Graf eyeing  
a fitting  
farewell

LONDON, June 18 (AFP): The time to say goodbye is approaching ever nearer for Steffi Graf, but an eighth Wimbledon singles title would cushion the pain just as a sixth French Open crown did less than a fortnight ago at Roland Garros.

A repeat scenario at the All England Club will do Graf very nicely as the German legend bids to set the seal on her extraordinary career.

Emotion hung heavy over Roland Garros when Graf, who celebrated her 30th birthday last Monday, revealed after beating world number one Martina Hingis in the final that she would not return to defend her title.

Graf labelled her triumph on the red clay her greatest-ever Grand Slam win, and that coming from someone who had 21 others with which to compare it.

It was a victory that left her just two short of Margaret Court's all-time record of 24—but Graf, back to her best after two injury-plagued years, isn't obsessed with chasing down every record in the spot.

She has already decided that 16 years of wear and tear are enough, even if she could next year have equalled the all-time record of seven French Open titles held by Chris Evert.

Everything points to her reaching a similar conclusion after her 14th appearance at Wimbledon, where she intends to have fun playing in the mixed doubles alongside former men's champion John McEnroe.

Veteran striker Juan Escarré scored the only goal of the second half to push Spain into the bronze medal playoff with either The Netherlands, England or Pakistan depending on later results.

The match was highlighted by a flurry of four goals in four minutes, sparked by a penalty stroke to Spain's Antonio Iglesias in the 24th minute.

The clock had barely restarted when South Korea's Song Seung-tae finished a brilliant off individual goal for his second of the match and sixth of the tournament.

Jeon Jong-ha converted a penalty stroke a minute later to give South Korea a 3-2 lead but Spain equalised through Pol Amat in the 27th minute and both teams had numerous chances to add to their tally before Escarré's winner in the 62nd minute.

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
