

WTC goes down under



DUESSELDORF, May 23: Patrick Rafter warmed up for the French Open in style by winning two matches in a row to help Australia to a 2-1 victory over Sweden on Saturday for their first World Team Cup triumph in 20 years, reports Reuters.

World number three Rafter first tamed Thomas Enqvist 5-7, 6-3, 6-3 to level the tie at 1-1 after Sweden had won the opening match.

The double US Open champion then teamed up with Sandon Stolle to beat Jonas Bjorkman and Niklas Pietrangola 6-4, 6-4 in the decisive doubles.

Sweden had made a promising start with Bjorkman using blistering returns to overcome Mark Philippoussis 6-4, 7-6 and put them 1-0 ahead.

Rafter, who came straight to this western German city after losing to Brazil's Gustavo Kuerten in the final of the Italian Open last Sunday, won all his four singles matches on the Duesseeldorf clay and said he felt confident about the French Open.

"Today was very encouraging," he said. "I'm playing well and I feel fit. Five setters will not be a problem. I'm going to Paris knowing I can win the pressure points. I'll be hard to beat."

The 26-year-old, who relied on his exciting serve and volley game all week, played a key role in Australia's second victory in the team event which features eight top tennis nations.

The Australians, who were making their seventh final appearance, had won only once before. In 1979, they pocketed 500,000 dollars in prize money while the Swedes had 320,000 dollars to share.

"It means a lot to us," said Rafter. "Team competition is very big in Australia. We'll go out for a drink in Paris to celebrate."

Sweden, who were seeking to join Spain and the United States with a record four wins, fought bravely, saving two match points in the doubles before bowing out with Bjorkman hitting a return long.

The highlight of the final was an exciting battle between Rafter and Enqvist, which was even tighter than the score suggested.

Rafter hit a backhand volley wide to lose the first set but he fought back, breaking his op-

ponent twice in the second set to build a 4-1 lead.

Australian Open finalist Enqvist, 17th in the world, broke Rafter in the sixth game but netted a backhand on set point.

The final set was close until Rafter managed the telling break to go 5-3 up and serve for the match. He wrapped it up by hitting a superb backhand across the court on his first match point.

"If he plays like that, he will be very dangerous in Paris," said Enqvist. "I felt I played pretty well and I'm rather confident. Little things made the difference today."


Philippoussis was let down by his usually devastating serve in his match against Bjorkman

and made costly double faults.

Both players had dropped serve once in the first set when Bjorkman broke the Australian in the seventh game. The former top 10 player, now 28th in the ATP Tour rankings, went on to claim the set with a forehand winner.


World number 10 Philippoussis fought bravely throughout a close second set and a tie break was needed. Bjorkman took it 7-3 with an ace on his first match point to seal victory after just 90 minutes.

"I didn't play that well," said Philippoussis. "I didn't serve as well as I should have. But I'm in top shape and I know I can play well on clay. I'm looking forward to the French Open."

French Open begins today



PARIS, May 23 (AFP): Defending French Open champion Carlos Moya has been warned. Every body wants the Spaniard's crown and the 22-year-old former world number one faces a host of challengers on the red clay of Roland Garros over the coming fortnight.

Heading a long list of pretenders to the throne at the toughest tournament of them all are moody Chilean Marcelo Rios and Australian world number three Pat Rafter, who both come into the event on a hot streak.

Rios, seeded nine here, won at St Polten for the third time today — his 14th career title — though he barely had to stretch

himself after Argentina's Mariano Zabaleta pulled out of the final at 4-4 in the first set with a knee injury.

A quarterfinalist here 12 months ago, when he went out to Moya, Rios — who is drawn to meet a qualifier — vowed to do better than that this time round.

"I'm in really good shape and I'm sure I'm going to play better than last year. Moya had better look out," warned Rios, who is keen to improve on his poor Grand Slam record. To date it comprises just one final appearance: when he lost to Petr Korda at the 1998 Australian Open.

Rios's victory in Austria was a big boost following his shock early loss at the Italian Open to German qualifier David Pri-

nosi.

Rafter, meanwhile, continues to insist his serve-and-volley game can gain him top honours even on clay.

And he is in winning mood after his sterling performances led Australia to the World Team Cup title today, claiming a win over Thomas Enqvist and then a doubles triumph with Sandon Stolle to down Sweden 2-1.

In his previous tournament, Rafter got to the Italian Open final in Rome before succumbing to 1997 French Open champion Gustavo Kuerten of Brazil.

Kuerten himself is bursting to recapture the Roland Garros crown two years ago and having won in Monte Carlo and Rome.

Nou Camp prepares for worst

MADRID, May 23: Barcelona officials put finishing touches to an intricate security plan to day as the coastal Spanish city braced itself for an invasion of English and German soccer fans coming for the European Cup final on May 26, reports Reuters.

At least 60,000 supporters of Manchester United and Bayern Munich are set to descend on Barcelona for the first European Cup final between English and German teams since 1982.

The fact that most worries officials: United are the first English club to reach the final since Liverpool lost 1-0 to Juventus in 1985 in a match marred by the Heysel Stadium disaster in Belgium where 39 people died.

As a result, police will be out in force in Barcelona.

More than 5,000 police and paramilitary Civil Guard, some armed with anti-riot equipment and others with horses or dogs, will be deployed around the Nou Camp stadium on Wednesday.

Officials have worked out a detailed plan to ensure that fans from the opposing teams are seated apart, will arrive in different terminals or even different routes to get to and from the stadium.

Jareno, who is in charge of the joint security effort being mounted by city and national officials, said the influx of fans should begin on Tuesday.

"The traditional German-English rivalry comes into play and because of this and other conditions we are putting up a serious security effort," he said. "We are hoping this is just prevention and... everyone just comes to enjoy themselves."

Jareno said all possible steps have been taken to ensure that the fans who travel to Spain behave themselves.

He said United made people show their passports and airline ticket before selling them a seat while Bayern fans travelling to the game signed a contract promising to abide by Spanish law.

However, police say there is no way to control the moves of others who may come to the popular tourist city in search of tickets or to soak up the atmosphere.

So far the police efforts are based mainly around the stadium, although officials say the city may impose restrictions on opening hours for bars or rules on alcohol consumption.

The Spanish media, which regularly refers to all English soccer fans as "hooligans," started raising local fears about the possibility of violence last month after United and Bayern qualified for the final.

Although officials in Spain, Munich and Manchester tried to urge fans to stay home if they did not have one of the 30,000 tickets allocated to each club, thousands will likely come in search of a fight.

There have been several reports of bungled black market ticket sales and some newspapers have mentioned the fear that all the officials' efforts to separate the fans may be for naught if the black market network operates as usual.

Several thousand tickets earmarked for Barcelona football club supporters were snapped up immediately.

French League at boiling point



PARIS, May 23: Girondins Bordeaux and Olympique Marseille took their French League championship ship race to the wire when they both won 1-0 on Saturday, reports Reuters.

Bordeaux, who beat Olympique Lyon at home, will be crowned champions if they beat Paris St Germain at the Parc des Princes in Paris next Saturday.

Marseille, still one point behind after their victory over relegation threatened AJ Auxerre at the Velodrome with an early goal from France under-21 midfielder Peter Luccin, lay at French Cup winners Nantes.

Italian striker Fabrizio Ravanelli had at least two chances to increase Marseille's lead.

He curled a corner in the 26th minute onto the Auxerre bar and had a shot from the left three minutes after the interval superbly saved by goalkeeper Fabien Cool.

Bernard Diomedé had Auxerre's best chance to equalise but Marseille keeper Stephane Porato dived to his left to save the French World Cup winger's volley from a cross by Gerald Baticle.

Ivory Coast midfielder Lassina Diabate scored Bordeaux's winner with a fine shot from outside the box that found the top corner of the net just after the half-hour.

The hardest stage was without doubt tonight against Lyon. We're getting closer and closer. We'll win in Paris because we can't let go so close to our goal," said Bordeaux president Jean-Louis Triard, whose club last won the title in 1987.

Lyon's defeat left them in danger of losing out on France's third European Champions' League berth.

At home to Strasbourg next Saturday, Lyon are now only one point ahead of Monaco who beat Nancy 2-1 away, and Rennes, 1-0 winners at home to 10-man Metz.

Metz's Belgian veteran Danny Boffin was sent off for handling a goalbound ball in the 36th minute and Burundi striker Shabani Nonda converted the penalty.

Monaco are at home to Lorient, still not safe although they climbed out of the bottom three with a 4-1 home victory over Sochaux.

Rennes travel to Auxerre, the 1996 champions who dropped into the relegation

zone and will be fighting for their First Division survival next Saturday.

Auxerre's veteran coach Guy Roux said: "We fought magnificently for an hour and a half. Marseille deserve their victory, fruit of a fine goal. As far as we're concerned it's not over, we'll lift our heads."

Relegated Toulouse came from behind to beat PSG, conquerors of Marseille in their previous match, 2-1 at home.

Former giants Saint-Etienne, who had already won promotion, were crowned second division champions, while French Cup finalists Sedan also secured their promotion.

Bayern bury Bochum



BONN, May 23: German champions Bayern Munich condemned VfL Bochum to relegation on Saturday with a 4-0 second half goal.

Mario Basler, Carsten Jancker, Mehmet Scholl and Hasan Salihamidzic all scored as Bayern triumphed 4-2 in their last game before Wednesday's European Cup final against Manchester United.

Bayern coach Ottmar Hitzfeld said his team rallied well after a cautious start. "The team just didn't let go," he said.

Werder Bremen's revival continued under caretaker-coach Thomas Schaaf and they managed to avoid the drop by defeating bottom side Borussia Moenchengladbach 4-1.

Five clubs remained in the fight to avoid the last relegation

place with one game left.

Eintracht Frankfurt, third from bottom, gave themselves an unexpected bonus by recovering from 2-0 down at Schalke 04 to win 3-2. They boosted their points tally to 34.

Norwegian striker Jan Age Fjorholt scored midway through the first half and Thomas Sobottka added a second from the penalty spot after Schalke's Andreas Mueller handled.

But it was not until the 75th minute that midfielder Olaf Janssen secured three crucial points by calmly slotting home from close range after Schalke goalkeeper Oliver Reck blocked his first attempt.

"After we won two down we proved that our team is still intact. We won by showing real heart. We'll try everything in the last match," said Eintracht coach Joerg Berger.
