Fire brigade from Kushtia could not reach the place even after receiving the news. Origin of the fire could not be known. No loss of life, however, was reported. Absence of fire station in Khoksa and Kumarkhali thana have been causing huge loss during the last 20 years due to fire.

5 students hurt by terrorists

BARISAL, Apr 26: At least five students were injured in a terrorist attack at Syed Hatem Ali Collage hostel here on Wednesday night, reports UNB.

The students laid siege to the residence of the principal and hurled brickbats on the residence protesting the incident. Hearing the news, police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control. Police and hostel sources said unidentified attackers stormed into Nabogram road hostel of the college in the midnight and beat up the students. The students, however, managed to catch one of them and locked him in a room before going to the Principal's residence. The attackers took away the youth by breaking open the door and they also ransacked the room.

40 hurt in road accident

NETRAKONA, Apr 26: At least 40 people were reportedly injured in a head-on collision between a passenger bus and a truck near Rajendrapur on the Netrakona-Mymensingh highway on Wednesday, reports APB.

Fifteen of the injured were admitted to Netrakona Modern Hospital and others shifted to Mymensingh Medical College Hospital. Of them, condition of Sahera Khatun, 40, and Dipu Rani Sarker, 20, was stated to be critical. Police said the accident occurred when a Dhaka-bound bus collided with a sand-laden truck in the morning. The bus turned turtle and skidded into a roadside ditch.

Tubewells being installed

NATORE, Apr 26: Public Health and Engineering Department (PHED) took up a scheme to install and re-sink 7,143 tubewells under its post flood rehabilitation programme

in 13 northern districts during the current year, reports UNB. But the work is yet to start even after six months, said the local sources. The tubewells included 1,303 shallow, 2,774 Tara pumps and re-installation of 3,066 Tara pumps. Of the items, installation of 10 shallow tubewells, 285 Tara pumps and resinking of 261 Tara pumps were scheduled in six thanas of Natore and 23 shallow tubewells, 297 Tara-pumps and reinstallation of 141 Tara-pumps in Rajshahi. The schemes in other districts are: Chapainawabganj — 32 shallow, 125 Tara and re-sink of 257 Tara pumps, Naogaon — 32 shallow, 424 Tara and re-sink 667 Tara-pumps, Pabna - 103 shallow. 272 Tara and re-sink 530 Tara-pumps, Sirajganj — 128 shallow, 260 Tara and re-sink 280 Tara-pumps.

Bridge needed

MADARIPUR, Apr 26: The absence of a bridge over the river Arial Khan in between Hazarapur and Charmuguria in Sadar thana is causing immense sufferings to the people here, reports

The river has divided the Hazarapur-Charmuguria road into two parts and the people who use the road for communication between Hazarapur and Charmuguria are in great difficulty due to absence of a bridge here. Unauthorised books being taught in Madaripur schools

MADARIPUR, Apr 26: Unauthorised books are being taught as text books in different storyteller. The price of these books ranges from Tk 100 to Tk 130. schools of the district ignoring the relevant rules, reports UNB.

Sources in different schools and other institutions said that a section of teachers in collaborations with the publishers are suggesting these books as text though National Curriculum and Text Book Board did not approved these. The students are being com-

pelled to buy the books in higher prices in the face of pressure created by the section of teachers.

Besides, there is brisk business of guidebooks in different parts of the district.

According to the rules, the board approved some books of private publishers to be taught in the classes from VI to IX across the country. These books include Bangla, English, Grammar, Composition and Rapid Reading.

These books are standard, low-priced and written following the syllabus of secondary and higher secondary standard. But some publishers pub-lished sub-standard books with higher price rate but full of errors and try to push sale these by giving many extra facilities

to the teachers and book traders. The business is particularly. booming in Dhaka, Faridpur, Noakhali and Barisal regions. The books include Bangla and

Sources in the book market of the district said one of these books is A Book of Bright En-

glish, Grammar, Translation and Composition. The 16-forma book contains 256 pages and the price fixed at Tk 55. On the other hand, prices

of the approved books were fixed by the board from Tk 9 to the highest Tk 75. Many guardians complained that they had been facing trouble in meeting the expenses of buying books for their children. Besides, the prices of these
