Zillur accuses BNP chief of misleading people

LRGD and Cooperatives Minister Zillur Rahman yesterday accused Leader of the Opposition and BNP chief Begum Khaleda Zia of misleading people through "false campaign" as part of her party's "endemic falsehood in an abortive bid to create an artificial issue," reports BSS.

No new taxes have proposed in the budget and it has not triggered any price-hike of essentials as claimed by Begum Zia", he said while speaking at a post-budget discussion arranged by Dhaka Taxes Bar Association at a hotel here.

He added: "The allegation of imposing new taxes is nothing but a campaign of endemic falsehood of BNP. She is trying in vain to create an artificial issue for campaign ignoring the reality and exploiting the people."

Deputy Speaker Abdul Hamid Advocate also spoke at the discussion chaired by the president of the association Mohammad Selim Khan.

The minister termed the proposals of the budget as "realistic and pro-people" saying that it gave high emphasis on the social sector through increased allocation for education, health, industries, poverty alleviation and rural infrastructure.

It reflected a clear guideline and government's commitment for protecting interests of local industries and reforming the tax structure to keep pace with the competitive world trade in view of open market economy."

General secretary of the association, Abdurrahman Shahadat Khan and Advocate Sohrab Hossain, among others, spoke on the occasion.

Pak envoy makes farewell call on Hasina

Pakistan High Commissioner in Dhaka Karim Elahi yesterday made a farewell call on Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina at her Sangsab Bhaban office, reports UNB.

He said during his four and a half years stay in Bangladesh he witnessed a good number of development works and progress attained by Bangladesh in different sectors. "We also saw the successful tackling of devastating floods in the country."

Thanking the outgoing High Commissioner, the PM hoped that the bilateral ties between the two countries would continue to develop further. She also recalled the donation made by Pakistan during the devastating deluge to PM's Relief Fund.

Foreign Secretary Shafiq Sami and Mrs Elahi were present.

Asian envoys to UN briefed on upcoming Dhaka peace confce

The Asian envoys to the United Nations (UN) were briefed by the Permanent Mission of Bangladesh to the UN on June 15 about Asian Parliamentarian Conference for Peace and Cooperation, scheduled in Dhaka from September 2 to 6, a release of the mission in New York received yesterday said, reports BSS.

Secretary of Jatiya Sangsab Secretariat Monzur-e-Molla participated in the briefing as the keynote speaker. He highlighted different objectives of organising such a conference and informed the envoys about its organisational aspects.

It is expected that the conference will provide a forum for Parliamentarians to come closer and exchange views on how they could contribute in furthering an atmosphere of peace in Asia.
