G-8 calls for quick debt rescheduling for Russia

leading industrialised nations and Russia called Sunday on the Paris Club to conclude rapidly a debt rescheduling deal with Russia, as soon as Moscow fulfills criteria set out by the International Monetary Fund, reports AP.

In a communique at a threeday summit, the G-8 said the Paris Club of officials creditors should continue reviewing the issue of Soviet-era debt to support Russia in its efforts to achieve economic stability and

lasting growth. They said this should even-tually allow a broad resolution of the debt issue once Russia has created conditions allowing it to implement a more ambitious

economic reform programme. The G-8 welcomed the recent framework agreements between Russia, the IMF and the World Bank, and they hope that they will be implemented rapidly.

Russian Prime Minister Sergei Stepashin said Saturday that Russia would comply with IMF requirements, despite resistance by the Russian parliament.

The G-8 leaders said they had instructed their personal representatives to follow up and coordinate the G-8's efforts on supporting Russian economic

Stepashin returned from the summit early Sunday to brief President Boris Yeltsin before the Russian leader's departure for the last day of the meeting in Cologne, Germany.

It was clear that while some countries were well prepared to cope with the bug, others were not, he said.

"The United States and Britain are leading in this area. Some have no done enough," Gretschmann said.

Shortcuts made to save memory space in the early days of computers mean that many programmes only have space to insert the last two digits of the year. A shift to the year 2000 would thus be read by old programmes as 1900, causing a malfunction.

Gretschmann said that increasingly now attention would be paid to contingency plans in the event that something did go wrong. One area for attention would be the safety of nuclear power plants in eastern Europe, he added.

The Group of Eight comprises Britain, Canada, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Russia and the United States.

G8 leaders for early WTO entry of China, Russia

COLOGNE, Germany, June 20: Several leaders of The Group of Eight nations yesterday urged the early admission of China and Russia to the World Trade Organisation (WTO), an official in the US delegation to the talks said, reports Reuters.

"A number of the leaders discussed their interest and hope that there would be an early resolution of China's and Russia's accession to the WTO," the US official, who requested anonymity, told reporters.

Talks on China's WTO entry have been suspended since NATO bombed Beijing's Belgrade embassy during the Western alliance's 11-week campaign of air strikes against Yugoslavia.

But Washington has been trying to rebuild bridges over the incident and hopes talks could resume on getting China into the global free trade club.

new oil refinery KUWAIT CITY, June 20: Kuwait Petroleum Corp (KPC) said yesterday it is studying whether to build a new oil refinery to meet the needs of the country's power stations, says

The purpose of the new re-finery would be to meet Kuwait's future needs for fuel oil for existing and future power plants, said KPC acting planning chief Mohammed al-Surayeh, quoted by the official KUNA news

"We have reached a stage where our production is barely covering our fuel needs," he added.

He said KPC and the Kuwait Oil Company (KOC) were conducting a feasibility study into the plan, taking into account the prices of crude oil and its derivatives and possible future

Production at the country's three existing refineries al-Ahmedi, Mina Abdullah and Shuaiba, was 850,000 barrels a day at the beginning of the year, down from 874,000 barrels a day in the 1997/98 financial year, Surayeh said.

The KPC has also carried out a series of studies on bringing the three refineries in line with the latest international specifications and environmental

Iran may allow private banking in free trade

zones

TEHRAN, June 20: A senior legislative body on Saturday approved a bill that would allow Iran's free trade zones to license private banks, state television reported yesterday, says Reuters.

The television said Iran's Expediency Council, the highest legislative body in Iran chaired by former President Akbar Hashemi Rafsanjani, in soon expected to discuss the details of the law, part of a broad package of more liberal laws under consideration to attract foreign investment.

The report did not says whether the law would allow foreign private banks to be incorporated at the free zones.

À separate vote on measures to guarantee foreign investment against state seizure and allow insurance firms into the country's three free trade areas is also expected.

The proposed legislation is part of a larger package which calls for the Iranian rial to float against other currencies in the trade zones rather than adhere to the strict exchange rate controls of the rest of Iran. The zones include the Gulf islands of Qeshm and Kish and the southeastern port of Chahbahar on the sea of Oman.
