

Martin, Costa overcome obstacles

LIBSON, Apr 11: Second-seed Todd Martin of the United States and Spain's fourth seed Albert Costa mastered windy conditions yesterday to each the Estoril Open final, reports Reuters. Martin broke the serve of former world number one Marcelo Rios of Chile in the second game of the match, winning a major psychological advantage as he took the first set easily on the way to a 6-3, 7-6 victory.

The second set was tougher. There were two breaks of serve as they reached 6-6 and a tie-break, which the 28-year-old American won 7-3.

Rios, world-ranked 13th after spending much of this year sidelined by a back injury, repeatedly flung his racket onto the court in bursts of frustration.

"Especially at the beginning of the match I felt more confident against the wind," Martin, ranked eighth, said. "I think Marcelo was struggling to find his range. I broke him at 1-0. That was key in the game. That is the toughest situation to be in as far as timing is concerned," he said.

But Martin said that despite the outcome of the match, he still believed Rios was the more talented player.

The glum Chilean showed flashes of brilliance, especially when he returned serves with precision baseline accuracy. But he was booed as he left the court and refused to answer one reporter's question because he said the journalist was not a nice person.

Costa, who beat Jerome Golmard of France 6-4, 6-4, had a shaky start to his semifinal but broke the Frenchman's serve to lead 3-2 in the first set.

He also broke Golmard's service in the first game of the second set.

Costa said he would rather play Martin in the final as he thought Rios was a better clay court player.

The Spaniard felt he had responded well to the Atlantic winds that swept across the sun-drenched court.

"Today I am more mature and a better player than the last time I was a finalist here," he said. That was in 1995.

Lagos turns violent

LAGOS, Apr 11: Nigerian fans and riot police clashed overnight in the commercial capital of this soccer crazy country as protests erupted following Nigeria's 2-1 loss to Paraguay in the under-20 World Youth Soccer Championship, reports AP.

News reports said police, many on horseback and using whips or bamboo-type canes, waded in against fans who hurled bottles and cans at the Nigerian team bus as it left the National Stadium late Saturday after the match.

Violent clashes were reported in several areas around the sprawling port city throughout the night, the daily Thisday newspaper said. There were no reports of arrests or details on the number injured. One casualty of the first-round match was Nigerian coach Tunde Disu who was sacked within an hour of the game's final whistle and had to receive a police escort to leave the stadium.

Germany eliminated

Argentina, champions in 1979, 1995 and 1997, limped to a 0-0 draw with Croatia and finished Group B with four points, earning them one of four places in the second round awarded to third-place teams.

Croatia, who fought bitterly but boringly to hold the Argentines to the draw, finished second in the group with a 1-2-0 record and five points, two behind Ghana, who beat Kazakhstan 3-0 earlier in the day.

Paraguay finished top the group with six points, and will meet a third-placed team on Wednesday at the knockout stage.

Nigeria finished second

minute and Ruben Maldonado doubled 11 minutes later.

Nigeria rallied on Ganiyu Shittu's second goal of the tournament in the 40th minute but both sides missed gift-wrapped opportunities when Nigerian captain Rabiu Afolabi and Paraguayan striker Miguel Dominguez failed on penalty kicks.

In Kaduna, Baffour Gyam scored twice in the second half to help Ghana easily beat winless Kazakhstan.

Gyam scored in the 52nd and Adu Tutu added another two minutes later to get Ghana rolling. Kazakhstan went home with three losses in as many games and having been outscored 9-1.

At Ibadan, Luis Gonzalez and Saleh al Sakri scored nearly identical goals six minutes apart in the first half to give Mexico and Saudi Arabia their draw.

Like Paraguay, Ghana and Mexico will face third-placed teams in the second round. Those pairings and the rest of the field for the round of 16 will be determined Sunday when the first round draws to a

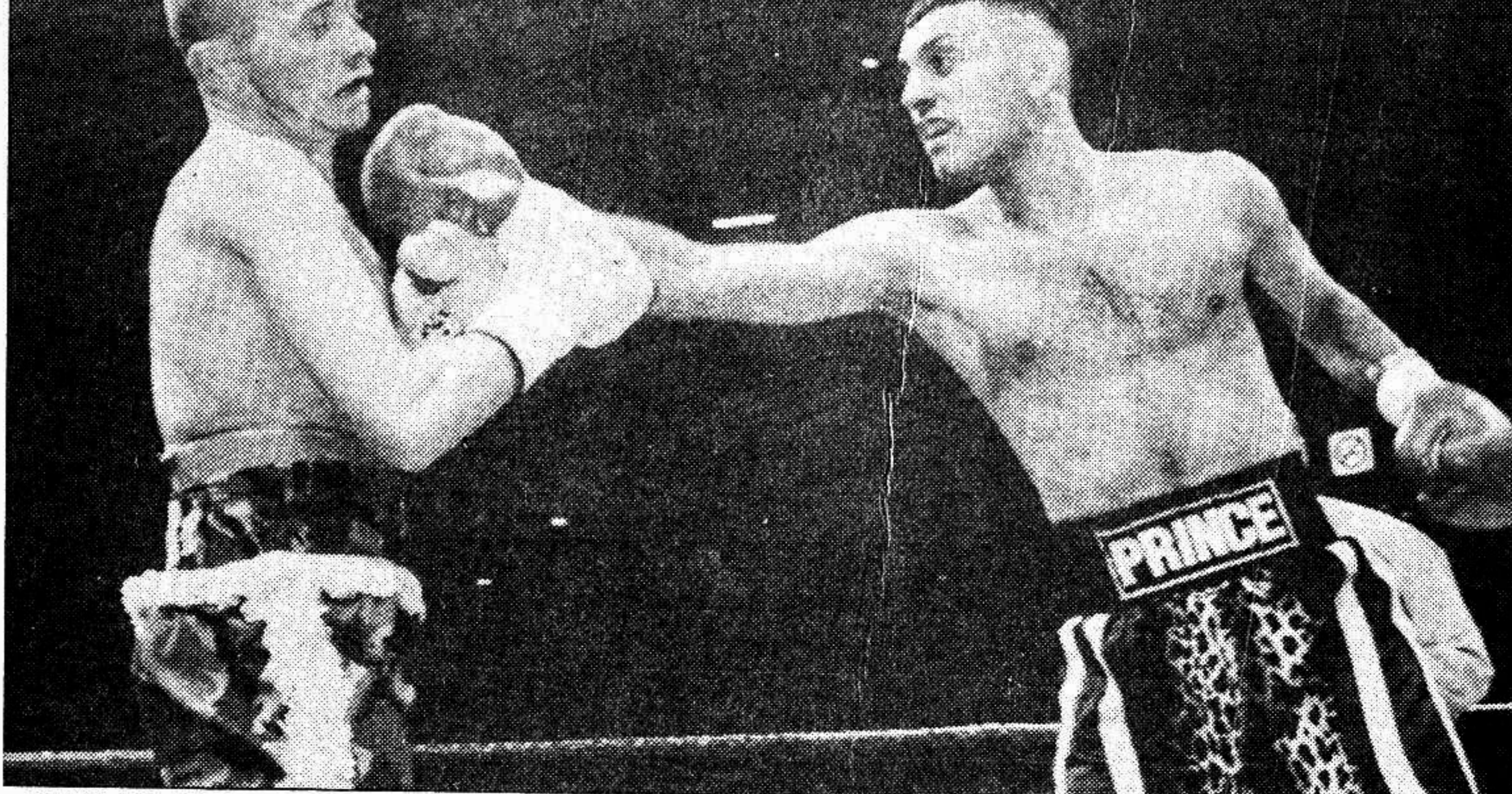

Yokohama flattens Osaka

TOKYO, Apr 11(Reuters/Internet): Japanese World Cup striker Shoji Jo scored a trick as Yokohama F Marinos demolished Cerezo Osaka 6-0 in J. League action at the 2002 World Cup venue of Yokohama International Stadium on Saturday.

Jo, who attracted the interest of Spanish clubs Real Mallorca and Tenerife last year, took his tally for the season to six in six games and moved two goals clear at the top of the scoring chart.

The victory pushed Marinos into fourth place in the 16-team table on 12 points, three off the pace being set by 1997 champions Jubilo Iwata.

Jubilo won 1-0 away to Hristo Stoichkov's Kashima Reysol, with a second-half header from Hideto Suzuki and now have 15 points.

Kashima Antlers, champions in 1996 and last season, slipped from first to second place on 14 points when they could collect only two points from a 'golden-goal' victory in extra time away to Kyoto Purple Sanga.

It was Kyoto's sixth consecutive defeat and they are the only team in the league without a point.

"Shimizu S-Pulse, managed by former Tottenham captain Steve Perryman, are third on goal difference behind Kashima after winning 3-1 away to Avispa Fukuoka.

Elsewhere, Urawa Reds' former Japanese international striker Masahiro Fukuda came back from a three-game injury layoff to score twice in a 3-0 victory against Bellmare Hiratsuka at Tokyo's National Stadium.

Two of the Reds' goals were created by Yugoslav World Cup midfielder Zeljko Petrovic, who was returning from suspension after being sent off against Sanfrecce Hiroshima two weeks ago for two yellow cards.

Hamed too hot to handle

MANCHESTER, Apr 11: Prince Naseem Hamed knocked out Paul Ingle in the 11th round Saturday night to retain his WBO featherweight title for the 12th time, reports AP.

Hamed totally dominated the first eight rounds, flooring Ingle in the first with a left hook and again in the sixth with a left to the body.

But Hamed, who had hardly been hit until then, suddenly began to look tired and vulnerable as Ingle took charge in the ninth and 10th and bloodied the champion's nose.

Then, 45 seconds into the 11th round, Hamed landed a short left to the top of Ingle's head that sent the English challenger toppling backwards to end the scheduled 12-round fight at the MEN Arena.

Hamed, who extended his

record to 32-0, with 29 knockouts, said he may have broken his right hand in the fight and would go to a hospital for X-rays.

Ingle, the former European and Commonwealth champion, lost for the first time after 21 wins.

Hamed weighed 126 pounds, one-half pound more than Ingle.

Later, on the same bill, 40-year-old Thomas "Hit Man" Hearn won the lightly regarded IBF cruiserweight title with a unanimous decision over fellow American Nate Miller.

Hearn, a former five-time world champion fighting in Britain for the first time as a pro, rarely got to display his punching power as a listless Miller turned the fight into a drab, lacklustre affair.

The judges scored the fight 118-112, 117-112 and 118-111 for Hearn.

Hearn raised his record to 59 victories, four defeats and one draw. Miller, a former WBA champion, is 30-7.

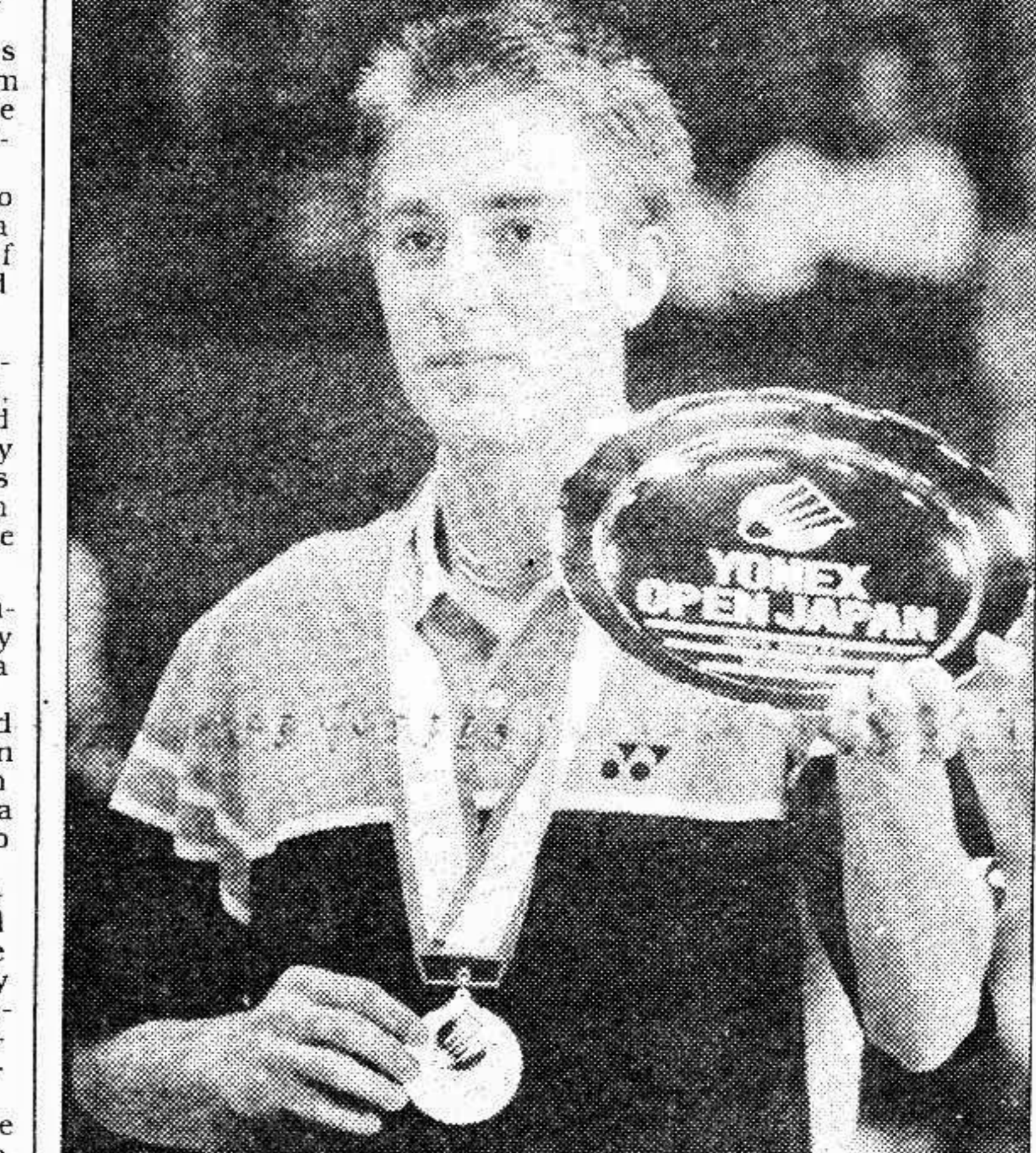
British judges Roy Francis and John Coyle had Hamed ahead 98-91 after 10 rounds, with American official Michael Penick had it 98-90 in favour of the champion.

Possible future opponents for Hamed include Mexico's Juan Manuel Marquez, WBC super-bantamweight titlist Erik Morales and IBF champion Manuel Medina.

The fight was preceded by gamesmanship from both camps.

Hamed made one of his trademark theatrical entrances to the ring, riding into the arena in the back of an open-top 1960 Cadillac before somersaulting over the top rope.

Ingle's manager, Frank Maloney, had promised to take his fighter back to the dressing room if Hamed's entrance took longer than five minutes. That's just what he did, timing Hamed's entrance with a stop watch before leading Ingle out of the ring.
