Cattle markets dull in N-region

LALMONIRHAT, Mar 31: The cattle markets of the northern region of the country are yet to be crowded even after a few days ahead of the holy Eid-ul-Azha, reports UNB.

According to a survey, the prices of sacrificial animals are far below than the previous year due to want of buyers in many famous hats of this region. Usually, hats including Borobari, Mohishkhocha, Patgram, Borokhata, Chaparhat and Chamtarhat of Lalmonirhat, Jatrapur, Kathalbari and Ulipur of Kurigram district, Lalbargerhat, Bodorganj of Rangpur, Sultangani of Rajshahi and Parbatipur of Dinajpur become crowded with the advent of the Eid-ul-Azhar. The buyers particularly from the capital buy cows, goats from 600 hats of the region to sell those to other main cities.

Bamboo production declines

KISHOREGANJ, Mar 31: Bamboo production in all the 13 thanas of the district has declined sharply due to

indiscriminate uprooting of clusters, reports UNB. Construction of thatched houses and production in bamboo based cottage industries are being seriously hampered for lack of bamboo. The district was once famous for bambooproduction. According to the sources, thousands of clusters on a vast tract of land are gradually decaying for lack of proper maintenance and systematic plantation, resulting in price hike of bamboo in the local markets. Many cluster owners are ignorant about scientific plantation of bamboo and reluctant to make necessary measures to save the clusters.

Law and order worsens in districts

Law and order situation has deteriorated alarmingly in various districts of the country in recent time.

Our Faridpur Correspondent says: The law and order situation of the district has deteriorated alarmingly.

Snatching, hijacking, dacoity, stabbing and killing are day to day affairs here. A reign of terror has been prevailing here. Members of the public have lost faith in police force as they have failed to curb the criminal activities and failure to arrest the notorious miscreants, extortionists and killers.

Some killers and terrorists are allegedly moving freely, but police do not arrest them in time. As a result resentment and discontent against the police administration has accumulated in the minds of the people.

Several murders were committed in the town during the last couples of weeks, but police were not active to nab the accused, especially the main one. involved in the murder cases for reasons best known to them, a

However, the situation went out of control when Moksed was muedered on March 20. This incident sparked violence in Tepakhola area within the lown.

Moksed Ali, a cycle parts trader was hacked to death by a gang of terrorists numbering four to five near Gopalpur police outpost here in the evening of March 20. This is due to refusal of the victim to pay toll amounting to Taka 50 thousand to them. A several thousand grief stricken people assembled at the residence of the victim at Vati Luxmipure here in the next morning and brought out a procession carrying the dead body of Moksed Ali.

On receipt of information, SP. Additional SP and other police personnel rushed to the spot near Banalta cinema hall in Tepakhola to disperse the processionists. But a mob suddenly attacked them with deadly weapons critically injuring SP. Md Abdul Mabud and five other police personnel. This was the outburst of resentment and discontentment accumulated for long in the minds of the people in general and the oppressed in particular. The mob was reportedly looking for the Officer-in-Charge (OC). The processionists demanded his immediate transfer.

Police, however, brought the situation under control very patiently.

Following this tragic inci dent, two Habilders and 16 constables of Gopalpur police outpost were closed to police line. A total of 17 persons were arrested so far, two in connec-

tion with Moksed murder, whgile the rest 15 for assaulting SP and damaging two police ve-A tense situation has been

prevailing in the town.

Our Staff Correspondent from Khulna reports: Law and order situation in different areas and places under Rupsha thana in Khulna district has deteriorated.

Five persons including a union parishad chairman and a member were killed during the last six months. Gunfights between two factions of armed cadres of outlawed organisations take place often scaring the people.

Hundreds of villagers are reported to have left their homes out of panic as police have miserably failed to contain terrorism. Innocent people are allegedly being arrested as suspects of different criminal cases.

Golam Faruque Howlader, Chairman of Naihaty Union Parishad on August 30 last year in front of his office. But police are yet to arrest any of the FIR named accused. There has been no headway in the investigation. On the night of February 26, member of Naihaty UP Ajmal Hossain and his relative Omar Ali were gunned down by extremists.

On January 22 this year a young man named Hakim Khan, and on February 25 another young boy named Liton were killed by unidentified assailants at Nehalpur village.

It may be mentioned here that armed clashes between the

two rival groups of outlawed organisations almost every day in different places under Rupsha thana have become a common phenomenon. All the clashes take place for capturing leadership and over quarrel for sharing extorted money.

Our Chuadanga Correspondent reports: The Law and order situation here has raised great concern among the citizens.

During the month of January, a total of 24 persons were killed by miscreants in different places of three thanas here. The thanas are Chuadanga sadar. Alamdanga and Damurhuda.

The persons who were killed during the last month were Abu Musa, 45, Shamsul ,35, both of village Chotto Solua and Shahidul, 32, of village Kotali in Chuadanga sadar thana.

The persons were killed on January 9. On January 14 another two persons were killed at village Bhogail Bogadi in Alamdanga thana. They were UP member Aktar Hossain .30. and Sirajuddin .35. On January 15. Ismail Hossain ,50, of village Hafania in Alamdanga thana was killed. He was a local leader of Awami League. On January 16 Rahim Box ,55.and his son Shafiul ,25,of village Raisha in Alamdanga thana were killed.

On the same day Ekram .38. and his wife Morjina ,30, of village Jugirhuda in Chuadanga sadar thana were killed. On January 18, Amirul ,40, and Sairul ,33, of village Darbeshpur were killed at village village Kulpala in Alamdanga thana. On January 19, Sadek Ali ,50, of village Akondobaria in Chuadanga sadar thana was killed. On the sameday Ashadul, 38, of village Baragangni in Alamdanga thana was beaten to death. On January 21. Buro .28, of village in Kaithpara of Alamdanga thana was killed. On January 23. Alauddin .30, of village Shandigari in Alamdanga thana was killed. On January 26 Sathi and Bablu .38, of village Charulia in

Damurhuda thana was killed. On January 28, Tarik ,26, of village Balesherpur and another 48-year-old unidentified man, both under Alamdanga thana were killed at village Nagdah. On January 29 Ektar .25, Malek, 27, both of village Buro Para and Haidar Ali .50. of village Shahpur all under Chuadanga sadar thana were killed. On the same day Bozlu .30, of village Sreerampur in Alamdanga thana was also killed. The last killing of the month was at village Damblepur in Alamdanga thana. An unidentified dead body was found in this village on January 20. The identified

man was aged about 48 years. Most of the persons were killed by the extremist group of outlawed Communist Party. The ill-fated persons were shot dead, slaughtered to death and strangled to death. Of the total killings some persons were killed for non-payment of tolls, some persons were killed by the rival group of outlawed Communist Party and some persons were killed due to intra-party conflicts among the outlawed underground armed parties.

There are a number of outlawed underground communist parties in this region such as Purbo Bangla Communist Party, Sarbohara Party and Communist Party of Bangladesh (ML).

Besides these, there are also a number of armed 'Bahinis' in this region like Chuadanga, Meherpur, Jhenidah and Kushtia belt. They kill people only for money.

The people of Chuadanga district are now passing a very crucial time. The political leaders, social workers and leaders and people of all sections of people are frustrated and panicsticken now. Any time any person may be killed anywhere in the district without any reason. Police administration has totally failed to control the killings. Extremists, terrorists and

told collectors are very active. now throughout the district. They are also well armed and they have got huge illegal arms with them. Eunus Ali. Prestdent, Chuadanga district Awami League termed the present law and order situation in the dfistrict as very grave. He

said he has never seen in his long political life such condition. Shamsuzzaman (Dudu) from constituency Chuadanga-2 said that time is now very crucial for taking proper action against the extremists. He said when the people of the capital city comes to know that "I am MP from Chuadanga constituency, then they become astonished". Solaiman Hoque Selun, General Secretary of Chuadanga district Awami League told the Awami League activists are victims and target of killings. Shahidul Islam, a local leader said that the district administration was now captive in the hands of the party in power. Touhid Hossain, a local JSD Leader told the panic sticken people of the district have lost confidence in the local administration. Saiful Islam Pinu, another leader said,

all are panic sticken now. The local Deputy Commissioner (DC) has demanded deployment of army in the district and the sp told that he had been trying hard to develop the situa-

A Jamalpur Correspondent says: The security of life and property are at risk in all the seven police stations, out of 68 unions including two pourasabhas here. Crimes and terrorist activities have become rampant.

The peace loving people are scared of terrorism.

Free movement of terrorists with fire arms, mass murder and salughter of men, stabbing, rape, hijacking, toll collection, kidnapping and violence have come a common feature here. Besides, illegal sale of wine, phensidyl and its use, cultivation of hemp, gambling and other immoral activities are also on rise now-a- days. Clashes between rival parties and gunmen have vitiated the normal atmosphere.

It is gathered, political rivalry, labour unrest and terrorism in the district town and its adjacent areas are leading to clashes endangering security of life. A total of 18 people were killed and 38 injured in clashes during the last five months.

A bloody clash took place between two groups of transport workers at Tarakandi in Sarisabari thana on July 31. Discontent due to enjoyment of privileges by one group at the expense of the other one triggered the clash which left transport workers Saiful Islam ,30, and Ali Mahmud ,28,dead and eight others injured. Two brothers Zahurul and Jewel were wounded in another clash between two groups of transport workers at the bus terminal in the town. In August the President of Jatiyotabadi Chhatra Dal of AM College, Jamalpur lost his left kidney following an attack by the opposition group.

He is now undergoing treatment at the Disabled Hospital in Dhaka. Police arrested four people in this connection. Zohurul Islam, a Jubo League leader was critically injured by a gang of terrorists. He is undergoing treatment at PG Hospital in Dhaka. Nurul Momin Kawser, Secratary of JCD, A.M. College unit was injured in an attack in October. Intra-party conflict was said to be the cause of the incident. He is now in Mymensingh Medical College Hospital under treatment.

The gruesome murder of Jubo Dal leader shocked the town dwellers, Anwarul Haque, General Secratary of Jubo Dal district unit was critically injured in an attack by some unidentified assailants at Medical Road in the town in October. He died on way to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital (MMCH).

Internal feud was the cause of the murder. A group of agitated people ransacked the residence of BNP district convener and former Deputy Minister Serajul Haque. Terrorism in the town has made the life of town dwellers insecure. On October I night Shahajahan, a pedestrian came under attack of some terrorists in the town. The terrorists injured him critically when he failed to met the demand for money.

On October 10 Khokan, son of journalist Abdul Jalil and his four associates received critical injuries in an attack by some terrorists. The injured

have become handicapped. On September 9 a gang of extortionists raided the shop of Abdur Rahman in Hat Chandra area in the town for his refusal to pay toll. They ransacked the shop and looted cash and valuables. The local Shop Owners' Association brought out a procession in the town demanding arrest of attackers.

Clash between Awami League and Krishak League is rampant in Tara Kandi area. A total of 30 persons were critically injured in a cash at Jamuna Fertiliser Factory. Tension is prevailing in the factory area, according to inhabitants of Sarisabari thana. One Rangbala ,25, of

Narundi was kidnapped by some unknown miscreants. Later on they killed Rangbala. Mizanur Rahman .7, a boy was murdered by some terrorists of Sarisabari thana and hanged the boy with a tree. A total of five activists of

Awami league were injured in a clash at Pathalia of the town and they were rushed to Mymensingh Medical college hospital in a critical endition. Toll collection is rampant

everywhere, especially in Jamuna Fertiliser Factory. A gang of terrorists take toll from fertiliser dealers for every 50 kg bags of urea, it is learnt. A Netrakona Correspondent

reports: Law and order situation at Atpora thana here has deteriorated further as the area has been turned into a lawless area. A group allegedly belonging to the ruling party move with deadly weapons and do terrorist works before the nose of members of the law enforcing On March 13, a group of the

ruling party terrorists allegedly stormed the Union Parisad Bhaban where Osman Gani Talukder, Chairman of Teligate UP who is also a local BNP leader and the union BNP Secretary Idrish Ali Kari were in a meeting. The alleged terrorists set on fire the chairman's motorbike and threatened them to abandone BNP. They confined them in the office room. After receiving a secret information a police squad rused to the spot and rescued them.

None was arrested so far.

UNB from Barisal reports: People are passing their days with anxieties and insecurity following recent deterioration of the law and order situation. Two people were killed and

over 50 others injured in violent activities in different places in the last ten days. Terrorists have unleashed a reign of terror, as the law en-


General Bhuiyan in his speech hoped that ex-soldiers would play a vital role in developing the society and devote themselves in various social activities as well as to assist the distressed humanity.
