

"The business and banking activities became dull after spending a huge amount of money for importing foodgrains following the two months long flood," said a high official of a private bank.

He said people are now very interested in buying different saving certificates issued by the government because of their higher interest than that of the commercial banks.

Most of the saving certificates offer 13 per cent interest while the commercial banks' interest on saving accounts vary from 7 to 8 per cent. "This advantage prompted By Rafiq Hasan

many people to buy saving cer-tificates instead of keeping money in bank vaults " the official said.

The deposit in foreign banks, however, went up because of better customer service and quick execution of business activities, according to sources.

Many people including businessmen shifted their accounts

to foreign banks from the NCBs and local private ones because of the better money transaction system in the foreign banks. The BB's quarterly statement on banks account says that the deposit in 13 foreign

Khaleda slams NAM Summit costs

Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Khaleda Zia yesterday said that Tk 100 crore to be spent for the NAM Summit scheduled for August 2001 in Dhaka would prove to be a huge burden on the people of Bangladesh.

However, she hoped that the summit would be held smoothly and would bring fruitful results for the people of the 113 NAM member countries.

The former prime minister told this when Delhi-based South African High Commissioner Jerry M Matsila, who was also in charge of Bangladesh affairs, paid her a farewell visit at her 29 Minto Road official residence in the evening.

MM Rezaul Karim, member of the BNP chairperson's advisory council, told newsmen that the outgoing South African High Commissioner informed during the meeting that about 20 million US dollars had been spent for the NAM Summit in Durban, South Africa. The expenditure is something a developing country would find difficult to bear, he said.

The envoy said that South African President Nelson Mandela in the last NAM Summit in Durban brought some changes in the NAM's concept and suggested that it put emphasis on development and poverty alle-

The investigations revealed no major deviation. Then the government re-approved the project.

"The project resumed after one and half a year's suspension due to various reasons including updating the voters list and the EC's occupation in conducting the Union Parishad polls between December 1997 and January 1998," said Pasha. 
