



From Croquet Club to Open Era

# Wimbledon begins today




lawns of The All England Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club, in south-west of London. Incidentally it will be the 106th championships for the ladies. The championships moved to its present site at Church Road in 1922. Though the All England Croquet Club was founded on 23 July. 1868, lawn tennis was first played at The Club in 1875, when one lawn was set aside for the purpose.

In 1877 the club was re-titled The All England Croquet and Lawn Tennis Club and signalled this change of name by instituting the first Lawn Tennis Championship — a Gentlemen's Singles event. A new code of laws, hitherto administered by the Marylebone Cricket Club, was drawn up for the meeting. which was held on July 9, 10, 11, 12 and 19. An entrance fee of one guinea was paid by the 22 players who entered the event. Spencer Gore became champion and won first prize, value 12 guineas, plus a Silver Challenge Cup to the value of 25 guineas, presented by the Proprietors of 'The Field'. The second prize was to the value of seven guineas and the third prize to the value of three guineas. One hundred and eighty balls were used during the meeting. Two

hundred spectators paid one shilling each to watch the final round. A selected few, about 30 in number, were accommodated with seats in a three-tier stand, erected for the occasion. The Championships remained suspended between 1915-1918 and again between 1940-1945 for the two world wars.

Times have changed, so have many other things. But tradi-


Graf and Pete Sampras — return

## Parishad earned a facile 4-1 Eastbourne Zvereva's



EASTBOURNE. England, June 20: Natasha Zvereva lost the first nine games before

scoring a 0-6, 7-5, 6-3 over Nathalie Tauziat on Saturday to win Eastbourne grasscourt championship. reports AP.

In a summer that is becoming known for its comeback matches, the sixth seed from Belarus won her first title since

In the semifinals she staged another comeback, saving three match points against Amanda Coetzer in the longest match on the WTA Tour this season while

Tauziat came back from 5-1 down in the third to beat Anna

Kournikova. With Zvereva exhausted after having endured a three and a half hour marathon on Friday, it was expected that she might struggle to offer any real competition for Tauziat. So it was little surprise that the third seeded Frenchwoman tied up the opening set in just 16 minutes, conceding only eight

points. Zvereva looked sluggish and failed to find her range, while her French opponent serve and

volleyed to perfection. But just as spectators were doubting whether Zvereva could

even last 30 minutes and were

recalling her French Open final of 1988 when she lost 6-0, 6-0 to Steffi Graf, she hauled herself into the match and finally began to put some weight into her shots.

Tauziat offered her a window of opportunity by double-faulting to give Zvereva a break point, and she promptly broke for 3-1. Cutting her errors dramatically, while Tauziat began to miss the mark with some of her volleys, Zvereva finally started to compete on equal

Although Tauziat served for victory at 5-4, Zvereva not only levelled at 5-5, but broke her again for the set.

### Return of the Mac

LONDON, June 20 (AFP): Wimbledon had better watch out this year -- John McEnroe is back and raring to go at the tournament where he burst onto the international tennis stage over 22 years ago.

As a qualifier in 1977, McEnroe's raw talent carried him to the semifinals and three singles titles followed at the start of the 1980s from the player famous for his wiry hair and on-court confrontations with the officials.

Now, aged 40, the one-time Superbrat is back, taking part in the mixed doubles with seven-time women's singles winner Steffi Graf at this year's championships.

"Okay so mixed doubles doesn't normally grab the headlines but the partnership of John McEnroe and Steffi Graf might stir a little bit of interest," the American said. "Obviously the girl needs help. I'll see what I can do."

McEnroe says he was particularly attracted by the chance of competing in the final Wimbledon of the Millennium.

"I have a sense something magical will happen at the final Wimbledon of the century. For a start I'm back, better watch out," he wrote in the Sunday Telegraph.

McEnroe added: "It will be nice to get a game there myself for the last time in 1999. It has a certain ring to it. I haven't played Wimbledon since 1992 and haven't played mixed doubles since 1978."

Now an established commentator with American television network NBC McEnroe says he is privileged to have the chance to play alongside 30-year-old Graf, who may be making her last appearance in the singles here.

"Steffi will have plenty to occupy her with the singles but I'm flattered to be given this opportunity to play. She is one of the goddesses of modern tennis, one of the greatest athletes this sport has seen -and she wants to play with me!" he said.

## Rafter past semis

DEN BOSCH, Netherlands, June 20: Patrick Rafter, the Australian star preparing for Wimbledon, powered his way through to the Heineken Trophy grass final on Saturday and will face surprise entry Andrei Pavel of Romania, reports AP.

Pavel, number 66 in the ATP ranking, eliminated fourth seed Karol Kucera of Slovakia in the semi-finals 7-6, 2-6, 6-3 after claiming a first set tie break.

Rafter now appears prepared to clinch the trophy for the second year running after he swiftly ousted fifth seed Tommy Haas of Germany in two sets. Rafter was in top form, defeating 21-year-old Haas 6-2, 7-5. He ranks number two at Wimbledon, trailing behind American Pete Sampras. Earlier on Saturday, Ameri-

can Kristina Brandi clinched her first WTA title at the women's main event in Den Bosch. Brandi, another surprise finalist, took home her 27,000 dollars cash prized after beating Silvija Talaja of Croatia. Brandi, number 57 in the

world ranking, earned her firstever Women Tennis Association grass tournament title after she defeated second-seeded Dominique van Roost of Belgium on Thursday.

The American eventually claimed the title 6-0, 3-6, 6-1 from the world's number 57 who's poor service may well have cost her first place. Neither of the two women had ever played, let alone won, as WTA match.

## Hosts, Brazil on fire



EAST RUTHERF-ORD, New Jersey, June 20 (Reuters/AFP): The largest crowd ever to attend a

men's sporting event watched Mia Hamm lead the United States to a 3-0 victory over Denmark in the opening match of the 1999 Women's World Cup soccer tournament.

Hamm scored one goal and created another in a festive atmosphere at Giants Stadium packed by 78,972 fans, which also exceeded the best attendance figures for any sports event at the venue, including men's World Cup matches in 1994. Only a visit by Pope John Paul II in 1995 attracted a larger crowd to the football stadium.

"This is something you dream about. This crowd was absolutely unbelievable," enthused Hamm, who extended her own world record with her 110th career international

In the day's second match. Brazil crushed Mexico 7-1.

Hamm scored a brilliant goal in the 17th minute, beating goalkeeper Dorthe Larsen from 10 meters after Brandi Chastain set her up with a long ball.

Hamm later set up Julie Foudy's six-meter shot in the 73rd minute before leaving with leg cramps in the 88th minute. One minute later, Krishtine Lilly closed out the scoring.

"Mia was awesome," said US coach Tony DiCicco, whose team takes on Nigeria in Chicago in its second Group A match Thursday. "It's just the beginning. We can't get too overjoyed yet.

The US, favoured to win the championship, needed to shake off some opening day nerves before taking control. "The first half was a little

rough. We had a lot of jitters on the field," Hamm said. "In the second half, we started playing our style, starting possessing the ball. In Brazil's Group B rout,

Pretinha and Sissi each

recorded hattricks. Pretinha started and ended the scoring for Brazil with goals in the 3rd, 12th and 90th minutes. Sissi tallied in the 29th, 42nd and 50th minutes.

Katia Da Silva converted a penalty kick in the 35th minute for the other Brazil goal. Maribel Dominguez scored Mexico's lone goal in the 10th minute.

'We were a little nervous. We will improve in our next game, promised Brazil's coach Wilson. Midfielder Liu Ailing scored in the 68th minute to rally China past Sweden 2-1 at San

Jose in their Group D opener. The Swedes took a 1-0 lead scored when veteran Kristen Bengtsson, 29, kicked the ball into the corner of the net in the second minute, the secondfastest goal in the history of the event.

Sweden set the mark by scoring in the opening minute eight years ago against Japan.

China equalized in the 17th minute with midfielder Liu Ying guiding the ball perfectly from a corner and finding forward Jin Yan, who headed it past goalkeeper Ulrika Karls-

men's competition after a decade of spectacular failure and it claimed the men's and women's double as the two competitions were played at the same venue for the first time. Australia's women's team, the Olympic champions, beat the Netherlands 3-2 on Saturday. The tournament has been

marred by complaints over a new rule on foot contact and Pakistan, who were eliminated from the six-nation competition for the first time in the tournament's 21-year history, had been most vocal. The rule was aimed at speed-

ing up action, which it has, but players have argued that it makes the game too physically demanding and restricts goalscoring possibilities. There was little sign of the

second concern in Sunday's Davies and Troy Elder matches with 18 goals in three games. England secured their place in next year's tournament with a 4-3 overtime defeat of Pakistan and the Netherlands took bronze with a 5-2 thumping of Spain. Pakistan officials were

adamant that the new rule was biased against their team because most of their goals come from penalty corners. So there was some irony

about the goal which sent them out of next year's tournament at the expense of Germany, coming from James Wallis off a penalty corner in the ninth minute of extra time.
