Australian Development Scholarships (ADS) - 2000 Intake

Applications are invited from Bangladeshi (tribal and non-tribal) students for study under the Australian Development Scholarships (ADS) scheme at postgraduate level in Australia.

- The total number of scholarships will be 24 (Twenty four). Twenty (20) will be in the Untargeted (male and female) category and 4 (four) in the Targeted (male and female) category.
- Scholarships will be provided at postgraduate (ie. Masters) level.
- Fields of Study offered are Agricultural Science (including Farm Management), Business Administration, Computer Science, Development Economics, Education, Environmental Studies, Public Health and Diploma in Teaching English as a Second Language (TESOL).
- Candidates fulfilling the following conditions may apply:
 - Age: the applicant must be less than 40 years on 1 January 2000;
 - Minimum Qualifications: minimum four years undergraduate or combined undergraduate/postgraduate course(s);
 - Untargeted category: first class in all examinations;
 - Targeted category: no third class in any examination;
 - Work experience: candidates applying for Business Administration must have two years of work experience (evidence of experience should be attached with the application).
 - The field of study applied for should be related to past academic background.
- Candidates fulfilling the above conditions must apply in English on plain paper along with bio-data and one passport size photograph. Bio-data must contain (a) name; (b) date of birth; (c) present address and telephone number; (d) permanent address and telephone number; (e) occupation; (f) educational qualifications including (i) name of examination, (ii) Board/University, (iii) year of graduation, (iv) Division/Class, (v) total marks with percentage. Copies of all certificates and marksheets (duly attested) must be attached.
- Targeted candidates must submit certificates of tribal descent duly signed by the respective Deputy Commissioner.
- Candidates must select only one field of study. Candidates must submit a separate statement, in English and preferably typewritten stating why they have selected this field of study. In particular, candidates should outline how the proposed field of study will benefit them in carrying out their job on return to Bangladesh.
- Candidates who are in the public service should apply through the proper channels.
- Applications with incomplete papers, faulty or false information will not be considered.
- Candidates who are already selected for any other scholarships will not be considered. Candidates who already have foreign graduate or postgraduate degrees are discouraged from applying.
- The application must be addressed to the **First Secretary (Development Assistance), AusAID, Australian High Commission, 184 Gulshan Avenue, Dhaka**. Candidates must specify the category and the subject applied for on top of the bio-data as well as on the envelope containing the application. The last date for submission of applications is **17 June 1999**. Any application received after **3:45 PM** on this date will not be considered.
- If an applicant cannot be contacted at the present address and telephone number, then AusAID will reserve the right not to offer a scholarship. Therefore, it is necessary that all applicants provide a contact telephone number.
- The decision of the Australian High Commission will be final.


Moderately heavy falls at places over Chittagong, Barisal and Khulna is expected during the period, Met Office said.

Asian Railway Network meet concludes today

The four day meeting of a regional expert group, evaluating the development and operation of Trans Asian Railway Network (TARN), concludes in the city today, reports UNB.

State Minister for Foreign Affairs Abul Hasan Chowdhury will be present at the concluding session at Hotel Sheraton at 4 pm, said a press release yesterday.

Experts from China, Thailand, Iran, Turkey, Pakistan, Sri Lanka, India, Nepal, Myanmar and host Bangladesh along with ESCAP, ADB and CIDA representatives are taking part in the policy-level meeting.

The meeting is likely to take decision on finalising the Trans Asian route after reviewing the finding of various studies and recommendations.


