## Nat'l consensus needed for reformation of public adminn'

Chairman of Public Administration Reforms A T M Shamsul Haq has stressed the importance of national consensus on basic issues like administrative decentralisation for completing the reform works of public administration, reports UNB.

The Cabinet, he said, has already approved two recommendations of the Commission.

He said the university teachers, who are engaged in building worthy citizens of the country, can play an important role in reform works.

Chaired by pro Vice-Chancellor Prof Mohammad Shahzad Ali, the meeting was addressed, among others, Prof Giasuddin, Prof Anisuzzaman and Prof Ataur Rahman.

## Survey Dept to make digital maps by 2001

Bangladesh Survey Department will begin preparations for producing digital maps by 2001 for rapid dissemination of geographical information, reports UNB.

To this effect two projects, financed by France and Japan, are under implementation.

This was stated at a meeting of the Parliamentary Standing Committee on Defence Minister held with its chairman K M Shafullah in the chair at Sangsab Bhaban yesterday.

The meeting also reviewed whether there had been any irregularities in the purchase of Coco-Cola bottles by Mukti Joddha Kalaya Trust.

It also took stock of overall activities of the survey department, including progress in implementation of various projects.

The parliamentary body on defence discussed matters related to making maps by the department, particularly topographical survey, frontier maps, cantonment survey, border embarkation and geographical and political maps.

Committee members Shawkat Ali, Mohammad Farook Khan, Golam Mohammad Quader and Mohammad Akhtarruzzaman attended the meeting.

Science and Technology Minister Mohammad Noor Uddin Khan attended it as representative of Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina who holds the defence portfolio.

## DU students submit memo to VC

Earlier, the students brought out a procession on the campus and also staged demonstration and held a rally at the Aparajeyo Bangla.

Addressing the rally, the representatives of the students said that the scheduled examinations will coincide with BCS examinations.

## Legal experts suggest a set of electoral reforms

Suggesting a set of electoral reforms, legal experts called for making a law barring public service-holders from participating in elections within five years of their retirement, reports UNB.

They also recommended common poster for all candidates from a constituency to reduce electoral expenses. The Election Commission would bear the costs and distribute those equally among the candidates.

The recommendations came from a workshop organised by the Fair Election Monitoring Alliance (FEMA) on Saturday as part of its electoral law-reform advocacy meetings with various professional groups.

Supreme Court's senior Advocate Abdur Rab Chowdhury underscored the need of setting up a Central Election Tribunal, instead of spreading tribunals across the country, for rapid disposal of electoral cases.

"Electoral cases should be disposed of within 120 days or at best another two months," he said.

About the reserve seats of parliament, Rab said every political party should nominate a third of its candidates from women to ensure equal representation in the Jatiya Sangsab.

Among others, Advocate Wazir Farooq, Barrister Manjur Hasan and former IGP Enamul Haq took part in discussion. FEMA Vice-President Munira Khan, executive Director Tarique Gani and Burhan Uddin Ahmed were present.


