#### Four-hour work stoppage in newspapers on Apr 25

Central Coordination Committee (CCC) of four unions and federations of newspaper industry yesterday announced a four-hour work stoppage from 11 am to 3 pm on April 25 in all newspapers and agencies to press demand for the realisation of a two-day weekly holiday, stopping conspiracies to cancel the existing holidays and implementation of the fifth wage board award, reports BSS.

The committee will stage demonstration and hold rally at the National Press Club at 11 am on the day and will hold unit meetings in all newspapers and agencies on April 15.

The decisions were taken at a meeting of the Central Coordination Committee of Bangladesh Federal Union of Journalists (BFUJ), Bangladesh Sangbadpatra Press Sramik Federation (BSPSF), Bangladesh Sangbadpatra Karmachari Federation (BSKF) and Dhaka Union of Journalists (DUJ) with convenor of the committee Fazle Imam in the chair.

KHAGRACHHARI, Apr 12 Tribal people of the Chiftagong Hill Tracts region today started celebrating their three-day traditional Boishabi festival with the pledge to maintain communal harmony as well as unity in diversity by establishing the rights of all, reports APB.

Mainly three tribes living in the region hold the carnival called Boishabi that encompasses Boiju of Tripura, Sangrai of Marma and Biju of Chakma in the last two days of Bangla month of Chaitra and the first day of Baishakh.

Different tribal organisations have arranged publication, alpana (drawing), chika (graffiti) and sports in the villages sprawled over the hills.

In observance of the Biju festival, over 1,000 tribal men and women brought out a colourful rally led by PCJSS leader Jyotirindra Bodhipriya Larma alias Shantu Larma parading the main thoroughfares of the valley this morn-

Shantu Larma, in his address of welcome, urged all to be united in the struggle for realising the rights of the aboriginal people of the Hill Tracts through the implementation of the peace accord.

#### Tornado in Ramgoti Death toll rises to 12

RAMGOTI, Lakkhipur, Apr 12: Seven more bodies were recovered yesterday from the river Meghna raising the total death toll to 12 following the tornado that swept over five unions of Ramgoti thana on Friday last, reports BSS.

Local administration sources said all the five unions were badly affected and some one hundred fishing boats reportedly missing following the tornado.

Meanwhile, Fisheries and Livestock Minister A S M Abdur Rob yesterday visited the tornado affected areas and distributed relief materials including nine metric tonnes of rice and Tk 50 thousand in cash among the affected people. He visited Karaitala Bazar.

Taltoli, Saheber Hat, Fazu Miar Hat, Hazir Hat and other affected areas.

Later the minister at a meeting with the district and thana officials directed the local administration to be on alert to face any disaster in the upcoming kalbaishakhi season. He also directed them to submit a complete report on loss and casualties due to tornado within the next seven days.

# Scarcity of drinking water acute in many regions

Scarcity of drinking water is causing untold suffering to the people in many parts of the country, reports UNB.

In many places water-borne diseases are spreading due to the paucity of pure water for drink and household use.

UNB Naogaon corespondent says the crisis of drinking water has cropped up with the advent of the dry season, rendering about 70 per cent tube-wells inoperative.

Local people and officials say the ground water level has fallen sharply and the level in the river Atrai has also lowered alarmingly. The river Chhoto Jamuna, flowing through the town, has completely dried up.

Most of the tube-wells in the households of the town cannot fetch water due to fall in the sub-soil water. The people have to depend on the water supply from the municipality for all of their household works.

Increasing load shedding is also threatening the water supply posing further crisis for the town dwellers.

Most of the Tara pumps installed by the Public Health Engineering Department to ensure supply of the drinking water in the district went out of order due to lack of proper maintenance and care.

Besides, a programme to sink and re-sink 32 shallow and 1.171 hand driven tubewells in the district, taken up by PHED, has been stopped due to unknown reasons.

In many areas of Rajshahi, people have been facing acute crisis of pure water as the tubewells in these areas can not fetch sufficient water for them. The worst hit areas of the

district include Mohanpur, Puthia, Bagmara. Tanore, Godagari. Durgapur and many other parts of Barind project

The level of ground water has come down alarmingly and a normal tube-well with a 100 to 320 feet long tube cannot even reach the ground water

Experts at the local Met office say the situation arose due to sharp fall in the level of river water.

In Rajshahi region, almost half of the tube-wells out of the total 4,000 went out of order during the last year's flood. Many of these tube-wells have not yet been repaired, further aggravating the situation.

Some surface water bodies in the affected areas like ponds and lakes have also dried up due to the prevailing hot spell.

Another report from Barisal says the crisis of pure water in the divisional town is acute and many people have to stand in a long queue even after darkness to collect water from the street hydrants.

Official sources say the municipality cannot meet the demand of water in the town which has been worsened by frequent load shedding.

The sources said total demand of water in the town is 80 lakh gallons. Sixteen pumps of the municipality are there to fetch this water. If all the pumps remain operative round the clock, these can supply only 40 lakh gallons. But due to load shedding and other technical problems, these machines can produce only 20 to 25 lakh gallons. So there remains a crisis of 55 to 60 lakh gallons every

Because of the inadequate supply, people have to depend on the tube-wells located in different neighbourhoods.

The situation in Shahrasti Kachua and Hajiganj thanas in Chandpur have also worsened with the fall in ground water

High officials of Public Health Engineering Department visited these thanas to assess the situation recently. They said about 40 per cent of the total 126 deep tube wells in the district has been affected due to the fall in water level

They further said the crises of pure water and water for irrigation have now turned acute in these affected thanas.

The level of water of the deep tube wells came down by more than 3.5 feet in some areas, said the sources.

# Arsenic above safety level in 81.5pc of villages

Arsenic was found in 52 districts out of a total of 64 above the WHO recommended level of 0.01 milligram per litre (mg/l). In 42 districts the level is above 0.05 mg/l, which indicated that the contamination has assumed almost an alarming proportion, reports APB.

This was revealed in a study presented at a day-long seminar on "ground water arsenic contamination and sufferings of people of Bangladesh and the Indian state of West Bengal" at Bangladesh Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (BCSIR) yesterday. Dhaka Community Hospital

and School of Environmental Studies of Jadavpur University, Calcutta jointly conducted the four-year study in which about 12084 hand tube-well water samples were analysed "These 42 districts com-

prises a landmass of 92,106 sq km with a population of 79.9 million. The entire population in these districts may not be drinking contaminated water but they are of course at risk,' the study pointed out.

The analytical results of the survey showed that 67 per cent of the water samples in 143 thanas of 52 districts is not suitable for drinking as per the WHO recommended standard of 0.01 mg/1 and 56.8 per cent of

samples contain arsenic above the maximum permissible limit of 0.05 mg/1

About 3332 pieces of hair. 3321 nail. 373 skin-scale and 1043 urine samples from people living in arsenic affected villages have so far been studied. On an average 92 per cent samples contains arsenic above the normal level.

"Further if it is true that arsenic toxicity appears after several years of exposure, then the picture may actually be far more grim than at present and children are at greater risk," the study observed.

From the affected villages. so far 3646 children below 11 years of age were examined and out of them 6.36 per cent has been found to have arsenical skin lesions.

## Military govt to rule Niger

NIAMEY (Niger), Apr 12: Opening the way for at least during the transition. nine months of military rule, the head of the presidential guard unit that witnesses say assassinated Niger's former president has been named the new leader of this West African nation, reports AP.

Commandant Daouda Malam Wanke will head the military government that is to lead Niger to civilian elections at the end of a nine-month transition period, military spokesman Capt Hamidou Djibrila said in a Sunday night broadcast on state radio and television.

"The armed forces of Niger understand the gravity of the situation and decided to put to rest the institutional void created by the sudden death of Gen. Bare," Djibrila said.

The announcement came two days after Bare was gunned down by members of his Presidential Guard on the tarmac of Niamey's airport. Despite widespread knowl-

edge of the assassination of President Ibrahim Bare Mainassara, state radio continued to insist that he died in an "unfortunate accident." Djibrila said that Wanke, a man largely unknown outside

There are few indications, though, whether the military government would eventually allow democratic elections. Bare also seized power promising polls; he was confirmed as president a few months later in elections widely seen as fraudu-

Although the exact motives for Bare's death remain unclear he was not a popular figure. The army coup he led three years ago ousted Niger's first democratically elected government. Bare's mismanagement,

nepotism and failure to pay salaries to soldiers and bureaucrats had alienated him from Niger's civilians and its military.

Later, he faced down repeated military mutinies and protests by students and civil servants, and earned the wrath of the opposition by imprisoning some of its leaders.

Other patients in Ward-30 later told this correspondent that seeing blood-soaked Zahed groaning in pain, they raised money to buy a saline and an 'injection' for him as prescribed by a male nurse. None of the on-duty doctors could com-

Next day, when Munmun went to her mother-in-law at Bashabo, the alarm was raised. The family immediately launched a search at police stations and hospitals throughout the city. At around 7 pm, nearly twenty hours after the incident, Zahed was found at the DMCH Ward-30 on a saline.

His dried blood-soaked clothes were glued to his skin and his relatives had to cut those to remove from his body. During the vital twenty hours after the accident, none of the hospital staff cared to see

him. Other patients at the Ward said Zahed's persistent groans made them call the nurse and enquire about him. They quoted the hospital authorities as saying, "Nothing can be done until his relatives arrive.

The accident broke all his ribs, shattered the collar bone and caused deep injuries in the

Two days later, DMCH authorities referred a comatose Zahed to the Neurology Department of the BSMMU. Doctors now say he has a fifty-fifty

chance to survive. Marketing-in-Charge of a company, Syed Hasan Zahed was loved by his neighbours, friends and particularly children in his neighbourhood.

Twelve of them including Mintoo went to High Court to challenge the Bangladesh Bank order, but the court dismissed their petitions on July 1 1997. Eight of them excluding Mintoo appealed to the Supreme Court

which also dismissed the cases. In the latest case, petitioner pointed to these developments and accused Mintoo and others of violating the 1997 High court order which was later upheld by the Supreme Court.

"And the managing director and the chairman was a party to it without which Mintoo could not have violated and disobeyed the judgement. Therefore they are also liable for committing contempt of court making them liable for punishment," the petition said.
