


"They appeared to be unaware of the dangers of carbon monoxide." Secrieru said. The couple was discovered by the player's father on Monday morning.

# Last gasp chance for hosts

With their back against the wall. Bangladesh will be hoping for a reversal of fortunes when they take on Kenya in a crucial encounter of the Meril International one-day tournament at the Bangabandhu National Stadium today. The day-night match will

kick-off at 2 pm with both the state-run media --- Bangladesh Television and Bangladesh Betar -- providing ball-by-ball commentary from the big bowl. For Bangladesh, who lost both their first-leg matches of the tri-nation tourney, it will be a do-or-die battle. The docile hosts conceded a 126-run defeat to fancied Zimbabwe in their second match after an eightwicket whipping by Kenya in their inaugural match last Sat-

urday. The repeat clash with Kenya, which will be the last string of hope for Bangladesh for a berth in the final, will also be important for the ICC Trophy champions to prove a point against the African lions.

## Bangladesh, fresh after a Usha earn full points

Title aspirants Usha Krira Chakra returned to winning ways with an empathic 7-2 victory over Dhaka Mariner Young's Club in the Green Delta Metropolis Premier Division hockey league at the Maulana Bhasani National Stadium yesterday, reports UNB.

This is the fifth win for the old town team in their six league outings after conceding a 0-1 defeat in their previous match against Abahani, the Cotton Group Shahid Smriti hockey champions.

With the day's victory, Usha joined holders Mohammedan Sporting Club and Abahani atop the league table with 15 points. But Mohammedans and Abahani have played one match less.



Specially, their two experienced batsmen. Tikolo and Odumbe, are playing excellently," said Aminul while talking to the press corps after the workout.

"But we will make a turnaround tomorrow. We have no other option but to win the match", said the stereotyped Bangladesh captain.




