

Vigo by Atletico Madrid. Mallorca and Valencia now go into the second qualifying


round for the Champions League.

# Agassi fixes his target



WIMBLEDON, England, June 21 (AP): Despite what Andre Agassi once claimed in a commercial, his im-

age is no longer everything. Recent results support Agassi's reputation as one of the game's most talented players. At the French Open two weeks ago, he became just the fifth man to complete a career Grand

Slam. Now comes Wimbledon, where Agassi plays his opening match Tuesday. He'll try to become the first man since Bjorn Borg in 1980 to win the French Open and Wimbledon in the same year.

"It can happen," said Agassi, seeded fourth. "I've stopped telling myself things can't be done.

This could be Agassi's best shot at Wimbledon since he won the tournament for his first major title in 1992.

"Obviously he'd like to join Borg," said Agassi's coach, Brad Gilbert. "That's incredible company. Hopefully his performance in Paris will inspire

With the tournament scheduled to begin today. London oddsmakers listed Agassi as a 16-1 choice.

Agassi's opening match will be against Andrei Pavel, a Romanian ranked 66th. Other potential obstacles:

- A fourth-round rematch against Tommy Haas, who upset Agassi at Wimbledon last

- 1996 champion Krajicek in the quarterfinals.

- Rafter or three-time runner-up Goran Ivanisevic in the

- Sampras, Henman or Rusedski in the final.

Since winning Wimbledon seven years ago, Agassi's career has been like a series of topspin lobs; up and down. He was an unseeded US Open

champion in 1994, rose to the No 1 ranking and then fell to No 141. He failed to reach a Grand Slam quarterfinal for 2 years before winning the French. where he rallied past Andrei Medvedev in the dramatic final. "People lost faith in what I

could do, and understandably so," Agassi said. Now, at 29, he claims to be

playing the best tennis of his

life. And he said this career comeback will be his last. "I have no more energy to go

down and come back up again. he said. "I'm going to ride this one as long as I can. I know I won't have many more years to enjoy this."

Early in his career, Agassi refused to play Wimbledon because of an aversion to grass courts. He has won only one match at the All England Club since 1995 but nonetheless appreciates the unique challenge the tournament presents.
"I have a different appreciation for it now, no question," he said. "You're part of something that seems bigger than the sport."

Curiously, Agassi's recent resurgence coincides with the breakup of his marriage to actress Brooke Shields. The couple remain friends and spoke by telephone daily during the French Open, and Gilbert suggests that personal turmoil contributed to Agassi's renewed focus on tennis.

WIMBLEDON, June 21: Wimbledon's 113th tournament began Monday with sunny skies, mild temperatures and Pete Sampras and Martina Hingis as the top-seeded players, reports

The world's most prestigious tennis tournament has been plagued by rain in recent years. but the forecast was good through Tuesday, with plenty of sunshine expected.

Action began simultaneously on 16 courts. Sampras, a five-time champion, was scheduled to play Scott Draper later in the opening match on

Centre Court. With the tournament scheduled to begin today, London oddsmakers listed Agassi as a 16-1 choice. Those with lower odds included Sampras, Richard Krajicek, Patrick Rafter and two Brits, Tim Hen-

man and Greg Rusedski. Among the women, Hingis was the 6-4 favourite, followed by Steffi Graf, Venus Williams, Lindsay Davenport, Monica Seles and defending champion Jana Novotna.

### Rafter fine tunes

DEN BOSCH, Netherlands. June 21: Second-seeded Patrick Rafter of Australia won Sunday's rain-delayed final of the Heineken Trophy men's grass court tournament by beating unseeded Andrei Pavel of Romania 6-3, 7-6, 6-4.

The match was delayed by more than five hours by torrential rain. Pavel, world-ranked 67th.

began well and broke the twotimes US Open champion's serve in the eighth game. In the second set both players held service and Rafter, number two in the world and

holder of the title, faced match point 6-5 in the tie-break, but held on to won it 9-7. With the Romanian's confi-

dence dented Rafter, one of the Wimbledon favourites, stepped up the pace to take a 5-2 lead. But Pavel fought back to 5-4 before Rafter finished it off on his own service. Both Pavel and Rafter were

travelling by helicopter to London for their start at Wimbledon on Tuesday.

Rafter, seeded second, opens against Italian qualifier Cristiano Caratti while Pavel faces a monumental challenge against fourth-seeded American Andre Agassi, the French Open champion.

## PENPIX OF THE SEEDS

LONDON, June 21 (AFP): Brief portraits of the 1999 Wimbledon women's and men's seeds (prefix in brackets denotes seeding):

WOMEN (1) Martina Hingis (Swi).

Age: 18. The Swiss miss displayed a surprising side to her temperament in the recent French Open final, losing her cool on her way to a defeat against Graf. But the world number one and 1997 champion will still be the one to beat.

(2) Steffi Graf (Ger). 30. Back to her best after her stunning come-from-behind win against Hingis at Roland Garros earlier this month, and now a serious threat to win her eighth All-England title, the last of which was three years

(3) Lindsay Davenport (USA). Hingis' victory in Australia and runner-up berth at Roland Garros has knocked the American off top spot. Needs an improvement on previous best at Wimbledon -- a quarterfinalist twice -- if she is to have any chance of regaining number one ranking.

(4) Monica Seles (USA). 25. Beaten semi-finalist in both Australia and France, but with grass not her favourite surface. the American will do well to reach the last four at Wimbledon -- a feat she has only managed once back in 1992 when she was runner-up.

(5) Jana Novotna (Cze). 30. Became the darling of the centre-court 12 months ago when she finally won the title at her 13th attempt and after two previous final defeats. Having pulled out of Eastbourne this week through injury, will be lacking essential grass court practice, ruining her build-up and hopes of retaining her crown.

(6) Venus Williams (USA). Turns 19 on June 17.

Possesses one of the best. and most powerful, all-round games on the women's circuit, but has only reached one Grand Slam final in her short career to date when she was runner-up in the US Open in 1997. A quarter-finalist last year -losing to winner Jana Novotna -- the American should at least equal that this time. (7) Aranxta Sanchez-Vicario

(Spa). 27. A consistent performer, the three-times French Open champion has the game for all surfaces, which led to her being runner-up in both 1995 and '96 to Graf. But Wimbledon still

eludes the Spaniard, who will be playing in her 13th All-England Championships. (8) Nathalie Tauziat (Fra).

Has come to love grass, although last year's beaten finalist lost her long and proud unbeaten record at Edgbaston at the weekend when defeated in the final. But given her highest seeding for Wimbledon, will be looking to the semi-finals at

least. (9) Mary Pierce (Fra). 24. Lacks the serve-and-volley game to take the title, underlined by the fact the Canadian-born Frenchwoman has been seeded on her previous four appearances -- but with her best showing being in 1996 when she was a quarter-

finalist. (10) Serena Williams (USA).

The younger sister of Venus has quickly risen through the rankings. Injury forced her out of the third round last year when close to victory, so sights will be set high 12 months on, especially given the sisterly rivalry.

(11) Julie Halard-Decugis (Fra). 28. Now a career high in the rankings at 11 after victory at Edgbaston, the Frenchwoman has not played at Wimbledon since 1995, with her previous three appearances all ending in first round defeats. Best Grand Slam showing has been the quarter-finals of both the Australian and French in 1993

and '94 respectively. (12) Amanda Coetzer (Rsa).

Formerly a semi-finalist in both Australia and France in 1997 and a quarter-finalist last year in the US, the South African lacks a true grass court game, with her best performance being in '94 when she reached the fourth round. Four second round exits have since followed.

(13) Sandrine Testud (Fra). Has progressively improved

over the last nine years at Wimbledon, having reached the fourth round on her last two visits. Twice a quarter-finalist, however, in Australia last year and the US Open the year before.

(14) Barbara Schett (Aut). 23. The former Australian Open junior runner-up has crashed out of Wimbledon at the second round stage on the last three occasions. Now seeded, will be aiming for her best performance on grass. (15) Dominque van Roost

(Bel). 26. Broke into the top 10 last year, although has since slipped just outside despite consistent performances in the Grand Slams. The Belgian reached the last eight in Australia in January, and was in the fourth round of Wimbledon 12 months

(16) Natasha Zvereva (Blr).

The Belorussian enjoyed her best Grand Slam performance for a decade last year when reaching the semi-finals at Wimbledon, having been runner-up in France in 1988.

MEN (1) Pete Sampras (USA). Age:

'Pistol Pete' heads into Wimbledon with all guns blazing after his first tournament victory of the year at Queen's. With his love of grass, the American world number one now has his sixth All England title in his sights. (2) Pat Rafter (Aus). 26.

Despite being an aggressive serve-volleyer, the US Open champion for the last two years has never been beyond the last 16 at Wimbledon, so much will be expected of the Australian on this occasion. (3) Yevgeny Kafelnikov (Rus).

The Australian Open champion lost his world number one ranking this week to Sampras, but has still enjoyed a hugely-impressive year so far. Will be looking to

improve on his best showing of

the last eight in 1995 (1911) (4) Andre Agassi (USA). 29. The flamboyant American is back on top of his game after his recent French Open triumph. With the spark having returned, and after a no-show and two early defeats in the last three years, Agassi will be hopeful of emulating his 1992 success.

(5) Richard Krajicek (Ned).

The Dutchman and 1996 champion will have high hopes of another impressive showing at his favourite Grand Slam venue. Suffered heartbreaking semi-final defeat last year when beaten 15-13 in the final set to Goran Ivanisevic after losing first two sets. (6) Tim Henman (Gbr). 24.

An excellent showing at Queen's will have given Henman the confidence to at least go one step further than his semi-final defeat to Sampras last year. The home favourite thrives on the pressure and atmosphere generated by Wimbledon. (7) Mark Philippoussis (Aus).

A quarter-finalist in the last two years, the Australian's booming serve is made for grass. Given he is seeded for the first time, wil! be targetting the last four at least.

(8) Todd Martin (U3A). 28. A former two-time semifinalist, Martin's fondness for Wimbledon ensures he is always capable of springing a surprise. Despite being thereor-thereabouts, the American has never quite realised his potential in the Grand Slams.

(9) Greg Rusedski (Gbr). 25. Surprise quarter-final defeat at Queen's has cast a doubt over Rusedski, who clearly has the ideal serve-andvolley game for Wimbledon, but

Garros, has never progressed beyond the second round. (13) Karol Kucera (Svk). 25. Has consistently struggled at Wimbledon on his five previous appearances, not even winning a set in first round exits in 1997 and last year, despite the

Slovakian possessing a good all-round game. (14) Tommy Haas (Ger). 21. The hard-hitting German, who only turned pro in 1996, beat Agassi to reach the third round last season and has the power game which could take him even further this summer. Haas and Kiefer are possible heirs to Boris Becker's throne as the king of men's tennis in

Germany.

(15) Nicolas Kiefer (Ger). 21. The perfect birthday present for Kiefer, who turns 22 on July 5, would be a title triumph on July 4. Kiefer was impressive at the 1998 Australian Open where he reached the quarter-finals. Last year he was knocked out by Krajicek in the third round, but a seed means his toughest matches would not come as

# Paris gets

PARIS, June 21: French hopes of staging the 2003 World Athletics Championships received a significant boost at the weekend when it was claimed that the main rivals to Paris may not have its stadium ready in time, reports Reuters.

Bob Stubbs, head of the National Stadium company charged with the 300 million pounds (478 million dollars) redevelopment of Wembley Stadium in London, said the project would falter unless it received another 50 million pounds (79.7 million dollars) cash injection from government.

"We need to spend at least another 30 million pounds (\$47.8 million) on improving the road and rail network around the venue," Stubbs said.
