Govt should resign right now: Mannan Bhuiyan

BNP Secretary General Abdul Mannan Bhuiyan yesterday said "failures incompetence and callousness" of the government is responsible for the prevailing electricity and water crisis in the country and demanded immediate resolving of the current crisis.

In a statement, he said the Awami League government is not capable to ensure even basic necessities as water and electricity to the people although it had came to power with a pledge to establish right to food of every citizen.

Similarly, there is also no water in river Padma that is causing a severe draught in the northern region of the country.

"The government after signing the Ganges Water Sharing Treaty with India had blown its own trumpet, but it is now clear to the people that the treaty was a hoax. The water flow in Ganges has further reduced after signing the treaty. The water flow in Padma is decreasing day by day although the ministers are frequently visiting Delhi." Bhuiyan said.

The BNP leader said that the Energy Minister had sat idle

instead of facing the power crisis. The situation has deteriorated further after the Prime Minister herself took over the charge of the ministry.

JS body discusses performances of missions abroad







They said that the situation of healthcare for the poor in the developing countries was going from bad to worse. "We must bring a change to the situation It is time we address the problem with a greater responsibility," one speaker said.

The speakers also said that to ensure universal access to health, safe water, sanitation and other basic social needs we must develop the needs of the poorest in the society.

Dr John Martin from Geneva (WHO) underscored the need for linking between health and income and said that investment in procuring better healthcare services leads to better economic growth. Citing an example of what East Asian countries have done to improve the scenario, he said that investing in better education, basic healthcare, sanitation and other sectors that lags behind may lead to the difference of growth in the healthcare sector.

Dr Binayek, a senior research fellow of BIDS said that investment in health sector can bring three dimensions health as an insurance for income, health as human capital

as productivity increases and health as social capital as new forms of social cooperation is achieved.

The speakers mentioned that not only service quality is low but the service providers also are not sensitive enough to the poor patients' concerns. The poor are ignored because they are not vocal about their rights. They never protest about lack of facilities, doctors and other basic needs at the healthcare cen-

They said that for this reason the poor and the vulnerable group of the society are deprived from basic healthcare facilities in many ways. The speakers also said that budgetary allocation in the health sector has to be increased substantially.

The workshop is attended by different organisations including government, NGOs, donor agencies, academic institutions and various hospitals and clin-

Technical papers were also presented at the day-long workshop. Dr John Martin of WHO gave an overview of the health and antipoverty prior to the start of the first session.

A 12-member committee with Vice-Chancellor Prof A K Azad Chowdhury as its head has been formed to implement the project.

"We proposed to build the mausoleum and the museum in a Bungalow-pattern with steel which will look as if made of bamboo," Prof Azad told the

He said the mausoleum and the museum would be made based on Bengali culture, com-memorating National Poet Kazi Nazrul Islam, Shilpacharya Zainul Abedin, Patua Kamrul Hasan and prominent teachers of the university.

The project will be taken to the prime minister for approval.
