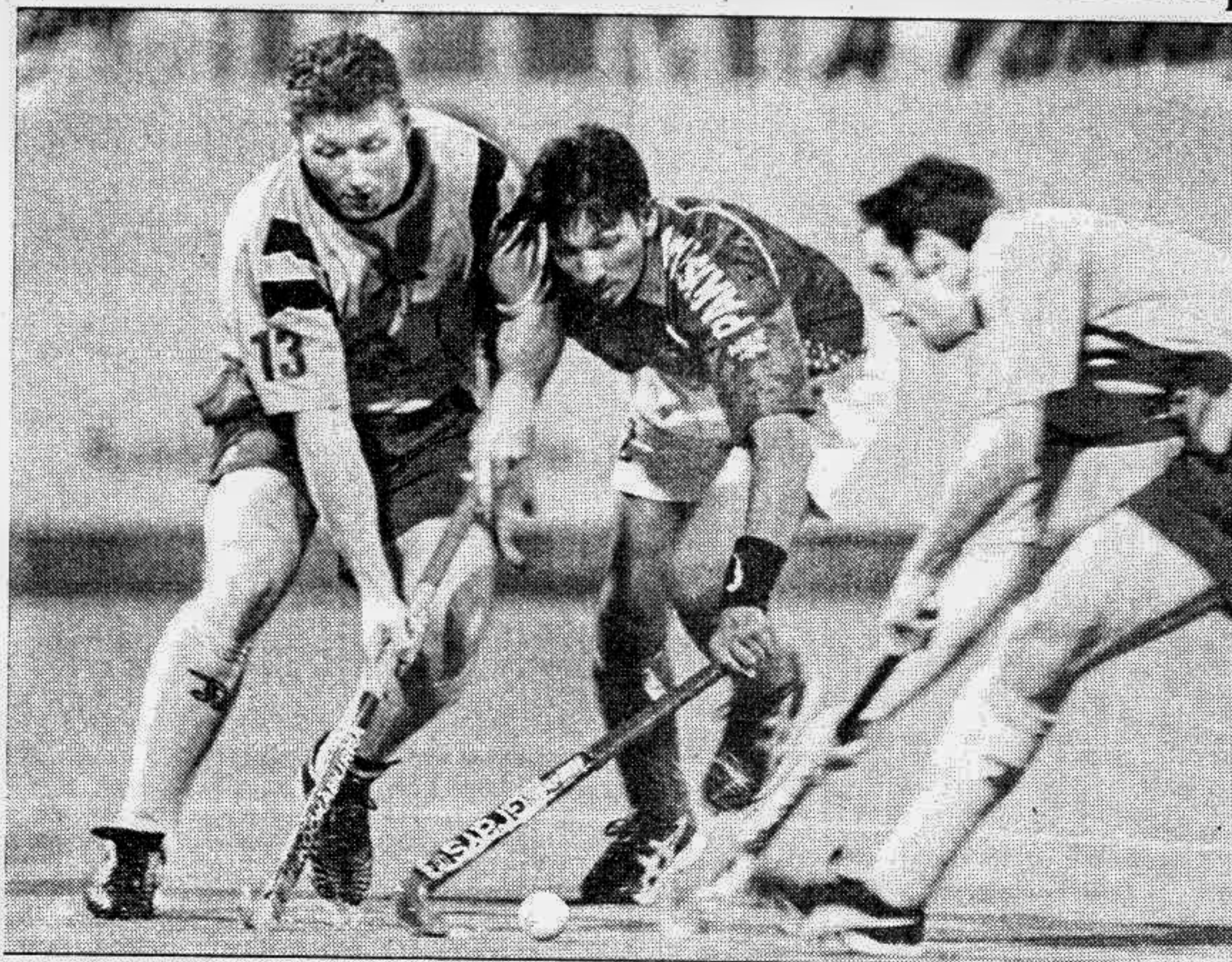

Setback for finalists



BRISBANE, June 18: Champions' Trophy finalists Australia and South Korea both lost their last round-robin matches ahead of Sunday's gold medal playoff in the men's field hockey tournament, reports AP.

The Koreans fell 4-3 to Spain in an exciting match while Australia were beaten 2-1 by Pakistan.

Australia remained in first place on the table after their five matches but the loss will present some concerns to coach Terry Walsh.

Pakistan created the bulk of the scoring opportunities, leading to the only goal of the second half through replacement Haider Hussain.

Australia's only goal came in the eighth minute through Troy Elder before Pakistan equalised eight minutes later with a penalty corner conversion by Sohail Abbas.

Australia rested striker Stephen Davies and his work in the frontline was missed as the home team failed to put away their chances.

"It wasn't up to the mark but there really should be a psychological uplift when you're playing a game where there's no tomorrow," Walsh said.

"There was bound to be some mental flatness no matter how much we tried to avoid it and we did some things reasonably well but the Pakistanis put pressure on and we turned the ball over too often."

South Korean coach Kim Sang-ryul was still smiling despite his team's loss.

Grafeyeing a fitting farewell

LONDON, June 18 (AFP): The time to say goodbye is approaching ever nearer for Steffi Graf — but an eighth Wimbledon singles title would cushion the pain just as a sixth French Open crown did less than a fortnight ago at Roland Garros.

A repeat scenario at the All England Club will do Graf very nicely as the German legend bids to seal the seal on her extraordinary career.

Emotion hung heavy over Roland Garros when Graf, who celebrated her 30th birthday last Monday, revealed after beating world number one Martina Hingis in the final that she would not return to defend her title.

Graf labelled her triumph on the red clay her greatest-ever Grand Slam win, and that coming from someone who had 21 others with which to compare it.

It was a victory that left her just two short of Margaret Court's all-time record of 24 — but Graf, back to her best after two injury-plagued years, isn't obsessed with chasing down every record in the spot.

She has already decided that 16 years of wear and tear are enough, even if she could next year have equalled the all-time record of seven French Open title wins held by Chris Evert.

Everything points to her reaching a similar conclusion after her 14th appearance at Wimbledon, where she intends to have fun playing in the mixed doubles alongside former men's champion John McEnroe.

Kournikova's hopes dashed



EASTBOURNE, England, June 18: France's 1998 Wimbledon finalist Natalie Tauziat at thwarted Russian teen icon Anna Kournikova's hopes of a third WTA final here on Friday as she beat her 6-4, 4-6, 8-6 in a thrilling match, reports AFP.

Tauziat, who at 31 is the oldest player competing regularly on the WTA Tour, looked down and out as her 18-year-old opponent romped to a 5-1 lead in the third set but stormed back to win five games in a row and saved two break points at 6-6.

Tauziat, who is the cousin of France's 1998 World Cup winning captain Didier Deschamps, then claimed a remarkable win with a backhand winner down the line to break Kournikova for a third time in the set.

Gradually however the world number 18, who was elevated to number 17 seed for Wimbledon next week following Thursday's withdrawal of 10th seed Serena Williams, got into her stride and broke back when Tauziat's weak volley found the net, and it looked as though Kournikova was now in charge.

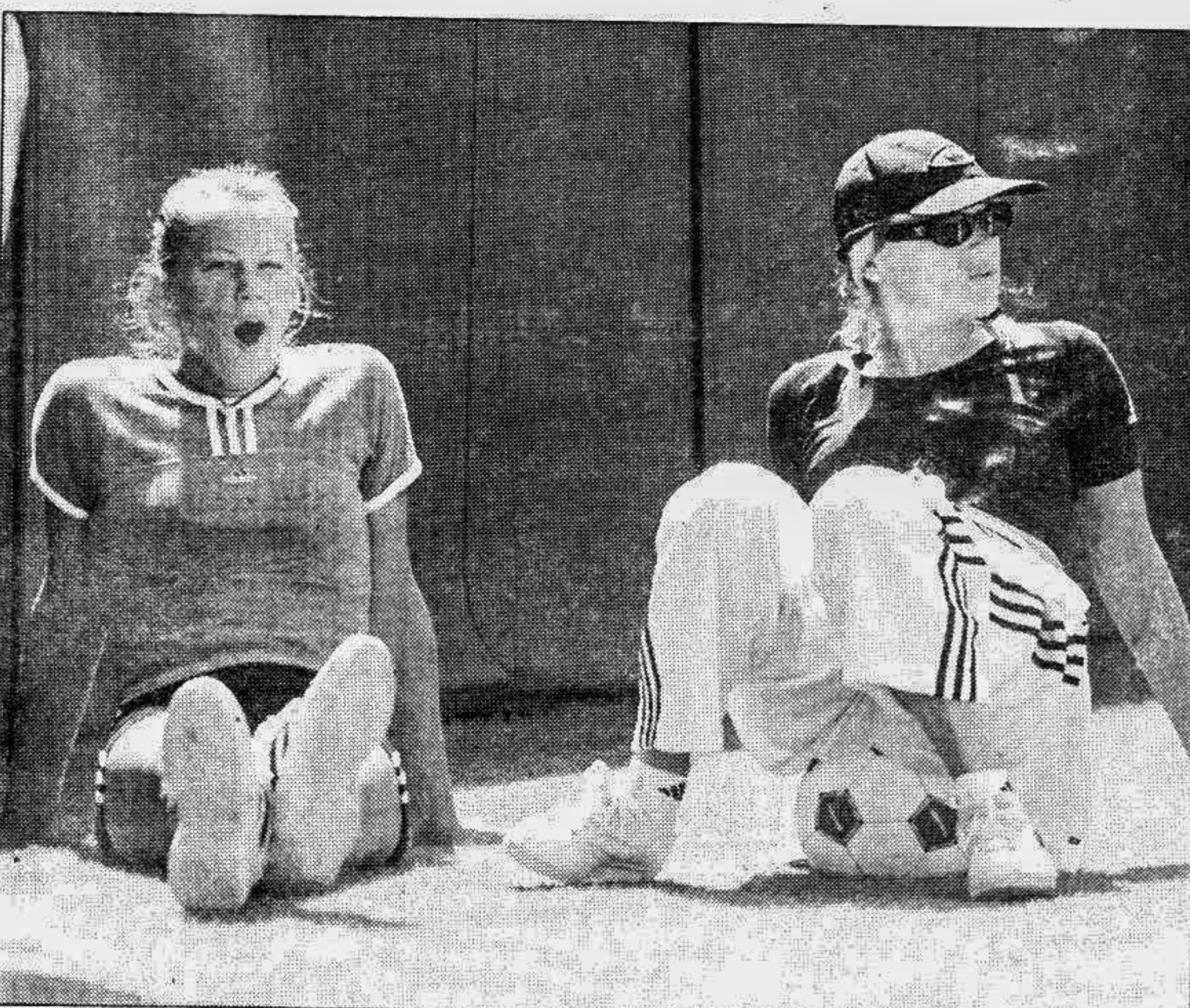
The crucial moment came in

the seventh game however when Tauziat saved two break points to keep her nose in front before breaking to love again in the 10th game to take the set 6-4.

The second set initially followed a similar pattern to the first with Tauziat gaining an early break with a brilliant cross-court return winner.

But this time Tauziat's nerves began to fray at the crucial moment, serving two double faults — the second on break point down — to allow Kournikova to draw level when just two points away from establishing a 4-1 lead.

With the scores then level at 4-4 Tauziat served another double fault and then compounded the error with a wild forehand to gift Kournikova a 5-4 lead, the teenager then serving out to take the set 6-4 and take the match into a deciding set.
