

Salmond put a brave face on a bad night for the SNP, which hoped for a late boost through support from "James Bond" actor Sean Connery and "Braveheart" nationalism that surged after Mel Gibson's 1995 film about mediaeval independence hero Williams Wallace.

Salmond said the SNP had gained support across Scotland at the expense of Labour compared to the 1997 general election that swept Blair and his centrist "new Labour" to power.

"I'm not the slightest bit downhearted ... The only party that gained ground in this election was the SNP," said Salmond, who has vowed to continue pressing for independence from the platform of the new parliament.

The vote was part of "Super Thursday" elections in Britain that also gave Walse a less powerful national assembly, its first ever, and tested Blair's mid-term strength in local elections throughout Britain.

Scotland's parliament will have power over areas like education, health and law and order and the right to raise taxes. But London's parliament will keep control of foreign affairs. defence, the economy, energy

Observers expected Labour to ask the centrist Liberal Democrats to form a coalition in the new Scottish body.

DMCH. Our correspondents who visited the hospital at 11:30pm saw patients still arriving at

the emergency. A doctor at Narsingdi Hospital said at 10:15pm that 55 patients had been told to go to Dhaka after being given primary treatment.

"Dead bodies continue to arrive at the hospital morgue while patients keep flocking to the emergency department," the doctor said.

According to reports reaching from Narsingdi, the victims bought the liquor from different medicine shops at Genji Patti, Brahmandi and Tarkari Patti in the town. Most of them were identified as fish sellers. fishermen, butchers and vegetables vendors.

Sadar thana said last night that police had already raided different medicine shops and arrested at least three salesmen. The owners of such shops went into hiding, police said. Police said they had recovered a few bottles of spirit from

The Narsingdi deputy commissioner and district police chief could not be reached by phone. Their aides said they visited the patients at Sadar Hospital

these shops.

The police superintendent is heading an inquiry, official sources said.

This is the worse such incident since the Gaibandha tragedy more than a year ago. As many as 70 died after drinking adulterated liquor in the northern district town on April 14 last year.

Every year, many people die after drinking liquor procured from unlicensed sources in different parts of the country. But sale and consumption of the spirit have gone unabated.

# Sonia attacks BJP

From Page 1 ability to govern, the Congress chief termed 13 months of Vajpayee government's tenure as endless turbulence, temper tantrums, internal squabbles, unprincipled compromises and roll backs."

Sonia Gandhi made it clear that the focus of Congress' attack in electioneering would be. apart from the BJP, the Samajwadi Party which has a strong base in the politically key state of Uttar Pradesh on the basis of supporters among lower caste and minority Muslims.

She charged the Samajwadi Party with having a "nefarious nexus" with the BJP, a "nexus which has led the country to the present situation," an obvious reference to the refusal of Mulayam Singh Yadav's party to extend support to Congress for heading an alternative after the fall of Vajpayee government last month.

The attack on Samajwadi Party marked a complete turnaround for the Congress which had forged an alliance with that outfit in the previous general elections in 1998 and failed to win a single parliamentary seat in Uttar Pradesh.

Sonia Gandhi also chose the occasion to hit back for the first time at the campaign by BJP and its allies against her "foreign origin."

The BJP and its allies repeatedly said in recent weeks that a person of "foreign origin" should not occupy high offices in India and suggestions have been made from within the ruling alliance if the Constitution could be amended to bar such a person to become the country's President, Vice-President and Prime Minister.

Sonia Gandhi yesterday said such a campaign (without directly referring to it) was a "lowlevel" attempt which only "betrays the nervousness" of the ruling alliance. Sonia's senior party col-

league Sharad Pawar said the "people are fed up with coalition politics and want stability" but made it clear that Congress was yet to take a final decision on firming up alliances with regional parties in some states in the coming poll. The Congress appears to be

in the horns of a dilemma over alliances. Congress sources said the dominant thinking in the party was that it should not strengthen the coalition idea. The feedback given by party leaderships in states to

Congress central leadership is

that alliances be avoided as far

as possible. Even if alliances

are struck, it should be an Con-

gress' terms rather than those of small regional parties as witnessed in the past, the sources said.

Yet scepticism remains in Congress if the party can form a government without alliance with Laloo Prasad Yadav's Rashtriya Janata Dal which rules Bihar state and Jay-alalitha's party AIADMK which is the main opposition party in Tamil Nadu state.

The Congress is very weak in Bihar which sends second highest number of members to Lok Sabha (58), lower house of Parliament, and in Tamil Nadu which has 24 parliamentary
