**Tk 22.8cr budget of BUET okayed**

The Syndicate of the Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) yesterday approved a Taka 22.80 crore budget for the 1999-2000 fiscal, reports BSS.

The total income of the university has been estimated at Taka 22.50 crore against the expenditure of Taka 22.80 crore with a deficit of Taka 30 lakh.

A BUET press release said of the income, Taka 21.20 crore will come from the University Grants Commission (UGC) as government allocations while Taka 1.30 crore will be generated from the university's own resources.

Of the expenditure, Taka 15 crore has been proposed for the salaries and pensions for teachers, officers and employees. Taka 3.34 crore for educational assistance and Taka 4.46 crore for maintenance and other expenditures.

A meeting of the Syndicate, with Vice-Chancellor Prof Nuruddin Ahmed in the chair, also approved the Taka 22.40 crore revised budget for the 1998-99 financial year with a deficit of Taka 30 lakh.

The meeting urged the UGC to take necessary steps to recover the total deficit of Taka 1.48 crore of the university.

**Dhaka reiterates commitment to disarmament of weapons**

Bangladesh has reiterated its commitment to complete disarmament of weapons of mass destruction for establishing global peace and security, reports UNB.

The commitment was renewed at the 4th session of the Conference of the State Parties to the Convention on the Prohibition of Development, Production, Stockpiling and Use of Chemical Weapons and on their Destruction that began at the Hague on Monday.

Bangladesh Ambassador to the Netherlands Gyas Uddin led the Bangladesh delegation in the session and participated in the general debate, according to message received in the city yesterday.

He urged the signatory states as well as other countries that have not yet ratified the Chemical Weapons Convention to join the CWC regime to promote global peace and security by eliminating the weapons of mass destruction.

The convention, a unique instrument in the field of disarmament, is aimed at eradicating an entire category of weapons including chemical weapons from the earth and prohibiting the production of such weapons in future. The conference will end July 2.

The Bangladesh envoy underscored the need for regional and sub-regional framework for cooperation among the developing countries that are parties to the convention to avail themselves of the benefits that the convention offered for the economic and technological development of the state parties.

**UN team discusses UNDP projects with Khasru**

The visiting UN delegation yesterday discussed with Law Minister Abdul Matin Khasru various UNDP projects in Bangladesh, particularly in the field of human rights, reports UNB.

The delegation led by Assistant Secretary General of United Nations Nay Htun met the minister at a local hotel, said an official handout.

The UN Assistant Secretary General appreciated Bangladesh's commitment to protect and uphold human rights in the country.

Nay Htun also lauded the steps taken by government to establish a National Human Rights Commission in the country.

He praised the official decision to set up a separate National Human Rights Institute to impart training on various aspects of human rights.

Resident Representative of UNDP David Lockwood was present on the occasion.

Hospital sources said two muggers waylaid the interne doctor, Zahangirul Alam Sohel, while he was going to DMCH on feet at about 9:45 pm.

**US embassy clarifies changes in visa processing**

The United States (US) embassy has clarified some changes in procedures for the issuance of non-immigrant visas, reports BSS.

According to a United States Information Service (USIS) press release, from now on every applicant, who appears at the embassy will either be interviewed on that day or be given a specific interview date.

The benefit of this appointment system is that each applicant needs only wait in line once and will be guaranteed an interview date, the USIS said. Passports, application forms and fee receipts will be collected and a token issued indicating the interview date, it added.

According to the new system, travellers will not have to wait until the last minute to obtain visas rather they will have four weeks for their visa interview and plan their travel accordingly.

In the event of an emergency, visa applicants have been advised to send a short fax to 88-37-44 including the name, date of birth, profession, and passport number of all travellers, the nature of the emergency, the reason for and the schedule of travel and provide a contact fax or phone number. The consulate will not accept phone calls asking for expedited service or inquiring about status of the applicant's fax, the press release said.

**Admission to language courses at DU**

Admission to one-year Junior Certificate Course (1999-2000) in different language courses is going on at the Dhaka University's Institute of Modern Languages, reports UNB.

The languages are English (for students of the university only), Bengali (for foreigners only), Chinese, French, German, Japanese, Modern Persian, Russian, Turkish and Korean, says a press release.

Minimum qualification for admission is HSC or equivalent with one second division. Classes except for English courses are usually held from 4 pm to 8 pm.


