surprised to see from the impugned statement coming as it does from no less a person than the Prime Minister of the country."

The Supreme Court said: "If the Judges had that rate of disposal, there would not have been any backlog in Courts. We have for our satisfaction checked up and found that on the aforesaid two dates (26 and 27 August, 1998) the total number of motions in which Rule and bail were granted by the Bench concerned was (83+72) 155 and the number of persons released on ad-interim bail was (219+148) 367."

The court said. "The PM has mentioned newspaper reports as her source for the figure of 1200 cases although the name of or names of the newspapers have not been mentioned. However, it is quite likely that she might have seen such figures in the newspapers. But after all she is the Prime Minister of the country and was making comment on the performance of a superior court before the press."

"If upon obtaining correct figures she had felt even then that bail was being granted in too many cases and expressed her opinion accordingly we would have nothing to say because as the Chief Executive she was entitled to have her own views in the matter having regard to the law and order situation which is the concern of the Executive. The Court is accustomed to such executive chagrin in matters like this,"

"Again there is nothing wrong on the part of the Executive to bring any matter to the notice of the CJ regarding a court's performance and grievance, if any, entertained by it. But nothing can be more embarrassing if the Chief Executive chooses to speak to the press involving the Chief Justice because the Chief Justice. unlike her, cannot readily take to the Press for giving a reply and further the people may get a wrong impression which is not at all desirable.

"It is entirely for the Chief Justice to decide about the constitution or re-constitution of a Bench of the High Court Division. Nobody has a say in the matter nor it is done at anybody's behest. It is exclusively a preserve of the Chief Justice and dependent on him ... How embarrassing the observation of the PM in the present case was can be imagined if she had only taken care to know the correct facts.

"The constitution of the Bench concerned (allocation of business) was changed by the Chief Justice long before the issue of granting bail came to be discussed in the Press and the decision was taken even before 26 August, 1998. The records will bear this out. The remarks of the PM, however, give the impression that the constitution of the Bench was changed at the instance of the Government which is not pressed."

ment which is not correct".

"The Chief Justice has felt extremely uneasy over the remarks made in respect of him, for, he cannot give a public reply nor he is obliged to justify or explain to the Executive any matter falling within the domain of his administration.

"In deciding, however, whether the facts before us call for drawing up of a proceeding for contempt we have decided to opt for discretion keeping in view the celebrated dictum of Lord Atkin (Andre Paul Vs. Attorney General, AIR 1936 PC 141) which has always been a guiding principle with this court. Said Lord Atkin: ' The path of criticism is a public way: the wrongheaded are permitted to err therein: provided that members of the public abstain from imputing improper motives to those taking part in the administration of justice. and are genuinely exercising a right of criticism and not acting in malice or attempting to impair the administration of justice, they are immune. Justice is not a cloistered virtue: she must be allowed to suffer the scruti-

The five judges concluded: "The Court expected more circumspection, understanding, discretion and judgement on the part of the Prime Minister because of the high office she holds in making off-hand remarks in respect of constitutional functionaries which have been alleged to be contumacious. For the reasons, however, the application is disposed of with the observations as above."

Fire Service & Civil Defence Week opens

One fire station in each thana HQs to be set up

Home, Post and Telecommunications Minister Mohammad Nasim yesterday said the government has decided to set up at least one fire station in each thana headquarters of the country on priority basis, reports BSS.

Mohammad Nasim urged the officers and staff of the department to work sincerely and honestly to protect the lives and property.

He also stressed the need for enhancing training facilities for the department's officials and the common people to save their lives and property from fire incidents.

The minister took salute and reviewed march past of three contingents of the department. He also witnessed mock-fire fighting in the training complex ground.

Later, he inaugurated a blood donation programme by the officers and employees of the department at the same venue.

Need for speedy admin reform for overall development stressed

Speakers at an international seminar yesterday stressed the need for accelerating the process of administrative reform for overall development of the country. They regretted that succes-

sive governments had formed a number of committees and commissions for bringing about changes in the administration established during the colonial era and these bodies produced dozens of recommendations and suggestions, but none was implemented.

The speakers also suggested

decentralisation of power, separation of judiciary, removal of all black laws, upgradation of local bodies, better remuneration for government officials, and transparency and accountability of the bureaucrats for a better, pro-people administration.

presented the keynote papers.
Narrating his experience

during four years of office in Dhaka, Pierre Landle- Mills observed that the performance of bureaucrats in Bangladesh was horrific.

He criticised the politicians for not taking decisive action

for not taking decisive action and keeping commitments. "They do not implement what they say. There is a big gap between the words and actions of the politicians."

Referring to the World Bank recommendations regarding

Referring to the World Bank recommendations regarding privatisation, the former World Bank country chief said that though the ministers, parliamentarians and all other pecple concerned had agreed on the recommendations, none was implemented because some bureaucrats thought implementing those might be risky for the government.

The quality of the district officials has declined and reforms should be made in the local administration, Landle-Mills suggested.

Badrudozza Chowdhury underscored the need for separating the judiciary, scrapping all black laws and strengthening the power of parliamentary committees on different ministries.

Hasanul Haq Inu said the trend of politics in Bangladesh is still dominated by the concept of overthrowing governments. "At this stage, any reform in administration is very difficult." He also blamed the 'dual administration' for slow implementation of government policies.

Onanyul Islam Siddigui sug-

Quamrul Islam Siddiqui suggested decentralisation of the administration and autonomy to all directorates, departments and divisions, making those accountable only to the minister, not the ministry. He also stressed the need for upgrading the status of the officials working at different departments and directorates.

"I command more than 10, 000 workers and implement various projects spending around Tk 1500 crore annually, but my status is below to that of a joint secretary," the chief engineer of LGED lamented.

Quamrul said the adminis-

tration at lower level is sandwiched between directorate and ministry. "The Health directorate has no control over doctors as they are being controlled by the (health) ministry." Rabeya Bhuiyan emphasised the need for a consensus among

the need for a consensus among the political parties for bringing about the change in the administration.

She also demanded that all bills presented in the parlia-

ment, and reports and recommendations made by committees and commissions be made public.
