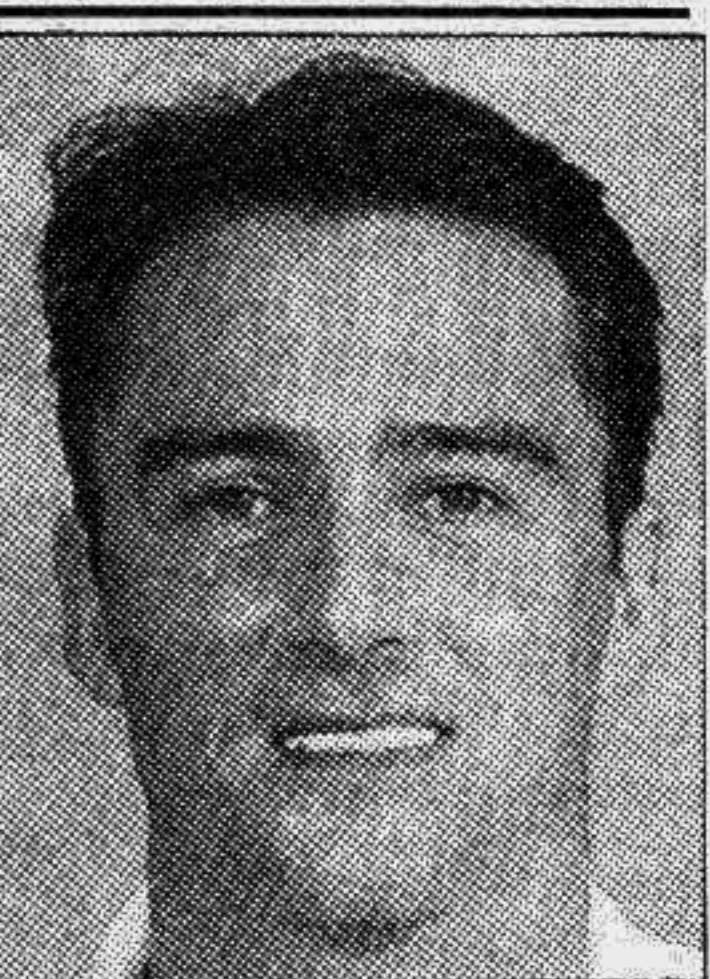

Rose must pay

ST. JOHN'S, Antigua, May 28: West Indies pace bowler Franklin Rose has been fined five per cent of his fee for touring South Africa and told he will not play for the side again until he settles a hotel bill, reports Reuters.

Rose appeared before the disciplinary committee of the West Indies Cricket Board on May 22 in Antigua to answer three charges. One was dismissed and two upheld by the committee, the board said on Thursday.

Rose must settle a hotel bill in South Africa that he had not paid and will not be considered for selection on any future West Indies team until it is settled.

Rose was also fined five per cent of his tour fee after receiving an unsatisfactory report from the tour manager after the disastrous tour.

Reds return home

MANCHESTER, May 28: Half a million ecstatic fans packed the streets of Manchester on Thursday to welcome back Manchester United from their spectacular European Cup victory in Barcelona, reports Reuters.

Jubilant supporters converged on the city centre to reinforce the faithful handful who had been there since Wednesday night's epic injury time victory over Bayern Munich.

Along the team's seven miles (11.27 km) parade route on an open-topped bus, thousands upon thousands of red-shirted fans sang terrace anthems above an orchestra of whistles and klaxons.

A handful of amused businessmen and women struggled through the throng — others

better prepared swigged bottles of beer from office windows or waved scarves from high-rise balconies.

Rows of baton-wielding police seemed unsure whether to hold the crowd back or join in the party. Several lost their uniform caps and a couple briefly sported felt top hats in red and white team colours.

A little blonde girl in a red dress, face crumpled with the effort, blew a whistle with all her might, perched on the shoulders of her shirtless father as he chanted United... United... pint in hand.

Across the street six schoolboys soaked up the atmosphere on top of a bus shelter waving three silver trophy-shaped balloons.

Further down the road another bus shelter collapsed under the weight of three fully-grown supporters trying to

dance on its roof arm in arm.

The bus carrying the United squad was preceded by 10 minutes of stupendous roaring from the crowd. The European Cup was perched on the front above the route number plate of the vehicle which showed 2-1, the result of the final.

The squad, wearing dark blazers, held their fists in the air as armfuls of office paper fluttered down windows high above.

Players and manager Alex Ferguson took turns holding the cup — departing goalkeeper Peter Schmeichel seemed reluctant to release it.

The team went on to join 17,500 fans at a ticket-only party in an indoor arena in central Manchester.

The vast crowd left outside looked set to see in the dawn in recognition of United's first European Cup victory for 31 years.

Champs' League spot up for grabs

MADRID, May 28: Real Mallorca striker Dani heightened the tension in Spain this weekend with score at Real Madrid, reports AFP.

Real Madrid and Mallorca, fighting for second spot in the Spanish League which will provide an automatic qualifying berth in next year's new-look European Champions League, meet at the Santiago-Bernabeu stadium on Sunday.

And Dani, who learnt his trade at Real where he had two spells, would like nothing more than to add to his goal tally at the famous venue.

Barcelona have already won their 16th league title using the fanfare of their centenary celebrations which reached a peak on the Sant Jaume square in the centre of the city on Monday.

However 1998 European Cup champions Real Madrid and Mallorca, who reached the last ever European Cup Winners Cup final at Villa Park earlier this month, are eager to continue their continental success.

Mallorca, with 63 points, are a point ahead of Real with three games left to go, but have never won at the Santiago Bernabeu stadium.

Real Madrid, who would earn their 800th league victory should they beat Mallorca, are unbeaten at home since the arrival of their disciplinarian Welsh coach John Toshack in February.

Athletic Bilbao, in seventh spot and need to go up to fifth to earn a UEFA Cup slot, host champions Barcelona on Saturday evening.

Apart from Real Madrid and Mallorca, three other teams are chasing one of the three Cham-

pions League spots: fourth-placed Deportivo la Coruna (61 points), fifth-placed Celta Vigo (61 points) and Valencia in sixth (59 points).

Celta, unbeaten at home this season, have the toughest match at their Balaidos stadium against Tenerife, who are facing probable relegation at second-from-bottom. In the other games, Valencia host 13th-placed Real Oviedo on Saturday and Deportivo travel to 14th-placed Racing Santander on Sunday.

MILAN, May 28: Bologna beat Inter Milan 2-1 here on Thursday to make themselves favourites to go through in this UEFA Cup play-off game, reports AFP.

Sweden's Kennet Andersson opened the scoring for Bologna in the seventh minute and Michele Paramatti scored again four minutes after the break. Roberto Baggio pulled one back for Inter in the 59th minute.

Brazilian Ronaldo, doubtful for the match with a thigh problem, finally played but came off at half-time.

The return leg goes ahead at Bologna's Dall'Ara stadium on Sunday.

Muktis in last four

Muktijoddha Sangsad KC advanced to the semifinals of the Pedrollo Pump 15th Federation Cup football tournament with one match in hand beating Brothers Union 2-1 at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday, reports UNB.

Muktijoddha, who earlier defeated Badda Jagarani Sangsad 2-0 in their first round robin league match, will play their last match against Arambagh KS on Sunday.

In the day's match, the winners led the first half 2-0 with striker Liton scoring both the goals. Liton put Muktijoddha ahead early in the 10th minute and doubled the margin in the 39th minute while Palash scored the consolation goal for Brothers Union in the 85th minute from a penalty shot.

Earlier, in the day's first match, Badda Jagarani Sangsad trounced an Arambagh KS by 4-1 after leading the first half 2-1.

Morocco upbeat this time

RABAT, May 28: Morocco is much better equipped than before to organize the 2006 World Cup, the country's bid president Driss Benhima said here on Thursday, reports AFP.

Morocco are bidding to host the event along with Brazil, Germany, England and South Africa. "The handicaps of the last two bids by Morocco are no longer the case today because of a much improved infrastructure in areas of transport, communication and accommodation," Benhima said.

He added that Africa had the right to host the games in a rotation system with other continents. "If there is one country in Africa which merits this privilege the most, it's Morocco," he said.

"Each candidature constitutes a further step towards the objective and it's fairly rare that a country bidding for the first time wins."

Benhima goes to Cairo on June 2 to promote his country's bid with African football confederation (CAF) officials.

PORT LOUIS, May 28: Seven people were killed in a fire at a Mauritius gambling house when it was torched by soccer fans angry that their team had lost a crucial match, state-owned television and radio reported today, reports Reuters.

Three men, two women and two children all died in the Sunday night blaze at the gambling house in the capital Port Louis, the Mauritius Broadcasting Corporation (MBC) said.

Sampras shellshocked



PARIS, May 28: Unseeded Andrei Medvedev of Ukraine on Thursday wrecked Pete Sampras' quest for the only Grand Slam title he has never won, reports AFP.

Medvedev beat the American second seed 7-5, 1-6, 6-4, 6-3 in their French Open second-round match on the slow red clay at Roland Garros.

Sampras, who had been aiming for a record-equaling 12th Grand Slam title here, was outplayed over 2hr 21min by

now plays Zimbabwe's Byron Black, who beat Albert Portas of Spain 6-2, 6-3, 6-2.

Sampras was visibly shellshocked after the defeat.

"All losses hurt — but in Slams they hurt even more. Maybe I put too much pressure on myself here," he reflected.

Sampras' exit left former men's champion Gustavo Kuerten of Brazil, seeded eighth, as the only seed left in the bottom quarter of the draw.

Kuerten went through following a 6-2, 6-3, 6-6, 6-2 win over Guillermo Canas of Argentina despite a whopping 61

Conchita Martinez of Spain.

Pierce annoyed the crowd with repeated delaying tactics, taking treatment for blisters and then a bathroom break. She also picked up a penalty point for going back to the chair to change her racket between points.

A clearly angry Martinez asked umpire Jane Harvey at one stage: "Can she have whatever she wants?"

Canadian-born Pierce led the match before obviously becoming tired and taking an eternity between each point.

She declined to tell reporters why she had twice consulted doctor at the courtside during one of the breaks.

Official tournament doctor Bernard Montalan said Pierce had complained of a high temperature but showed no signs of any serious ailment.

Pierce's exit, along with ninth seed Nathalie Tauziat, left France with only two women in the third round after 19 started out in the women's singles main draw.

Only Nathalie Dechy and 16th-seed Julie Halard-Decugis remain.

World number 17 Amelie Mauresmo, who lost to top seed Martina Hingis in the second round on Wednesday, added to French woes late Thursday when she suffered a sprained right ankle during a doubles match alongside Halard-Decugis against Jana Novotna and Natasha Zvereva.

The French pair trailed 5-4 in the opening set when Mauresmo had to quit. She was taken to hospital for X-rays.

Star-studded Prefontaine Classic

EUGENE, May 28: World and Olympic champion Michael Johnson heads an illustrious 400m field in Sunday's Prefontaine Classic IAAF Grand Prix meeting as US athletics stars begin to look toward Seville, reports AFP.

Johnson, ranked No. 1 in the world last year at 400m for an unprecedented eighth time, already boasts the fastest time in the World this year, 44.51sec. On Sunday he will face the toughest field assembled in the United States since the 1996 Atlanta Olympics.

Challenging him will be the No. 2-ranked 400 runner in the world, Britain's Mark Richardson — who handed Johnson his only defeat last year, and was the winner of the overall Grand Prix — No. 5 in the world Jerome Young, the USA Outdoor Champion in 1998, No. 6 in the world Antonio Pettigrew, who has the second-fastest time in the world this year, No. 7 in the world Alvin Harrison, and No. 10 in the world Danny McCray. Rounding out the field will be Brazilian Sanderlei Parrela, the winner of the Mt. SAC Relays 400 in the fourth fastest time in the world this year.

US sprint queen Marion Jones will also compete in the second IAAF Grand Prix meet on US soil — after skipping last week's US Open Grand Prix in Edwardsville, Illinois.

Jones, the 1997 100m world champion who was ranked No. 1 in the world in 100m and 200m in 1997 and '98, is slated to race the 200m on Sunday.

The women's 200m field also features Nigerian Falilat Ogunkoya, Jamaican Beverly McDonald and American Inger Miller.

The American had won five out of his previous six meetings with Medvedev but was unable to improve on his first-round performance when he narrowly avoided defeat in a five-setter against Costa Rica's Juan Antonio Marin.

Sampras, 27, has won at least one Grand Slam every year for the last six years but has now failed in 10 visits to Roland Garros.

He skipped the Australian Open with fatigue and earlier this year lost the number one ranking he has held at the end of each of the last six seasons.

Medvedev, who hit a career high of fourth in 1994, kept the ball deep and Sampras was largely on the back foot throughout. The American's normally reliable serve deserted him and he served 10 double faults.

Sampras made nearly twice as many errors as his opponent, a semifinalist here in 1993, to become the seventh seeded man to bow out.

Sampras lost in the second round for the second straight year.

The 24-year-old Medvedev

unforced errors.

Third seed Pat Rafter of Australia, the two-time US Open champion, led Frenchman Nicolas Escude 7-5, 6-0 when play was called off for the day with light fading.

Sixth-ranked Alex Corretja, last year's beaten finalist, was level at two sets-against compatriot Fernando Vicente while 14th seed Felix Mantilla of Spain easily ousted Mariano Puerba of Argentina 7-5, 6-4, 6-4.

Thomas Enqvist of Sweden, became another seed to fall when Norway's Christian Ruud beat him 7-6, 6-4, 6-3 in their second-round match.

Enqvist joined Goran Ivanisevic, Karol Kucera, Mark Philippoussis, Richard Krajicek and world number one Yevgeny Kafelnikov on the sidelines, where Sampras later joined him.

Meanwhile, Mary Pierce angered her opponent, the umpire and the spectators as she crashed out in the second round on the day.

Eighth seed Pierce, one of five French women in the world top 20, slid out to the sound of jeers from her home crowd as she went down 4-6, 6-3, 6-3 to former Wimbledon champion
