Jail Killing Case Charges against 21 accused to be framed on May 2

The Metropolitan sessions judge yesterday rejected the petitions filed by the two accused persons in the Jail Killing Case praying for making a reference to the High Court with recommendation to quash the charges brought against them, reports

Judge Sheikh Rezwan Ali, in his order, also refused to grant bail to the accused petitioners K M Obaidur Rahman and Nurul Islam Manzoor and fixed May 2 for framing the charges against the 21 accused in the case.

The Jail Killing Case came up for trial after 23 years of the brutal incident.

Syed Nazrul Islam, Tajuddin Ahmed, M Mansur Ali and AHM Quamruzzanian - the four national leaders - were killed in the Dhaka Central Jail on November 3, 1975.

Eight out of 21 accused are now in custody and the rest 13 are still absconding.

Shafi murder: 3 DB men on fresh remand

The quantum of aid pledged at Paris has long been considered, wrongly or rightly, as the yardstick of government's credibility and successes, but this

year could be an exception. The two-day meeting between the government and the aid-givers gets underway today at the French capital, home to the European headquarters of the World Bank (WB) which coordinates the annual event.

Finance Minister S A M S Kibria, who is heading the Bangladesh team to the crucial conference, neither confirmed nor denied reports that there would not be any indicative figures coming out of the meeting as usual. The head at Dhaka's World Bank office had hinted earlier that the figures would be a forgotten thing.

"People who know about these things know that aid is pledged and committed by the donors throughout the year. It is a continual process by the financial institutions like the World Bank and ADB," Kibria said in an interview to The

Despite government's repeated assurance of an improvement, the country's power sector continues to head towards a massive disaster as all the proposed private and public sector power projects have been delayed by years, sources said.

The level of load-shedding will decrease within a few months but it will increase to around 250 MW in the next 'lean season' (March-April of 2000) and to around 500 MW in the following year, the sources said. Besides, the power system is

already "running a risk of total breakdown any time" as some old power units producing about 660 MW, which require over-

BCSIR, Dhaka-1205 Grant for those interested to establish bio-gas plant

The Fuel Research & Development Institute of Bangladesh Council for Scientific & Industrial Research (Science Laboratory) has undertaken a development project titled "Bio-gas Pilot Plant Project" with a view to achieving the Bangladesh government objective of fuel crisis amelioration, bio-fertiliser & bio-cycle maintenance, maintaining balance of nature, health & environment development, extension of bio-gas as alternative fuel etc. Total 5000 bio-gas plant will be established all over the country under this project. Preference will be given to 8-10 member family possessing minimum 5-6 cattle or poultry farm (400-450 poultry birds) in establishing the bio-gas plant. This 5-6 cowdung & 400-450 bird droppings based bio-gas plant with a daily capacity of 3 cubic metre gas generation will enable daily two-time cooking & one hajak light burning at night time. It will cost Tk 12-14 thousand to establish such as plant. Under the project, a subsidy of Tk 5000/- will be provided for establishment of each plant. In case of additional amount in plant construction, if necessary, any branch of Sonali, Janata, Agrani & Krishi Bank may be contacted for loan on existing terms.

To provide technical assistance in plant establishment, total 128 Sub-Assistant Biogas Engineers have been given appointment all over the country. One Sub-Assistant Bio-gas Engineer is placed with responsibility of establishing bio-gas plants in 3-4 Thanas under him. Interested entrepreneurs in plant establishment are requested to contact the thana level appointed Sub-Assistant Bio-gas Engineers.
