

## Reality strikes world champs



PARIS, June 7 (AFP): France returned to their Clairefontaine training ground on Sunday morning

to prepare for Wednesday's Eu-Championship ropean qualifying match with Andorra in Barcelona in the knowledge that their eleven month-long World Cup victory party is finally over.

Saturday night's 3-2 defeat by group four rivals Russia was historic for three reasons. It was France's first at their Stade de France fortress, their first under coach Roger Lemerre and most importantly of all it was their first as World Champions.

It knocked the World Cup winners down to third in their group behind leaders Ukraine and surprise package Iceland while Russia's victory means they can no longer be discounted after a dreadful start to their campaign.

And the realisation is dawning, less than a year after France won the World Cup on home soil, that qualification for the finals in Belgium and Holland next summer is look-

ing precarious. Lemerre said: "The disappointment is huge. It's the first defeat. We must analyse it and start again. We must now go to Barcelona and get three points."

However, France have some tricky fixtures to negotiate. A trip to Kiev to face the highlytalented Ukrainians is just one - they also have a home match with Iceland, who have shown they are no mugs and held the world champions in Reykjavik. A slip-up in their two away matches with also-rans Arme-

nia and Andorra could be fatal. Lemerre, former coach Aime Jacquet's right-hand man during the World Cup, and his players all agreed the Russia defeat was a big setback. The trouble is that no-one could quite agree on the reasons for the capitula-

Some blamed injuries world player of the year Zinedine Zidane and left back Bixente Lizarazu were ruled out. Some journalists blamed Lemerre's tactics. Several players blamed fatigue after a long season in which many French players were involved in chases for honours with their club

But all agreed that being World Champions may have introduced a sense of complacency in the team or, as Christophe Dugarry put it: "We need to learn some humility."

That being said no-one could deny that Russia had played superbly in a thrilling match in which both teams produced intoxicating attacking football and in France's case some uncharacteristically poor defend-

The miserly rearguard that conceded only two goals during the whole World Cup - only one in open play - yielded three to

Vincent Candela had replaced Lizarazu but otherwise it was France 98 lynchpins Lilian Thuram, Laurent Blanc and Marcel Desailly that were run ragged by the Russian frontline in which Alexander Panov and Igor Titov were outstanding.

Panov's first strike came when the whole French defence, goalkeeper Fabien Barthez included, had been outmanoeuvred by some slick Russian passing although a slight deflection off Candela from Titov's cross may have wrongfooted the goalkeeper before Panov pounced.

A freekick from Arsenal midfielder Emmanuel Petit and a brilliant solo effort from Bordeaux striker Sylvain Wiltord put France 2-1 ahead in the sec-

But then the French defence again stood off Panov who had the time and space to lash a fearsome shot past the bald-

## Lippi wants a united Inter

MILAN, June 7: New coach Marcello Lippi outlined a new future for Inter Milan on Monday, calling for bags of team spirit and no primadonnas, re-

ports AFP. Lippi, who won three league titles and the1996 European Cup with Juventus, will get to work next month when the players return from holidays.

Inter have just ended one of their worst seasons in decades, finishing mid-table, out of European football and bereft of any cup silverware. The team was also riven by dissension and cliques, and got through four coaches over the course of the season - all of them failures.

Pegged back by the prolonged tendon trouble suffered by Ronaldo, the ups and downs of Roberto Baggio, Frenchman Youri Djorkaeff and young talent Nicola Ventola, the team found neither harmony nor results.

With the workmanlike Petit and Deschamps in unidfield it was left to Youri Djorkaeff to provide most of the invention for France - he was probably the best player on the night for the

hosts. Deschamps agreed that the defeat might bring the world champions back down to earth with next week being the anniversary of the start of the World Cup the build-up to the Russia match had been very much a retrospective one in the French media.

On Friday Jacquet published his autobiography, rekindling even more nostalgia in France for last summer.

Deschamps admitted: "The domestic seasons are over. We've been talking about parties and celebrating too much. We speak a lot about being world champions but we should be much more self-critical."

Petit blamed too many games, saying: 'We are not used to losing. But it's part of sport. But Russia were a very strong team. The calendar is not an excuse - we must take it on but it is an important factor."

## Agassi steps into history books



PARIS, June 7 (AFP): He's a selfconfessed man of few talents. But when it comes to tennis he's one of the five greatest players of all

After a roller coaster career which has seen him touch nearimpossible heights and plumb desperate depths Andre Agassi achieved tennis immortality in winning the French Open men's singles title on Sunday with a stupendous five-set triumph over Andrei Medvedev.

The win itself was special the flamboyant American achieved it by coming back from two sets down to see off his gutsy Ukrainian opponent 1-6, 2-6, 6-4, 6-3, 6-4 in close on three hours before a spellbound 16,000 Centre Court crowd at

Roland Garros.

The bare scoreline only tells half the story, however, as 29year-old Agassi became only the fifth man in history to win all four Grand Slams.

Agassi was playing in the eighth Grand Slam final of his career and his memorable victory saw him join Donald Budge, Fred Perry, Roy Emerson and Rod Laver — the only other men to have won the Australian Open, the French, Wimbledon and the US Open in their ca-

Uniquely, Agassi achieved them on different surfaces to claim a well-merited place in

the history books. The enormity of the achievement was almost too much for him to drink in, and he burst into tears at the end. "I have very few talents.

have no musical ability, no ear for language. I can't even stand up on roller skates," said Agassi, as he battled to find the words to do his performance

Yet when it comes to tennis, he has talent in abundance. Agassi is only the second person in the Open era to lift all

the Slam crowns. Fittingly, it was the first, Rod Laver, who swept all four titles in 1969, who presented him

with the trophy. Agassi won Wimbledon in 1992, the US Open in 1994 and the Australian Open in 1995 but he arrived at Roland Garros with a shoulder injury which nearly kept him out of the tournament and after spending long months wrestling with his personal demons after sliding out of the rankings top 100 in 1997.

His best tennis suddenly re-turned as he began to believe that the French title that had eluded him despite final appearances in 1990 and 1991 could be his.

The Las Vegas showman said that for two sets against unseeded Medvedev he was an embarrassment as his opponent tore into a two-set lead inside an hour. l was in shock. I was very

embarrassed, really disappointed the final was becoming' a blowout. At that point I was just trying to stay alive," said Agassi as he reflected on his

dreadful start. his own source of inspiration.

Then he dug deep and found "It almost feels like it had nothing to do with me - like it was sheer destiny," said Agassi, who had only twice previously

won a five-setter after losing the first two sets. "I know this will change my life for ever.


"I can honestly go to sleep at night and say I wouldn't give up my career for anybody's. This was the greatest thing I could ever do.

"I'll never forget this. I'm very blessed," he said. "This is the greatest feeling I've ever had on a tennis court and I don't think it's sunk in yet.

"It's been a lot of years since I've had this opportunity and I never thought I would see this day. I always wondered what it would be like to hold this trophy up here. Certainly the accomplishment of winning each Slam speaks for itself."

Agassi gave much of the credit for his renaissance to coach Brad Gilbert, who hammered home during the rain break early in the second set that the American was the more gifted player.

## Graf bids Roland Garros bye

Martina Hingis of Switzerland 4-6, 7-5, 6-2 in a memorable women's final. Hingis, who was booed by the crowd after several controversial incidents, failed in her fifth attempt to win the only Grand Slam which she has yet

to win but vowed that she would be back as a winner in 12 months time. The Swiss 18-year-old was utterly distraught at losing out for the second time in the final

Graf was elated. "It's amazing -- I don't think understand it yet. This is the biggest win I've ever had," said Graf, who won the first of her French crowns in 1987 at the

age of 17. The 29-year-old German, who has bounced back after two injury-plagued years promised. however, that she will compete at Wimbledon -- where she intends to play mixed doubles with former men's champion John McEnroe -- as well as go for an eighth singles crown at the All-England club.

She did not say when she planned to retire.

"That was one of the toughest wins of my career -- and one of the most unexpected," Graf admitted.
