EURO 2000
Busy weekend of qualifiers

PARIS, June 4: The big five of European football all hope to take another step towards next year's European Championship in Holland and Belgium this weekend, reports AFP.

All five teams have changed their coach since the World Cup. But, while France and Italy remain unbeaten, England, Germany and Spain bid to continue their recoveries after bad starts to the campaign.

SPAIN-SAN MARINO
Spain look to consolidate their improvement under Jose Antonio Camacho when they host minnows San Marino.

Camacho took the helm last autumn from Javier Clemente, who quit after his team's defeat by Cyprus in their opening qualifier.

Clemente had been walking on thin ice after his team's exit in the group stages in the World Cup.

However, Camacho has rebuilt confidence in perhaps the biggest footballing nation never to win a World Cup and now Spain are second in group six - a point behind Austria with a game in hand. Spain thrashed Austria 9-0 when the teams met earlier in the campaign.

The feelgood factor returned to Spain in April when the under-20 side won the World Youth Cup in Nigeria.

Camacho recalls Athletic Bilbao's Julien Guerrero and Real Madrid's Fernando Morientes for the San Marino match.

Austria, meanwhile, are still sore after their Spanish spanking and hope to banish the blues in Israel Sunday.

FRANCE-RUSSIA
In group four world champions France bid to stay top by beating Russia in Paris.

Coach Roger Lemerre is undefeated since replacing Aime Jacquet after France's World Cup win.

But they are without world player of the year Zinedine Zidane and left-back Bixente Lizarazu.

Roma defender Vincent Candela replaces Lizarazu while Zidane's understudy could be Marseille playmaker Robert Pires or Lyon midfielder Vikash Dhorasoo.

Lemerre should persist with Arsenal striker Nicolas Anelka and Bordeaux's Sylvain Wilton up front.

France are eager not to slip up as they still face a trip to Ukraine - the teams are level on points - and are still haunted by their last qualifying campaign, for the 1994 World Cup.

They looked to have all but booked their tickets to America until shock home defeats by Israel and Bulgaria proved fatal.

Fortunately as hosts they did not have to qualify for last year's World Cup - and reaped the benefit.

Iceland host Armenia and Ukraine should wallop Andorra in the other matches in that pool.

ENGLAND-SWEDEN
Like Camacho England's coach Kevin Keegan has put the national team on an even keel but only victory will do at home to Sweden Saturday.

Sweden have a double psychological edge. They beat England 2-1 in Stockholm last autumn to take a firm grip on Group five - and have not lost to England since 1968 in those halcyon days when the team managed by Alf Ramsey were world champions.

But Keegan - a renowned positive thinker - will not countenance failure.

Firstly he named his side a full 48 hours before kick-off - football's equivalent of throwing down a gauntlet.

Secondly he hopes to reap a dividend from Manchester United's European Cup success - United players feature prominently in his line-up.

Poland and Bulgaria clash in the other Group five match Friday evening.

ITALY-WALES
In group one Dino Zoff has made a good start to his tenure as Italy coach and Wales should not buck that trend in Bologna.

Zoff gave Sampdoria striker Vincenzo Montella a tonic after his team's relegation to Serie B by including him in the squad although Lazio's Christian Vieri and Juventus hitman Filippo Inzaghi should start up front.

Fabio Cannavaro returns for the "Azzurri" but injuries to Dino Baggio, Francesco Totti, Alessandro Nesta and Gianluca Pessotto have limited Zoff's options.

Denmark host Belarus in the other group one match with Peter Schmeichel in goal for the first time since ending his career with United in that European Cup win.

GERMANY-MOLDOVA
Meanwhile, Germany's coach Erich Ribbeck has suffered an embarrassing series of defeats - to Turkey, the United States and Scotland. But only the Turkey setback had any European impact - and a win over Northern Ireland lifted Germany to the top of group three.

Victory over Moldova Friday night would seem a formality but Ribbeck may have the opposite problem to Keegan. He must lift his Bayern Munich contingent, stunned by their United defeat.

Germany's main group three rivals Turkey visit Finland. In Group nine the Czech Republic are centering towards a place in the finals and visit Estonia.

Scotland go to the Faroe Islands without Don Hutchison, who scored their winner against Germany. Hutchison is getting married in the Caribbean. Bosnia-Herzegovina tackle Lithuania in the other fixture in that group.

Group eight has been dominated by politics. The Republic of Ireland's match with Yugoslavia was called off after the Irish government declined to issue visas to the Yugoslavs because of the Kosovo conflict.

However Macedonia's match with Croatia goes ahead in a group that has already seen several potentially volatile Balkan grudge matches postponed.

Group seven leaders Portugal entertain Slovakia while second-placed Romania play Hungary. Liechtenstein visit Azerbaijan.

Norway are top dogs in group two but must do without another Manchester United hero Ole Gunnar Solskjaer for their match in Albania.

Again the Kosovo crisis casts a shadow as Norway midfielder Oyvind Leonhardsen, who plays for English side Liverpool, refused to travel because of the security situation. Kjetil Rekdal or Petter Rudi will deputise.

Meanwhile, Georgia's Dutch coach Johan Boskamp has axed talented Zaza Dzhanelashvili ahead of the home game with Greece after the player's woeful record of absenteeism.

He is also without Grasshoppers star Mikhal Kavelashvili and Dynamo Kiev player Kakha Kaladze although Dynamo Tbilisi's Otari Khizanishvili is included.

Latvia entertain Slovenia in the other group two match.

Olsen to takeover at Wimbledon

LONDON, June 4: Wimbledon have survived in the English Premier League against all the odds but they now face a new era without the man who has done so much to keep them there, reports Reuters.

Despite little money, few star names and without a ground of their own, the south London club have not only avoided relegation but often finished in the top half of the table.

But after more than eight years' service, manager Joe Kinnear is on his way. The second-longest serving boss in the league after Manchester United's Alex Ferguson is set to be replaced by Egil Olsen, the former Norwegian national coach.

Kinnear, 52, who suffered a heart attack in March, has been in charge at the south London club since January 1991.

He took over a team famous for their fighting spirit. "Crazy Gang" solidarity and direct long ball approach.

Muktis send MSC packing

Muktijodha Sangsad set a clash at Abahani in the final of the 15th Pabna Trophy Football Cup football tournament.

On the wind-swept red clay of Roland Garros, the German star beat Monica Seles 6-7, 6-3, 6-4 on Thursday to reach her first Grand Slam final since she won the French Open in 1996.

Graf feels relaxed

PARIS, June 4 (Reuters): For Steffi Graf, playing in the French Open final on Saturday against top seed Martina Hingis will just be business as usual.

The former queen of the courts, who won five of her 21 Grand Slam titles in Paris, will be playing in her ninth final at Roland Garros and her 30th in one of the four Grand Slam events.

Hingis, on the other hand, lost her only final in Paris two years ago and will be aiming for a feat her opponent was the last to achieve - win each of the four Grand Slam tournaments at least once.

Graf achieved a genuine Grand Slam - the four tournaments in the same year - in 1988.

The German, who has not been in a Grand Slam final since the 1996 US Open, believes the pressure will thus be on Hingis's shoulders.

"I'm sure that's going to work for me. Obviously, I don't have to prove anything. I'm just happy to be there," said the German, who would move one step closer to seven-time winner Chris Evert should she lift the trophy on Saturday.

Asked if she would feel nervous, Graf smiled and replied: "I won't!"

After two seasons marred by injuries, Graf had no real expectations when she started the tournament. Observers felt the experienced sixth-seed would do well to get to the semifinals.

"It is great to be back after three years. It is something I did not believe I would be able to do when I got here," said Graf, who has won a record 86 singles on the clay of Paris.

Her 10th victory in 15 clashes against Monica Seles, probably her fiercest rival, was such a joy for the German that she did not want to look ahead.

"It's such a big thing to be where I am right now. Very few people, even me, thought that I'd be here," she said. "I don't want to think any further."

Mark Bosnich interrogated

BIRMINGHAM, England, June 4: Australian goalkeeper Mar Bosnich, who has just made the biggest move of his career by joining Manchester United, was arrested and questioned by British police today after an alleged robbery, reports Reuters.

Bosnich was later released on bail without being charged. He has to report to the police again on July 21.

Bosnich, who signed a four-year contract with the European Cup winners on Wednesday, was arrested at his home in central England on Friday after an incident near a Birmingham lap-dancing club in the early hours.

Officers were called to an incident in Wrottesley Street in Birmingham city centre at 1.48 am in the early hours of this morning where a man from the Birmingham area alleged that he had been attacked and robbed, a police spokesman said.

The police would not officially confirm the man arrested was Bosnich. But sources close to the case confirmed the Australian goalkeeper, who is still under contract to Aston Villa, had been questioned.

Youth against experience

PARIS, June 4 (AP): Steffi Graf is back.

On the wind-swept red clay of Roland Garros, the German star beat Monica Seles 6-7, 6-3, 6-4 on Thursday to reach her first Grand Slam final since she won the French Open in 1996.

In Saturday's championship match, Graf will go for her sixth French Open title against Martina Hingis, the 18-year-old Swiss player who succeeded Graf as No 1 in March 1997.

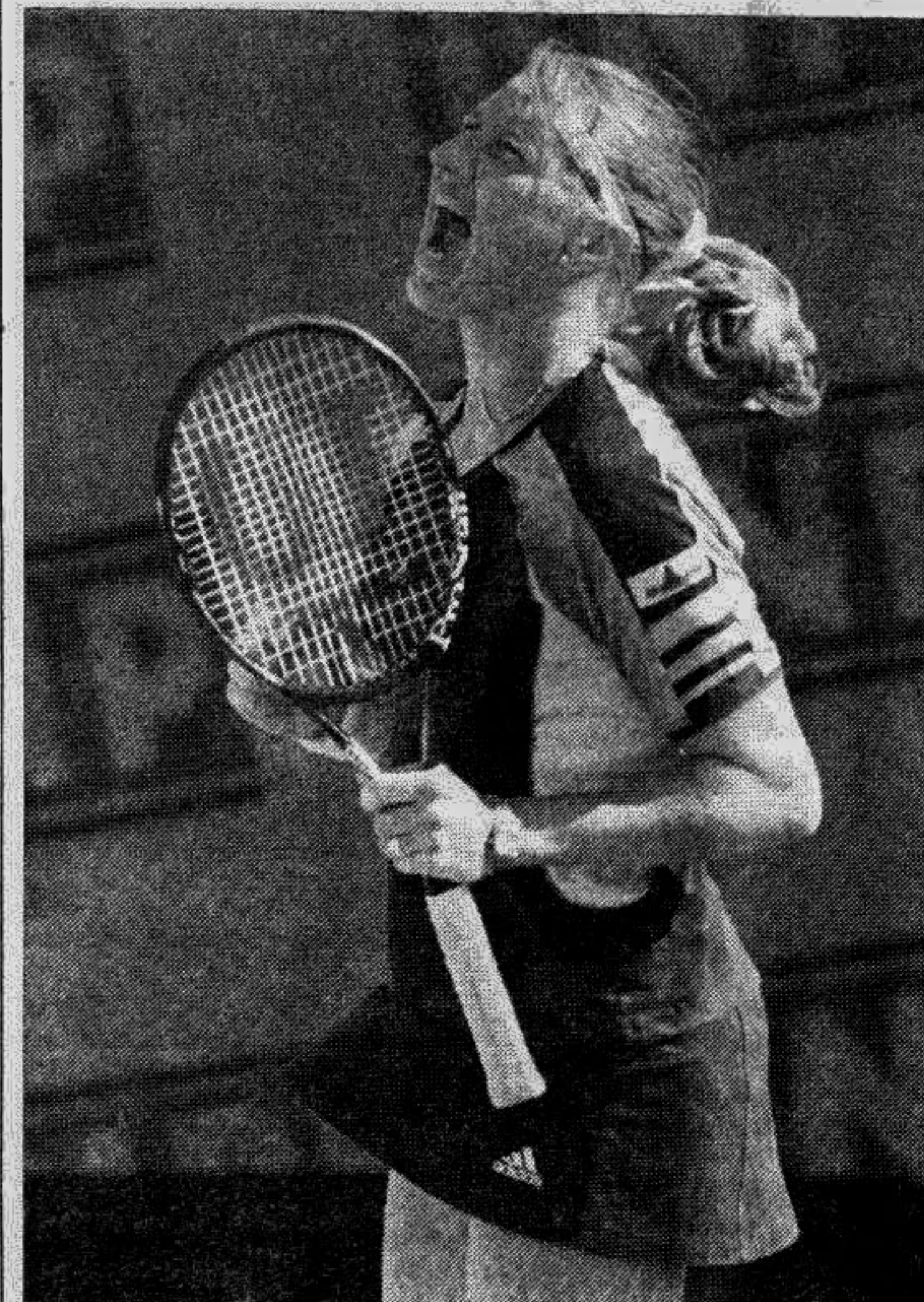

In the third, Graf immediately broke Seles' serve again, only to see Seles return the favour in the fourth game.

In the ninth, Graf stepped up the pressure, hitting her backhand slice deeper, giving Seles little time to adjust with her two-handed game. Under pressure, Seles produced several errors, dropping her serve again.

It proved to be decisive. Two forehand winners gave Graf a match point and she converted it when Seles hit a return long.

"It was a tough and close match and I was able to take risks when I had to at the end of the third set," said Graf, who screamed in delight after beating Seles for the 10th time in 15 meetings.

The wind made it difficult for both.

"It was gusty and swirling and it was hard to get into any kind of rhythm," Seles said. "I was fighting Steffi and I was fighting the wind at the same time."

"The court started slow, but at the end there was hardly any clay left. It came down to one or two points," Steffi played way better in the last few games and I was too defensive, and that made the difference."

In the men's semifinals Friday, American Andre Agassi is the only seeded player left at No 13, and a championship victory would make him only the fifth man to win all four Grand Slams, and the first since Rod Laver in 1969.

Such greats as Boris Becker, Jimmy Connors, Stefan Edberg and Pete Sampras have won the other three Grand Slams, but slipped up Yevgeny Kafelnikov of Russia and ninth-seeded Marcelo Rios of Chile.

Indian pair in final

PARIS, June 4: Indian top seeds Mahesh Bhupathi and Leander Paes stormed into the final of the men's French Open doubles here Thursday after dousing Swedes Niklas Kulti and Mickael Tillstrom in straight sets, reports AFP.

Bhupathi and Paes advanced 6-4, 6-3 in their rain-ravaged match and will now face unseeded tandem Goran Ivanisevic of Croatia and American partner Jeff Tarango, who defeated Argentina's Pablo Albano and Spain's Tomas Carbonell 7-5, 6-4.

Lavonia's Larissa Neiland and American Rick Leach, the sixth seeds, reached the final of the mixed doubles when they saw off fourth seeds Elena Likhovtseva of Russia and Mark Woodford of Australia 6-1, 3-6, 6-1.

Neiland and Leach will now face Katarina Srebotnik of Slovenia and Piet Norval of South Africa, who ousted South African pair Nannie De Villiers and Grant Stafford 6-3, 6-3.

The mixed doubles final is on Friday, the men's doubles final on Saturday.

UCB signs 30 black players

JOHANNESBURG, June 4: Thirty of the 160 players contracted to South African provinces for the 1999-2000 cricket season are black, reports Reuters.

Last month the United Cricket Board set itself a target of involving 22 players of colour in provincial first-class cricket next season.

The UCB released initial squads of contracted players on Friday. No quotas have been set but provinces will no longer be permitted to select all-white teams.
