Colombo district judge A.M.A. Salam ordered the newly-elected executive committee headed by Thilanga Sumathipala not to function until April 19, after a challenge by a defeated candidate is

The chief executive officer of the Board, Dhammika Ranatunga, who is not an elected member, said the committee that functioned until the March elections will now be in charge.

Sumathipala's election is challenged by defeated candifate Cliffod Ratwatte, who is a brother of Prime Minister Si rima Bandaranaike and an un cle of President Chandrika Kur naratunga.






