Holmes crushes

Boncrusher Smith

FAYETTEVILLE, North Carolina, June 19: Former heavyweight champion Larry Holmes stopped James "Boncrusher" Smith in the eighth round Friday night as part of the inaugural card of the Legends of Boxing series, reports AP.

Holmes, 49, used powerful jabs to drive the 46-year-old Smith into his corner early in the decisive round. Smith escaped but Holmes trapped him again against the ropes in a neutral corner before Smith motioned to his trainer to stop the fight.

Aussie eves' amazing fifth



BRISBANE, June 19: Australia repulsed a challenge from an improving Netherlands to annex yet another major women's field hockey title with victory in the seventh Champions' Trophy here Saturday, reports AFP.

The Hockeyroos, unbeaten in major tournaments since 1993 and the benchmark in women's hockey under master coach Ric Charlesworth, downed the Dutch 3-2 in a spirited final.

It was Australia's fifth consecutive Champions' Trophy and takes their record under Charlesworth to 165 wins, 20 draws and 23 losses.

Katrina Powell was Australia's hero, scoring in the first 43 seconds and then powering home the winner with 15 minutes left.

"It's a damn good record so far and there's acknowledgement of that, but if you looked at the past six or seven years in women's hockey what's been done by this team is exceptional," said Charlesworth.

"I don't consider our success a burden, the fact that every team is after us means that we very seldom have an easy match, and our opponents are always keenly motivated against us."

That allows us to play a lot of matches at high tempo and high pressure, and that's a good thing.

"There is a big picture, and the bigger picture for us is next year's Olympics, and that's the tournament we would really like to win -- a lot of this is preparatory."

Dutch counterpart Tom van't Hek said there was a "real feeling" that the Netherlands were closer to Australians 15 months out from the Olympics.

"When we get a good preparation and we have to do more on our physical fitness, we now have a real feeling of a realistic chance against Australia at next year's Olympics," he said.

"Australia is of course the best team in the world, the team to beat, but we go back home with a good feeling."

"Until the last half of the second-half we played a real close game, they were then physically stronger, but we have the feeling we are getting closer to them."

"It was difficult for us to play two such great games against Australia in 48 hours."

The world and Olympic

champions were taken all the way by the determined Dutch, who fought back twice from behind, only for Powell to break the deadlock before a 5,500 capacity home crowd.

Australia began explosively and were in front after 43 seconds through Powell.

Nikki Mott passed from the right giving Alyson Annan a powerful strike on goal, but the rebound off goalkeeper Clarina Sinnige ran free for Powell who found the net.

The Dutch were rattled in the opening minutes under the scorching Australian start, but they equalised through Dillianne van den Boogard in the 19th minute off a penalty corner.

Van den Boogard's strike deflected off Lisa Carruthers' foot to beat Australian goalkeeper Rachel Imison.

Australia breached the Dutch defence to lead 2-1 in the 30th minute when Bianca Langham blasted home off a penalty corner.

But with seconds left to half-time the Dutch recoded the Australians, when Karlijn Petri broke free inside the circle and beat Imison at the near post for

a sharply-angled field goal.

Powell broke the deadlock with her second goal in the 55th minute when her reverse stick shot was knocked away by Sinnige only for determined Powell to get to the rebound and find the far corner of the net.

Player of the tournament
Natascha Keller struck three minutes from time to clinch the bronze medal for Germany 1-0 against Argentina.

The 21-year-old Berlin forward, described by her teammates as "a genius" player, smashed home from a cleverly-worked penalty corner for the game's sole goal.

It was Germany's third bronze medal along with two silvers in seven Champions' Trophy tournaments since 1987.

New Zealand beat Korea 3-1 in the play-off for fifth place to qualify for next year's tournament in the Netherlands.

Korea, the 1996 Atlanta Olympic silver medalists but who leave here without winning any of their six games, will be replaced by South Africa in the top-six ranked Champions' Trophy in Amstelveen from May 26-June 4 2000.

Pioline, Ulyett in final

NOTTINGHAM, England, June 19: France's Cedric Pioline beat top seed Greg Rusedski of Britain 6-4, 7-6 here on Friday to reach the final of the ATP Nottingham Open, reports AFP.

Pioline, in good form in an attempt to go one better than his final appearance at Wimbledon two years ago, meets Kevin Ulyett of Zimbabwe, who beat David Prinosil of Germany 7-6, 7-6 in his last four clash.

Rusedski, seeded nine at Wimbledon next week, had hoped to go into the fray as the Nottingham champion, an event he won in 1997 before losing to Pioline in the quarter-finals at Wimbledon.

But he saw his number one weapon, the mighty serve hit 10 double faults -- three of them in a single game -- as unseeded Pioline eased to a 6-4, 7-5 semi-final win in just 75 minutes.

Rusedski, who meets Australian Jason Stoltenberg in the first round at Wimbledon, insisted the defeat was "just a hiccup."

But he admitted: "I've got to get to the practice courts as soon as possible now, hit 1,000 serves a day and work like crazy on it."

"It's just too many double faults to serve in a match and a great player like Cedric is going to take advantage."

"It is a technical thing I've got to put right, not a whole lot of a match-play problem."

"I thought my passing shots were fine and I returned okay but I tried to get in too quickly on my serve. I've been going up too soon and I tried too find the solution by hitting my way out of it."

Tyson-Foreman fight not yet?

NEW YORK, June 19: Mike Tyson's advisor says as far as he's concerned, talk about a Tyson-George Foreman fight is just that -- talk, reports AP.

Shelly Finkel also said Friday that Tyson probably will fight in September or October, Finkel said.

"I asked Foreman to call me and he never did. As far as I'm concerned, it's not real."

Tyson, who has not fought since January, was released from a Maryland jail on May 24 after serving 3 1/2 months for assaulting two motorists.

In his last fight, the former heavyweight champion, trailing on all three cards, knocked out Francois Botha in the fifth round Jan. 16.

Reader's opinion Captain in the World Cup

Chance and bury your luck, if you will, at where Geoffrey Boycott plays poker, because that's only how he might get a new coat before the World Cup is over, or Rameez Raja a better haircut at a barber's who's not an immigrant. Tell that to the winds ... or what cricket is to the native Americans, but more than how close Mehrab Hossain takes to Sean Penn in looks, the revelation in this World Cup is how the captain surfaced little by little.

Point fingers towards Bob Woolmer and Hansie Cronje, albeit incorporated, for unwittingly foreboding, in no pejorative manner, roles that captains are eventually destined to play, at least in ODIs. Psyche up the bowler or admonish the batsman, but stand behind the captain! Excuse me, but where is the captain ... he isn't ... standing, that is. No, he's not yet looking for Bill Purcell of the New York Jets (American football) or Pat Riley of Miami Heat (Basketball) but the likes of him will soon be for the likes of them. World Cup Cricket '99 could have gone on record as the competition with the most gaffes by captains.

Forget the statements short of composure and their match comments, their decisions to bat or bowl after the call of the coin were atrocious at times.

Arguably, the role could be surmised as principally inspirational. Other than that, even the most shrewd captain has been repeatedly underplaying his role as bowler and batsman. Autocratic captains have been known to mar team potential.

Even captains need those priceless seconds between deliveries and overs bowled as rest periods to get a shuteye, think, strategise, read minds and engage the mind over a plethora of options than to wait and prepare for the next delivery or batsman's edge thudding the gloves at 80-something mph. None of the team's success that is achieved, therefore, can be attributed to these captains in the real sense.

Single skill specialists make the best of limited-over games' captains ... which is why Arjuna Ranatunga, Alistair Campbell, Steven Waugh and Wasim

source extraction comes from stretching both man management and imaginative thinking that extra length.

Yet, even the best motivator can flounder. Wasim's public admonishment after losing to South Africa rendered Shoaib "shoal" of his usual fiery self in the game with India. By sharp contrast, Azharuddin's worrying and worrisome looks in the face of an incessant smear campaign reflected a man's woeful state devoid of enthusiasm and confidence that belittled his tract record as captain, top quality batsman and fielder.

But that wasn't the only damage done. Like Alec Stewart, Azharuddin's batting capabilities also suffered from the captaincy. Azhar, except for the Pakistan game, and Alec, save for one game, looked like rookies clinging to stay on, never with the stamp of authority that could earn them a regular place in the side, except that of wicketkeeper for Alec.

Wicketkeeper captains who also open the batting in ODIs are a shoddy sight losing control of the game in trying to play multiple roles at the same time. In the end, none of the roles are played. On a number of occasions, Alex Stewart was a sorry sight.

Even captains need those priceless seconds between deliveries and overs bowled as rest periods to get a shuteye, think, strategise, read minds and engage the mind over a plethora of options than to wait and prepare for the next delivery or batsman's edge thudding the gloves at 80-something mph. None of the team's success that is achieved, therefore, can be attributed to these captains in the real sense.

Akram make better captains than most others. However, the adage is generally true and not necessarily a rule of thumb. If it were, Sachin Tendulkar could also have been a good captain ... which is not true. Hansie Cronje was perceived to be a good captain as well. There's no doubting his all round capabilities but not everything can be achieved through brute force.

The captain's role in limited-over games is also being gradually reduced. With immediate replays from multiple angles and analyses that follow, there are many sides to the story of every delivery that can be seen off the field but never on it.

In other words, the game is often perceived better outside the ground than in it by a man titled "captain" who is called upon to think, capitalize, manipulate, strategise, perform, weave and troubleshoot his way through the pitfalls and windfalls that come to or befall him and his teammates.

Isn't this arduous task and the inevitability of inefficiency and ineptness that surrounds it, unnecessary and unavoidable? After all, it is causing disservice to the glorious game.

The game assumes varying degrees of importance in its various stages according to the roles that bowlers and batsmen have to play. It is, after all, too much to ask from one individual to "think" and "act" and simultaneously "direct" others in the different stages of the game. Experts watching as coaches and managers can undeniably comprehend and strategies better.

The fact of the matter is that more than ever before, the role of the captain in limited-over games is being belittled to the point that individual brilliance is being sacrificed and team performance affected.

Surrey overcome Murali



LONDON, June 19: Surrey went back to the top of the English County Championship table on Friday after evading Lancashire's Sri Lankan spin wizard Muralitharan to secure a four-wicket win, reports AFP.

Muralitharan, who was part of the Sri Lankan team that failed to shine in its defence of the World Cup, took 10 wickets in the match, boosting his list of victims to 24 in the four Championship innings he has bowled this season.

Turin will host 2006 Winter Olympics

SEOUL, June 19: The International Olympic Committee on Saturday chose the Italian city of Turin to stage the 2006 Winter Olympics, reports AP.

Turin beat the Swiss resort of Sion in a final ballot of the IOC executive, by 53 votes to 36, according to IOC president Juan Antonio Samaranch announced.

The result was a surprise as the evaluation commission had given the Swiss entry a glowing report and Sion had for long been considered the frontrunner.

Four other cities -- Helsinki, Klagenfurt of Austria, Poprad-Tatry of Slovakia and Zakopane in Poland -- were eliminated by a special 16 member selection panel earlier at the meeting.

But Surrey went into the final day needing just 36 more runs to win and they completed the task without losing any further wickets.

On Thursday Surrey had collapsed from 78 without loss to 121 for six with Muralitharan taking four wickets.

But Darren Bicknell, unbeaten on 24, and former Yorkshire bowler Jonathan Batty (23) held firm as Surrey reached their 157 target within the first hour of play.
