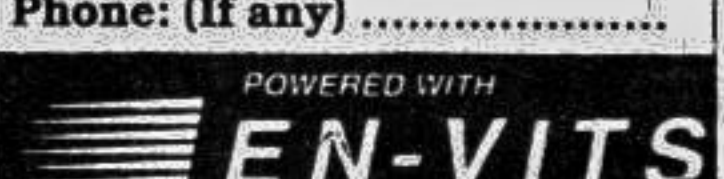

Patty makes early exit

MADRID, May 20: Swiss second seed Patty Schnyder made an early exit from the \$180,000 Madrid Open on Wednesday, losing to Argentine qualifier Paola Suarez 6-2, 6-0 in the second round, reports Reuters.

Mendis at a loss

LONDON, May 20: Sri Lanka's beleaguered World Cup cricketers were told on Thursday that they were facing disgrace after failing to play like defending world champions, reports AFP.

Angry Sri Lankan manager Duleep Mendis told AFP: "Nothing is going right for us... I am not sure we are doing enough to get it right."

"We are not playing like the world champions we are supposed to be. If we don't stop the rot now, we will return home in disgrace."

Sri Lanka crashed to an 89-run defeat against South Africa on Wednesday after being bowled out for 110, the lowest score recorded in the tournament to date.

They have now lost 16 of their last 20 one-dayers and will have to win all three of their final Cup games against Zimbabwe, India and Kenya to have any chance of reaching the next round.

Mendis added: "Batting was our strength, but that appeared to be a long time ago. We are just not batting like an international team should."

Noted Sri Lankan commentator Ranjit Fernando, meanwhile, whom Mendis succeeded as manager, said the selectors were to blame.

"Mahela Jayawardena is our most accomplished young batsman, yet he was ignored for the first match against England," Fernando said.

"In the past year, Sri Lankan batsmen have scored only two one-day centuries, and both came from Jayawardena."

He also said the decision to pinch-hitter against South Africa, instead of the experienced Roshan Mahanama, had been flawed.

"Kaluwitharana loves to play his shots and it's okay to send him up when chasing big scores," he said.

"But we only had to make 200. Mahanama opened against England, there was no point in changing that."

Skipper Arjuna Ranatunga admitted earlier that the team's old guard were struggling and he bemoaned the lack of new talent.

"It has been disappointing over the past five or six months because we are relying too much on some of the older players," Ranatunga said.

He may have been talking about himself or his vice-captain Aravinda de Silva. De Silva made a century in the last World Cup final but has made just 0 and 1 in two matches here.

Nine players who featured in the Lord's opener were part of the Sri Lankan team which defeated Australia to lift the 1996 trophy.

Despite a couple of hiccups, he still believes he can emulate compatriot Sergi Brugera, the 1993 and 1994 winner, by retaining his French title.

"I think I'm playing just as well as I was last year. I'm confident," he said this week in Dusseldorf.

For Chile's Marcelo Rios, the most impressive player on clay this season after Kuerten, health will be the key factor.

Rios, another former world number one, won in Hamburg this season and reached the final in Monte Carlo but then had to pull out through injury.

Kuerten's contenders

PARIS, May 20 (Reuters): A stronger and more mature Gustavo Kuerten returns to the source of his fame next week, seeking to assert himself as the undisputed leader on clay.

The French Open begins on Monday with the men's hierarchy in a state of flux. Three players, Pete Sampras, French Open holder Carlos Moya and 1996 winner Yevgeny Kafelnikov, have in turn topped the world rankings in 1999.

But on the slow surface, Kuerten, the surprise 1997 winner here, has been in a class of his own.

Victories in the two most prestigious clay court tournaments after the French, Monte Carlo and Rome, showed the 22-year-old Brazilian has come of age.

"In two years, I have matured a lot both on court and off it. I have far more confidence on the big points," Kuerten said after winning in Rome.

The maturity shows in his looks too. Long curly hair and colourful shirts were his trademark two years ago. He now sports a discreet black outfit and his hair is clipped short.

Should he repeat his feat of 1997, when he won as a 20-year-old qualifier, Kuerten would be only the third player to claim the three major clay court titles the same year. The others were Ilie Nastase in 1973 and Thomas Muster in 1995.

But the other recent winners, current world number one Kafelnikov and reigning champion Moya, also wish to make it two.

The Parisian clay has crowned a different champion for the past five years, underlining the lack of stability at the top of men's tennis.

The towering Kafelnikov, the first Russian number one in history, will remain at the head of the rankings for the two weeks of the tournament although he, like Kuerten, struggled in the year which followed his Parisian victory.

But he shot back to form earlier this season, winning the Australian Open, to silence the critics who sometimes look down on French Open winners as mere clay court specialists.

Judging by his record on the surface so far this year, the Russian's chances look dim as he has won only two matches in his five tournaments on clay in 1999.

Moya's run is a little better. He reached the quarterfinals in Monte Carlo and the semifinals in Hamburg.

Romario in the thick of things

RIO DE JANEIRO, May 20: Five players were sent off after a massive brawl involving players, officials, fans and police interrupted a Brazilian soccer match for 17 minutes on Wednesday, reports Reuters.

Brazil international Romario, who had limped off with a muscle injury, left the team bench to join in the action during his team's match away to Friburgense.

The bad-tempered Carioca (Rio de Janeiro state) championship match degenerated after Friburgense defender Max and Flamengo's Vagner clashed in the second half.

Other players, many aiming flying karate kicks and punches at each other, became involved. The fighting quickly spread as substitutes, team officials and even some supporters ran on to the pitch to join in, while police wielding truncheons attempted to restore order.

Even Romario, who had a pack of ice around his injured thigh, was seen throwing his own in.

The interruption caused by the free-for-all was timed at 17 minutes. Once play restarted, Max of Friburgense was sent off along with Flamengo goalkeeper Clemer and central defender Fabao.

Friburgense finished with eight men after Eduardo and Nevada were sent off in the last five minutes as bad feeling resurfaced.

Earlier, Romario, who on the same ground last year picked up an injury which eventually resulted in him missing the 1998 World Cup, had scored his 16th goal of the competition to set Flamengo on the way to a 3-2 win.

While Flamengo were brawling, their arch-rivals Vasco were hammering eight goals past Madureira in an 8-1 win. The rout started with a goal from 37-year-old former international defender Mauro Galvao.

Legacy ends with Lazio

BIRMINGHAM, England, May 20: Lazio beat Mallorca 2-1 to win the 39th and last European Cup Winners' Cup final at Villa Park on Wednesday with an incisive header from Gustavo Siviero.

Nedved earned himself a place in soccer folklore as the last ever scorer in the competition which is being discontinued by UEFA because of the continuing expansion of the Champions League.

His goal at Villa Park was certainly a memorable one as he took full advantage of an incisive header from Gustavo Siviero.

With the ball bouncing loose on the edge of the penalty area, Nedved swung his right leg to send a fierce shot out of reach of despairing Mallorca goalkeeper Carlos Roa.

It was enough to give Lazio's expensively assembled side their first ever European trophy and keep alive their dream of a double this season by clinching the Italian title on Sunday.

It also put the disappointment of last season's defeat to Inter Milan in the UEFA Cup final behind them and gave Italy their seventh success in the competition which was also won by an Italian club, Fiorentina, in its first season, in 1960-61.

To make the end of the competition, a parade of former winners was held on the pitch before the kick-off with all 38 previous winners represented by a player from their winning sides.

Lazio settled first on a warm spring night in England's second city and grabbed the initiative after only seven minutes when Christian Vieri rose high above Mallorca skipper Javier Olazola to connect with a long, deep cross supplied from just

inside his own half by Giuseppe Pancaro.

For once Roa, normally a bastion in the Mallorca goal, was badly positioned and although he got a hand to Vieri's high looping effort, he could not stop it hitting the back of his net.

Vieri caused problems for the Mallorca defence all match and not even an early clash with Roa, which left him temporarily wearing a heavy bandage strapped round his head, could stop him creating turbulence.

Mallorca had two excellent chances to win the match before Nedved wrapped it up. Lauren saw a well struck angled shot excellently saved by Marchegiani, and Stankovic had a 77th minute shot looking goalbound until Lazio skipper Alessandro Nesta headed it clear.

Twenty minutes later Nesta was holding the cup aloft for the last time and a chapter of European soccer history came to a highly satisfactory close.
