

Piturca to continue

BUCHAREST, Apr 6: Romania's national coach Victor Piturca survived a vote of confidence today after unhappy fans had demanded his resignation, reports Reuters.

Piturca called for the vote of confidence himself after angry fans had demanded his resignation following his team's poor performance in a 0-0 draw with Slovakia on March 27.

Mircea Sandu, the president of the Romanian Football Association (FRF) said: "Piturca is the best coach we have," and although he gave no specific details, he added Piturca had been given the support by the board he needed to remain in his job.

The FRF board will dismiss Piturca once the last chance to qualify for the European finals is lost," Sandu said.

Romania drew 0-0 with Slovakia and beat Azerbaijan 1-0 in two European Group Seven qualifiers at the end of last month but angry fans demanded Piturca's resignation after the Slovakia game.

Mijatovic fined

MADRID, Apr 6: Yugoslav striker Predrag Mijatovic has been fined five million pesetas (32,370 dollars) by Real Madrid following his decision not to play for the club on Sunday while NATO strikes continued against his country, reports Reuters.

The club also warned Mijatovic on Monday that he could be discarded from the Real first team squad if he refused to play in future matches.

Mijatovic, who missed Real's 3-2 win at home to Alaves, was one of six Yugoslav internationals in Spain's First Division to opt out of this weekend's matches.

Mijatovic vocal in his criticism of the strikes on Yugoslavia said he was not in the right state of mind to play soccer.

"Footballers are not going to play while our families cannot come out of their cellars," He said at a protest last week.

Salgado set to leave Celta

MADRID, Apr 6 (Reuters/Internet): Celta Vigo's Spanish international defender Michel Salgado confirmed on Tuesday that he is determined to leave his club.

"If I don't leave Celta at the end of the season it will be an opportunity lost," Salgado was quoted as saying in the Spanish magazine *Interviú*.

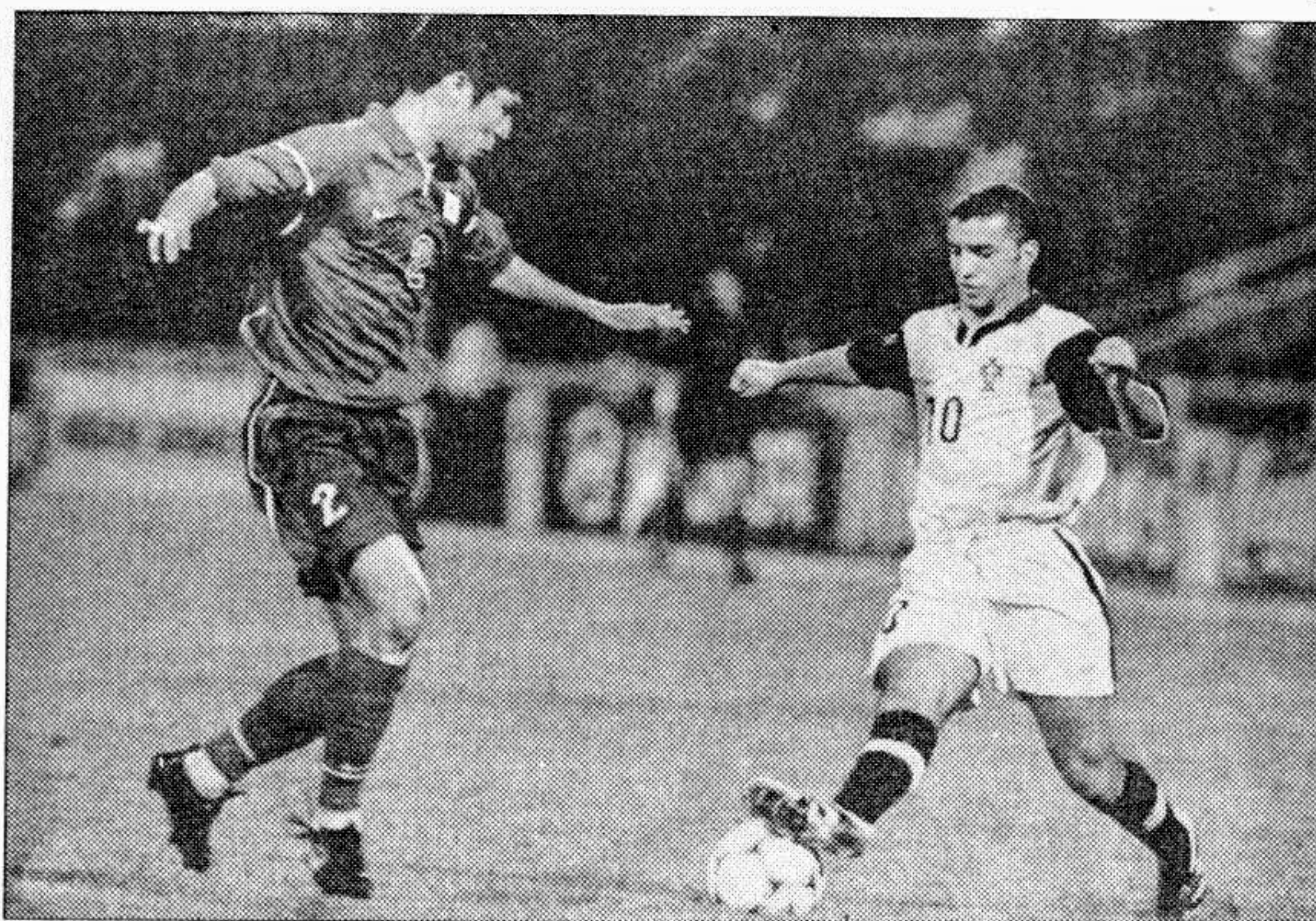
Salgado made his international debut last September and has quickly matured into one of Europe's top-rated players.

He said in February that both Juventus and Real Madrid had made him offers.

Barcelona were also linked in the Spanish media with the player earlier this season.

The speedy right-sided defender has a contract that lasts until June 2000 but his buy-out clause is 2,000 million pesetas (\$12.9 million), a price well within the means of the Italian and Spanish soccer giants supposedly chasing him.

Salgado has become widely respected for his play in the last 12 months but first gained international notoriety in February 1998 for the brutal tackle which broke Juninho's ankle and ruled Atletico Madrid's Brazilian international midfielder out of World Cup contention.

Brazil, England shocked



LAGOS, Apr 6: Two first half goals from Barcelona reserve striker Gabriel Garcia helped Spain beat Brazil 2-0 in the World Youth Championship on Monday, reports Reuters.

The United States beat England 1-0 while Mali sprung a major shock as they scored in the last minute to overcome 1997 runners-up Uruguay 2-1 on an excellent day for African teams.

Zambia and Cameroon both came from behind to beat Honduras and Japan respectively.

Garcia was one of five players to score twice on a day which went well for the Nigerian organisers. Pitches and stadia were in good condition and decent-sized crowds watched most games.

Garcia put Spain in command with well-taken goals in the 16th and 33rd minute. Brazil's best player was goalkeeper Fabio who pulled off a string of excellent saves to keep

the score respectable.

Spanish goalkeeper Daniel Aranzubia barely had a save to make, Brazil coach Jao Carlos Da Costa, whose squad was picked by predecessor Toninho Barroso before his sudden resignation, admitted: "We lacked the qualities to win, we obviously will have to work harder."

Mali's hero was Mahamadou Dissa who stunned the Uruguayans when he cut in from the left, wrong-footed his marker with a dummy and then cheekily flicked the ball over goalkeeper Hector Carini in the 89th minute.

The team from the poverty-stricken Saharan nation had taken a 51st minute lead through Abdoulaye Camara in the Group D game in Enugu before Ernesto Chevanton equalised in the 68th.

"We made mistakes and we will correct them for the next game," said Uruguay coach Victor Pua.

The unlikely pairing of Zambia and Honduras provided the match of the tournament so far, with two spectacular long-

range efforts from Bernard Makuti either side of halftime propelling Zambia to a 4-3 to win in a Group F game in Calabar.

Spain later went top of Group F after outclassing Brazil.

Cameroon also came from behind to beat Japan 2-1 in a Group E match in Kano. Gaspar Komol scoring both their goals after Naohiro Takajara had put the Asians ahead.

goal was enough to give the United States a 1-0 win over England in a Group E match in Kano while Portugal's Pedro Simao scored twice as the 1991 champions beat South Korea in a Group D match in Enugu.

The tournament continues Wednesday with six games.

The matches are Nigeria v Germany and Costa Rica v Paraguay (Group A in Lagos), Ghana v Argentina and Croatia v Kazakhstan Group B in Kaduna), and Australia v Mexico and Ireland v Saudi Arabia (Group C in Lbadan).

Atletico after Del Piero?

TURIN, Italy, Apr 6 (Reuters/Internet): Atletico Madrid have offered Italy's Alessandro Del Piero 70 billion lire (\$41 million) to join them from Juventus, Tuttosport newspaper reported on Tuesday.

The Turin-based paper said Miguel Angel Gil, son of Atletico President Jesus Gil, had agreed a five-year contract with Del Piero's agents which would guarantee the player an annual salary of 14 billion lire (\$8.2 million) from 2000-2005.

Del Piero's contract with Juventus expires in June 2000.

The Italian striker had a superb season with Juventus last year but had a poor World Cup and has missed most of this season with a knee injury.

He said recently that he was prepared to pledge himself to Juventus for life.

Court ruling revokes BFU licence

SOFIA, Apr 6 (Reuters/Internet): Bulgaria's Supreme Administrative Court has upheld a government decision to revoke the licence of the beleaguered Bulgarian Football Union (BFU), officials said on Tuesday.

The BFU has allegedly failed to act over a doping case and allowed unlicensed clubs to play in the league.

BFU president Ivan Slavkov warned recently that if the licence was revoked, soccer's world governing body FIFA and European governing body UEFA could exclude Bulgaria from international competition.

The state committee of youth, physical education and sports, which is the equivalent of a sports ministry, accused the BFU management of failing to take action in a doping case ahead of last year's World Cup finals.

BFU officials responded by saying Neftochimik midfielder Ilija Grujev, who tested positive for a banned anabolic steroid last April, had been severely punished by being dropped from the country's World Cup squad.

Replying to another sports committee accusation that the BFU had unlicensed clubs in the first division, officials said the Neftochimik club was not licensed yet although it had submitted all required documents to the sports committee.

"We will inform FIFA of the case and will appeal against the decision of the court," BFU executive committee member Mikhail Kasabov told reporters.

Tennis Australia's complaint

SYDNEY, Apr 6: Australia will appeal to the International Tennis Federation (ITF) over the location of their Davis Cup World Group quarterfinal against the United States, Tennis Australia president Geoff Pollard said today, reports Reuters.

Under normal Davis Cup home and away regulations Australia would host the tie because of the clash between the two nations was in the United States in 1997.

But a decision was made two years ago to guarantee the US a home tie in Boston to commemorate the competition's centenary at the site where it began.

Capriati up to challenge



AMELIA ISLAND, Florida, Apr 6 (AP): Jennifer Capriati used to be a star. These days, she's happy just to play on the same court with one.

Capriati beat Austria's Sylvia Plischke 7-5, 6-3, on Monday in the first round of the Bausch and Lomb Championships, setting up a possible meeting with one of the game's biggest stars, ninth-seeded Anna Kournikova of Russia.

"It looks to me like she's been playing well," Capriati said of Kournikova, who lost to Swiss star Martina Hingis in the final of the Family Circle Cup on Sunday. "I would look forward to playing her. I feel like it would be an opportunity for me."

Tenth-seeded Chanda Rubin of the United States, No 14 Magui Serna of Spain, No 14 Virginia Ruano-Pastual of Spain, No 15 Nathalie Dechy of France and No 16 Iva Majoli of Croatia all won their first-round matches Monday. They were the only seeds in action on a light opening day.

Kournikova, Americans Venus Williams, Lindsay Davenport, Monica Seles and defending champion Mary Pierce of France were among those who had the day off.

Kournikova will play Germany's Andrea Glass on Tuesday. The winner will meet Capriati, who is in the fourth year of a slow comeback brought about because of personal problems that knocked her career off track in 1993.

Playing a limited schedule this year, Capriati improved to 4-4. She entered the tournament ranked 81st in the world and will take another month off after this week to work with her new coach, Harold Solomon.

"I'm beginning to believe I can win again," Capriati said. "My tennis is good enough that I can still beat some of these players. I think Harold Solomon, in a short time, has helped me to believe that, too."

Capriati persevered through a sloppy first set that took exactly an hour to complete.

Plischke, ranked 39th in the world, strained her thigh muscle early in the second set and

Capriati hurried to a 5-0 lead. Capriati lost the next three games, but broke Plischke's serve for the eighth time in the match to close it out.

"All this was part of it being the first match on clay," this year, Capriati said. "It's about making adjustments, getting used to the bad bounces and stuff. Every game was close."

Another player slowly moving up the rankings is Tara Snyder of the United States. She took centre court early in the day and beat Larissa Schaerer of Paraguay 6-2, 6-4.

Snyder, ranked 36th, will play seventh-seeded Conchita Martinez of Spain on Tuesday. She'll take the confidence she gained in a second-round victory here last year against last year's seventh seed, Irina Spirlea of Romania, on the way to a quarterfinal appearance.

Majoli, the 1997 French Open champion, looked sharp in a 7-5, 6-3 victory over Sandra Nakul of Yugoslavia. Majoli, 21, suffered a stress fracture in her foot last November and feels her comeback is nearly complete.

Davis Cup through US eyes



LONDON, Apr 6 (AP): Even with his big victory, Jim Courier knew it was not enough.

The Davis Cup does not stir the passions of American sports fans.

"I think there's too much competition in America, sports-wise, for that realistically to change in the near future," he said.

Courier's two singles victories carried the United States to a 3-2 decision over Britain in the first round. His match Sunday was the highlight, a 6-4, 6-7 (3-7), 6-3, 1-6, 8-6 decision over Greg Rusedski in Birmingham.

The American victory came on the same day the baseball season opened. The NHL was moving toward the playoffs and the NBA was in the thick of its

schedule. The Masters was waiting in the wings.

But even in ideal conditions, the Davis Cup is a tough sell in the United States. And not only with fans. Two of its best players, Pete Sampras and Andre Agassi, took a pass on the US-Britain series.

Tim Henman, who with Rusedski formed a two-man British team, can't understand why Sampras no longer plays Davis Cup.

"I think it's great to be a part of it, but at the end of the day it's his decision," Henman said. "If he doesn't want to be a part of it, anything, it's his loss."

Henman, who practises with Sampras and has teamed with him in doubles, says the Davis Cup matched playing Wimbledon, an event Sampras has won five times.

Courier's singles partner, Todd Martin, in the wake of what The Daily Telegraph called the "most memorable Davis Cup tie in Britain since the war," said he sympathised with calls to modify the Davis Cup. One suggestion is to play every two years instead of annually.

"There are still flaws," Martin said. "After this there's three months ... before the next tie, and that's a flaw."

"But I don't see how this can't excite people about tennis, especially about the Davis Cup."

US captain Tom Gullikson, who must constantly lobby the top players for the Davis Cup, said Courier and Martin would play in the quarterfinals in July in Boston against Australia — even if Sampras and Andre Agassi come aboard.
