Briefing newsmen here on the occasion of the National Nutrition Week, Yusuf said malnutrition is the major cause for most of the infant and maternal mortality in the country. The minister said malnutrition leads to low birth weight,

anemia, vitamin A deficiency and iodine deficiency disorders. Yusuf said about 50 per cent of women suffer from prolonged malnutrition, causing pre-natal and even post-natal malnutrition of the infants.

Referring to the formulation of National Food and Nutrition Policy and the National Nutrition Work Plan, the Minister said notable progress had been achieved in the iodine fortification in the salt, distribution of Vitamin-A capsule among the children and encouragement to breast-feeding.

He said the Ministry of Health and Family Planning has been implementing the Bangladesh Integrated Nutrition Programme' (BINP) for the improvement of nutrition level for the pregnant women and the infants.

At present, this programme is being carried out in 40 thanas across the country, he added.
