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Court rejects Manik's bail prayer again

SYLHET, June 6: The court today again rejected the bail prayer of Muhibur Rahman Manik, MP.

Shah E-Alam Chowdhury, Additional District & Sessions Judge, Sunamganj turned down the prayer moved in absence of the District & Sessions Judge, who is on leave.

Earlier on June 3, the District Judge's court had fixed June 9 for hearing of the prayer. But the lawyers while appearing before the Additional District Judge today said, the MP should be allowed to join the budget session of the Jatiya Sangsad for 'national interest'.

The lawyers said the MP is not an FIR-named accused and the police had falsely implicated him in the case. They said, the police did not take any step after the MP himself filed a case, rather they filed another case after 11 days of the incident, only to give benefit to his political opponents. The lawyers also alleged that, the police had been playing against the MP for long as part of a 'deep-rooted conspiracy'.

They said, prior to his arrest, neither CID nor the police took permission from the Speaker of Jatiya Sangsad. It is a clear violation of rule of law as well as of the privileges given to an MP. They alleged adding, the so-called confessional statement under section 164 by the maid servant of the MP's house is fabricated. Arrest of an MP on the basis of statement of a maid who was fired long before the incident is not at all acceptable.

They said, prior to his arrest, neither CID nor the police took permission from the Speaker of Jatiya Sangsad. It is a clear violation of rule of law as well as of the privileges given to an MP. They alleged adding, the so-called confessional statement under section 164 by the maid servant of the MP's house is fabricated. Arrest of an MP on the basis of statement of a maid who was fired long before the incident is not at all acceptable.

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Advocate Syed Shamsul Islam, Advocate Bazul Majid Chowdhury Khushru, Advocate Rabiul Lais Chowdhury and Advocate Khairul Kabir Rumen moved the bail prayer.

The prosecution while opposing the bail prayer said the arrest is fully legal and it was done after going through all necessary formalities. The CID has gathered substantial evidence regarding the bomb making and the MP's complicity with this, it said adding it has already been evident that the people involved with bomb making were close to the MP and it was being financed by himself and done by his own men. The MP even gave a room attached to his bedroom for the purpose it pointed out. The CID also gathered sufficient evidence that the bomb making was planned for overpowering the opponents of the MP.

Batting first, Zimbabwe immediately ran into trouble, with their most consistent opener being run out and not being able to flower (couldn't resist, ignore all those puns).

Johnson played on in unfortunate circumstances, and New Zealand were on top right away. A brilliant catch later, Campbell's side were 47 for three in only the 11th over. It needed a captain's knock to correct matters and the captain obliged in the company of Murray Goodwin. The rains dutifully arrived on cue again, and rehabilitation was suspended once again. These sort of rain interruptions, as any batsman would tell you, are good for the cause. Both these teams are lying at the bottom of the totem pole, as far as the quality of assets on view in the Super Six, is concerned. The way they strove manfully to fight the elements, as well as try and fashion an outcome of the match in their favour, boiled down to the most obvious of intentions. The name of the game was attrition.

Allot was again the pick of the New Zealand bowlers. More than any other bowler in this competition, he has the knack for picking up top order batsmen's wickets. Yesterday was no exception either. New Zealand bowled exceedingly well to stay on top. Zimbabwe batted well enough under the circumstances, to keep their nose above the water. New Zealand needed a performance out of the ordinary, if they are to maintain their reputation as dark horses.

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
