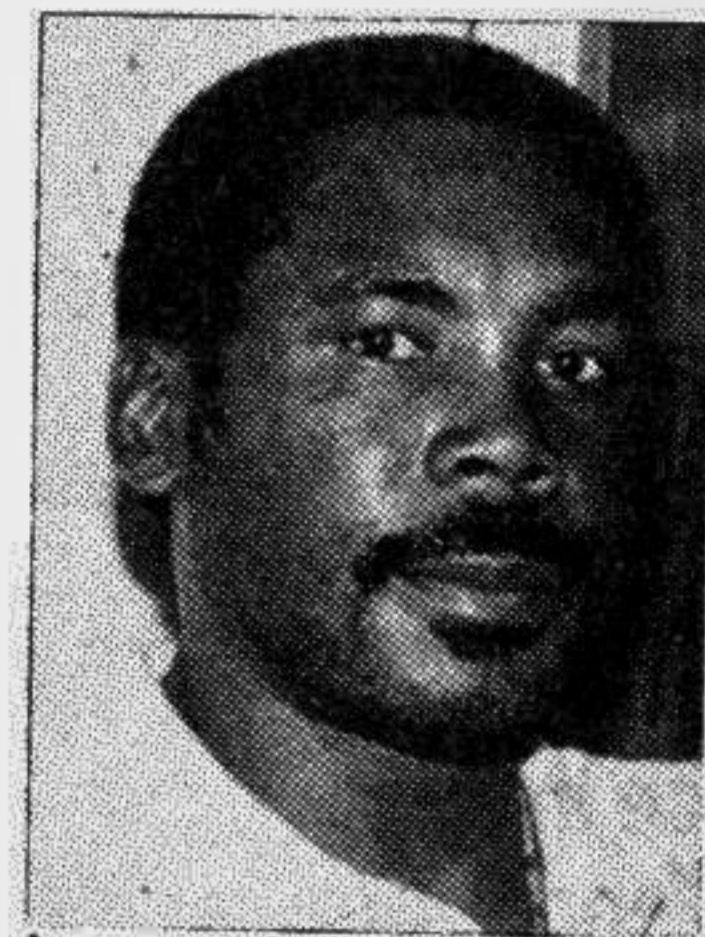
Kader Siddiqui's meeting foiled, 20 hurt in clash

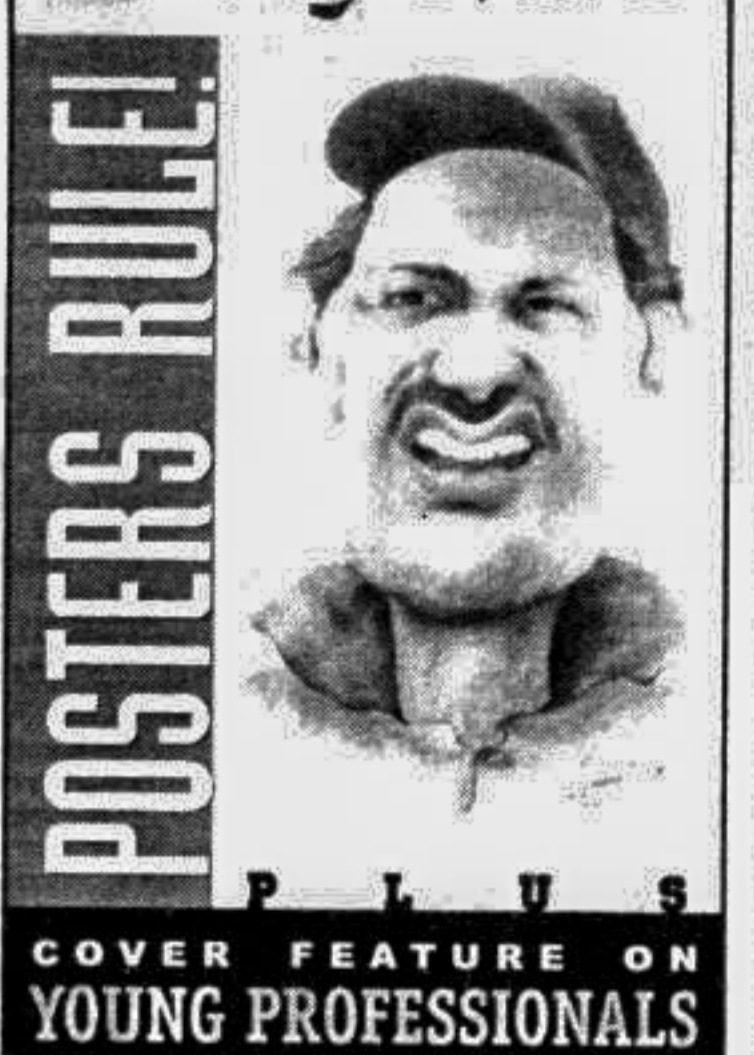


Australian players celebrate the dismissal of Jimmy Adams as the West Indian takes the road to the pavilion at Old Trafford yesterday. - AFP photo

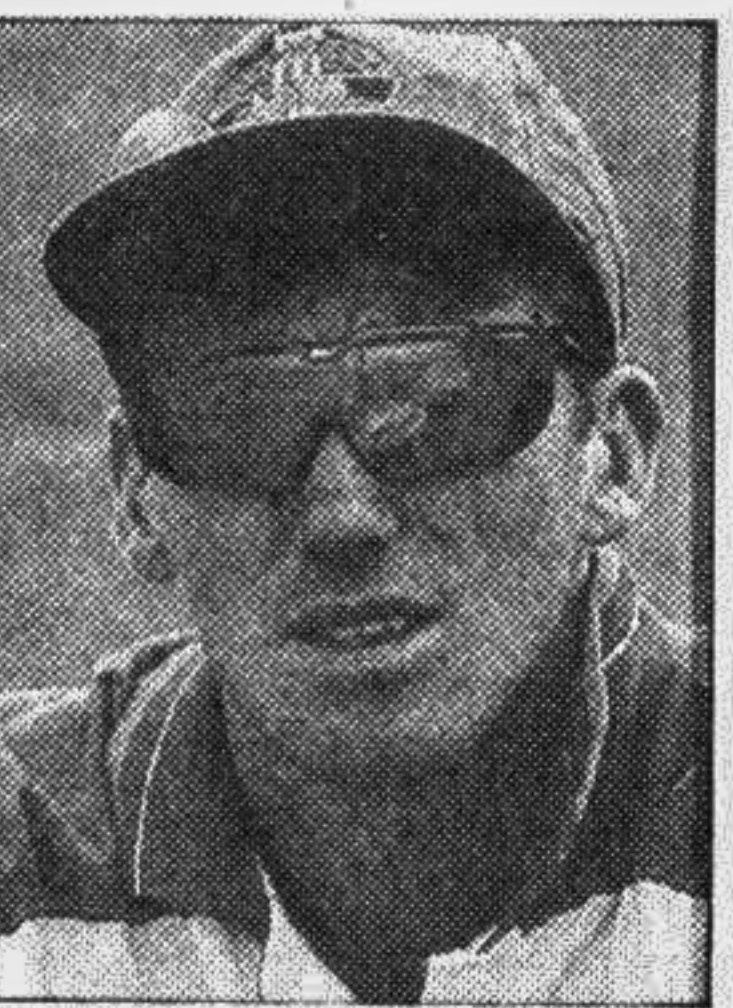
