**PM tells Jatiya Sangsad  
Govt firm to crush terrorism**

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday reiterated her government's firm determination to crush terrorism for freeing society from this menace, reports BSS.

"Effective measures are being taken to punish terrorists whichever party they belong to," she said while replying to a question from Dr Rustam Ali Farazi of Jatiya Party in the Jatiya Sangsad.

Describing terrorism as a serious problem, she said terrorists were utilised by the previous governments to fulfil their political end. She said terrorist activities did not start suddenly.

She said terrorism grew up slowly during a long period of absence of unity among the political parties to crush it and also for not taking measures to properly enforce law.

The Prime Minister and Leader of the House said the government has arrested terrorists irrespective of party affiliations after identifying them. She said a large number of top terrorists and criminals were arrested from all districts.

Sheikh Hasina said the government has set up nine new police stations including six in the capital, two university police outposts, 48 highway outposts and 30 investigation centres to combat terrorists.

She said the government also set up 154 police camps to fight the terrorists activities in the south-western region of the country. She said a large number of listed terrorists and convicted persons have been arrested and arms and ammuni-

tions recovered following combing operations by the law enforcing agencies.

Sheikh Hasina said that 5,946 new posts have been created in various ranks in the police department and transports and modern equipment were given to increase efficiency and bring dynamism in the police force.

Sheikh Hasina said that a special dog squad has been formed by importing 25 specially trained dogs from England. Besides, she said, efforts have been made to create social resistance against the terrorists through community policing on the basis of public opinion.

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday told parliament that a five-year long "health and population sector programme" at an estimated cost of Taka 15,314.34 crore is under implementation in Sylhet Division from July 1, 1998.

Replying to a question from Treasury Bench member Mohammad Shahab Uddin, she said that 15 development projects were completed in the last two fiscal years in the division which included construction of a 300-bed girls hostel at Sylhet Osmani Medical College and a diabetic hospital.

Sheikh Hasina said that six individual projects under road and highways division are under implementation including development of Dhaka-Sylhet Road Development Project, construction of Sylhet-Tamabil road, construction of by-pass roads of Sylhet Osmani Airport and Sylhet railway station.

She said that 23 projects un-

der rural institution sector for the development of the Sylhet division during 1998-99 financial year are under implementation while another 23 projects have been approved during 1999-2000 fiscal.

Sheikh Hasina said that 10 projects have been taken up for exploration of natural gas in the Sylhet region. She said that besides the development project to increase tourism facility in Madhavkunda another 18 projects are under implementation in different districts and police stations under Sylhet division.

UNB added: Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina told Parliament the process of constructing Rupsa Bridge over the river Bhairab in Khulna has progressed a lot and actual construction of the bridge will start soon.

Responding to a question from Kazi Shamsur Rahman (Jamaat-Satkhira) during the PM's question-answer session, Hasina said during her trip to Japan she raised the construction of the bridge with her Japanese counterpart. Accordingly a Japanese team came to Bangladesh and conducted a feasibility survey.

The Prime Minister said three designs of the bridge have been submitted to the government. The construction of the bridge having provision of footpath and movement of speedy vehicles will start soon.

She said Rupsa Bridge has got great importance for better communication with Mongla port, which Nepal also want to use for carrying its goods for export and import purpose.

The election will be held from 10.00 am to 1.00 pm and voters can cast their vote in any of the said centres by showing their identity cards.

**Arms smuggling Dhaka-bound passengers face check-up thru' metal detector**

RAJSHAHI, June 8: Police are conducting a thorough check up of all passengers with the help of metal detectors before boarding on Dhaka-bound coaches here to combat increasing arms smuggling, reports UNB.

Under the directive of RMP Commissioner, a team of police led by Acting SI Hashemi is conducting the search from June 4 at the Dhaka Bus Stand here which is under the Shiroil police outpost.

The directive was given on the basis of the report that a section of organised gang is engaged in smuggling the arms into the town here from across the border and carry those to different areas including the capital city.

Meanwhile, local people said the smugglers have already changed their route and tactic of arms smuggling since the introduction of the drive and now board of coaches from other convenient places.

Coastal Belt Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Component is one of the components of the Sector Programme Support of Danida to the Government of Bangladesh. The planned intervention will presently cover 28 thanas located in 8 coastal districts in the regions of greater Noakhali and greater Barisal (i.e., the Districts of Pirojpur, Jhalokati, Barisal, Barguna, Patuakhali, Noakhali, Laksimpur and Feni). The total population of the area is approximately 7.6 million. The objectives of the project component are:

1. Improved behavioral pattern of men, women and children with respect to the use of safe water and sanitary facilities;
2. Increased hygiene awareness, targeting women, men and children;
3. Increased coverage with fully accessible and functional water supply facilities;
4. Increased operation and maintenance capability of the population receiving caretaker training;
5. Strengthened capacity of DPHE/Local Government/NGOs as per their comparative advantages to provide sustainable water supply, sanitation facilities and hygiene promotional to rural populations.

The component will be implemented by a number of actors in accordance with their comparative advantages. DPHE will be the executive agency with regard to implementation of the hardware programme. A national NGO will be overall responsible for development, implementation and management of all software activities related to the component. This NGO will recruit local NGOs working at thana/union level to carry out the planned software activities. The national NGO shall provide input into the development of the capability and behavioral change methodologies of these local NGOs. In addition the selected national NGO has to closely collaborate and coordinate with DPHE, and local government institutions, namely Gram Parishad (to be formed), Union Parishad/ Thana Parishad/ Thana Development Committee, local CBO's, local leaders etc. To achieve the objectives effectively it is prerequisite that software and hardware activities proceed in a harmonized manner.

In view of the above, applications are invited, for pre-qualification, from interested NGOs meeting the following requirements:

1. Must have a head office in Dhaka and field activities in rural Bangladesh, rendering services to a population of minimum 150,000 persons.
2. The NGO's current estimated and last three years consecutive turnover in Bangladesh must be US \$ 10.00 million minimum per annum.
3. The NGO must be willing to designate the core staff as mentioned below, full time to the component:
  - \* One staff based at head office level, holding minimum a Master Degree preferably in Management from a recognised university, (in educational career at least one first class/ division and no 3rd class/division), 15 years work experience at senior management level.
  - \* One gender expert holding Master degree in Social Science and 10 years of experience based at head office, (in educational career no 3rd class/division).
  - \* An auditor with C.A. (inter) with five years experience or M.com in Accounting with 10 years experience.
  - \* Two staff at sub-area office level, holder of Master Degree in Social Science, 10 years work experience at senior level and practical experience of development work at field level.
