

Juninho being realistic

MADRID, July 1 (Reuters/Internet): Brazilian midfielder Juninho has given his first indication that he is ready to leave Atletico Madrid.

The Spanish first division club announced this week they are prepared to listen to offers of around 2,500 million pesetas (\$15.5 million) for the player they signed from Middlesbrough two seasons ago.

Juninho, speaking from Sao Paulo in an interview with Spanish sports daily Marca published on Thursday, responded: "I'm not going to stay knowing that the club don't want me."

"In any relationship, if one of the parties isn't happy then you have to break it."

However, Juninho, who came close to moving to Aston Villa midway through last season, said he was in no hurry to sort out his future.

"At the moment I'm on holiday," said the Brazilian. "I'm not thinking about looking for a club. I'm feeling calm and I've still got a contract at Atletico."

Atletico, who finished a disappointing 13th in the Spanish first division last season, paid 12.5 million pounds (\$19.7 million) for Juninho to bring him from Middlesbrough.

After a first season wrecked by a serious ankle injury he was expected to take the playmaker's role last season.

But the 26-year-old showed only flashes of his best form and was dropped by former coach Arrigo Sacchi, who preferred the no-nonsense approach of Spanish international Juan Carlos Valeron.

The return of Radomir Antic -- the man who insisted on his transfer from England -- gave Juninho another chance to impress but his form showed only slight improvement and he had an anonymous game in Atletico's 3-0 Cup final defeat by Valencia last Saturday.

Beware of Moscowites

MOSCOW, July 1 (Reuters): Europe beware. An army comprising hundreds of hard-core Spartak Moscow fans, mostly youngsters aged 14 to 20, have installed fear in many cities across Russia.

St Petersburg and Samara, Volgograd and Sochi, Rostov and Nizhny Novgorod have felt their destructive force in recent years.

Just 11 days ago, between 500 and 600 Spartak fans went on a rampage in Ramenskoye, a small town about 40 km from Moscow, smashing shop and car windows.

Then during a Premier Division match against local Saturn, they fought some 1,000 riot police who were aided by several hundred army troops for almost half an hour, destroying several hundred plastic seats.

Saturn president Nikolai Burlakov was outraged.

Rayo, Sevilla promoted

MADRID, July 1: Rayo Vallecano and Sevilla clinched promotion to the Spanish First Division with comfortable playoff wins on Wednesday, reports Reuters.

Madrid's third team Rayo, leading Extremadura 2-0 from the away leg, scored early in the second half through Portuguese midfielder Tiago and Basque striker Bolo Perez to complete an aggregate 4-0 win.

Sevilla, also leading 2-0 from their first leg against Villarreal, made sure of their place in the top flight with a 1-0 victory. Gabi Moya heading the only goal of the return seven minutes into the second half.

Extremadura and Villarreal go down to the Second Division, joining Tenerife and Salamanca who were relegated directly.

Rayo and Sevilla, both relegated two seasons ago, join already promoted Malaga and Numancia in the First Division.

China, Russia in semis



SAN JOSE, California, July 1 (Reuters/AFP): China and Norway produced convincing quarterfinal victories on Wednesday to set up a semifinal showdown in the women's World Cup soccer tournament.

Pu Wei scored in the 37th minute and Jin Yan added another goal in the 56th to lift China past Russia 2-0. Defending champions Norway defeated Scandinavian rivals Sweden 3-1.

The two sides will face each other in Foxboro, Massachusetts, on July 4 for a place in the July 10 championship match.

After a scoreless first half, Ann Kristin Aarones gave Norway a 1-0 advantage, heading the ball past goalkeeper Ulrika Karlsson in the 51st minute. Seven minutes later Marianne Pattersen doubled the margin and Hege Riise made it 3-0 with a penalty kick in the 72nd minute.

Malin Moström spoiled Norway's shutout bid by scoring Sweden's lone goal a minute

into the injury time.

The other semifinal pairings will be decided Thursday when the host Americans face Germany and Brazil meet Nigeria.

Norway, who lead all nations with 16 goals scored in four matches, reached the semifinals for the third time in as many tournaments.

The Chinese also reached the semifinals in 1995, when they lost 1-0 to Germany. They know there is no margin for error in knockout rounds. Both nations have qualified for the 2000 Olympics in Sydney.

"This is the game of life and death," said China coach Ma Yuanan. "We're not going back to Beijing. We're going to fight to the very last minute. This game was about our techniques, strategies and mental conditioning. This is a game that is very cruel, because any team that loses, goes home."

The Russians, making their Women's World Cup debut, needed 23 minutes to launch a shot and were outshot 25-2. Midfielder Irina Grigorieva recorded both shots, including the only one on goal in injury time.

The overall objective was not to give up too many goals," Russia coach Yuri Bystritsky

said. "It would have been senseless for us to open up the game. These are teams of two different classes. We knew full well that China would pressure us."

Chinese goalkeeper Gao Hong made only one save in her second Cup shutout. The Chinese defense has surrendered only two goals in 360 minutes of play, or half a goal a game.

"I think the Russian team was more nervous than us and they didn't play their best game," Yuanan said. "We realized what their specialties were and our level was higher than the Russian team."

China carried the play in the first half and was rewarded in the 37th minute. Wei coraled a loose ball 40 yards out and blasted a shot that bounced on the turf, got by goalkeeper Svetlana Petko and sneaked inside the left post.

"It wasn't the best shot, but it was pretty good," Wei said. "I was supposed to have passed it back out, but I saw there was a gap in front of me."

China added to the lead in the 56th minute as a free kick by Sun Wen crashed off the right post and bounced right to Yan, who easily tucked it into the net for her third goal of the tournament.

Mexico pip Chile Babes buried by Brazil



ASUNCION, Paraguay, July 1 (AP/Reuters): On a night featuring Group B's dynamic front combinations, Brazil's "AmRo" live up to its billing while Chile's "ZaSa" fizzled and Mexico proved they have a lethal duo to their own.

The second night of the Copa America was a party with a distinctly Brazilian flavor. Brazil's prized soccer ingredients of art and flair were on full display Wednesday night as the defending tournament champions trounced Venezuela 7-0.

Earlier, Luis Hernandez's second-half goal proved the difference as Mexico beat Chile 1-0.

BRAZIL-VENEZUELA

Brazil exhausted an upstart Venezuelan defence with a dizzying array of individual moves, one-two combinations, and soft touches around the goal area.

The "AmRo" tandem of Ronaldo and Amoroso each scored two goals. Even more, Ronaldo seemed back to his old form after months with a nagging knee injury, showing his trademark speed and off-the-ball explosiveness.

New Brazilian coach Wanderley Luxemburgo couldn't help but like what he saw in his

team's opening match. "The boys looked very determined," he said. "My players had speed and played with focus, beauty and energy."

To start things off, Ronaldo surged ahead of several Venezuelan defenders in the 26th minute, punching in a Cafu pass. Emerson followed up with a header five minutes later.

Ronaldo's counterpart Amoroso made it 3-0 in the 55th minute with a softly placed ball to the corner. Eight

81st minute and just when Venezuela thought it could not get any worse Rivaldo made it 7-0.

It was the perfect start, with Luxemburgo insisting it was just the sort of win they needed before facing Mexico.

"It was very important we played as well as we did. Mexico will not be easy," said the coach.

Brazil's win has all but booked them a place in the quarterfinals.

ASUNCION, July 1: Argentine coach Marcelo Bielsa defended the star players absent from his Copa America squad on Wednesday, saying they had "good excuses," reports Reuters.

Italian-based Juan Veron, Hernan Crespo, Matias Almeyda, Jose Chamot, Roberto Sensi and Gabriel Batistuta and Spanish based Fernando Redondo have all asked not to play in Paraguay.

Their claims of tiredness or injury caused controversy back home and angered former greats such as Diego Maradona and Oscar Ruggeri, who said they never turned down the national team.

But Bielsa, whose priority clearly lies with the 2002 World Cup qualifiers which began next year, has accepted their requests after a tough European season.

"The motives for which they are not here are all good excuses," said Bielsa.

It is the second successive Copa America to which Argentine have brought a weakened squad.

This time, the 14-times champions are looking to the likes of Martin Palermo, a prolific scorer for domestic champions Boca Juniors, who has yet to have an extended run at international level, and Jose Luis Calderon.

Calderon was a late call-up after finishing this year's championship as top scorer with 17 goals for Independiente.

minutes later, Ronaldo also used a gentle touch to beat Venezuelan goalkeeper Reny Vega.

But it was 19-year-old Ronaldinho, Portuguese for "little Ronaldo," who came away with the night's most spectacular goal.

Mexico took control after the break following a fast but scrappy first half. Blanco, who had already tested Ramirez with a long-range free kick before halftime, headed against the Chilean crossbar shortly before setting up the winner.

The only worry for Mexico, one of two teams from outside of South America invited to take part in the competition, was the performance of goalkeeper Jorge Campos who looked Shaky under the bar.

DD to see it out at Chelsea

LONDON, July 1 (Reuters/Internet): French World Cup-winning captain Didier Deschamps expects to serve out his top-flight soccer career with Chelsea.

The midfielder also gently rebuffed his compatriot Eric Cantona and set himself up as a target for Manchester United fans next season by saying he would not have wanted to play for the European champions or live in the north.

"I think yes, I have three or four years left to play at top level," Deschamps, 30, told a news conference on Thursday at the Stamford Bridge ground when asked whether he intended to stay at Chelsea to the end of his career.

"I'm not someone who moves around a lot," said the player who spent the first six years of his career at Nantes and most recently five seasons at Italian club Juventus before signing for his new west London club last month for \$4.77 million.

"I think I'll do my three years at Chelsea," he said, speaking in French but promising to learn English.

Deschamps has won just about everything he could have won in the last 15 years, his ca-

reer culminating in the World Cup victory at the Stade de France in Paris last summer.

France's most capped player with 85 appearances, he has won the European Cup twice -- with Marseille and Juventus -- and the French and Italian league titles.

He said that his main ambi-

tion for next season was to help Chelsea, who are in the qualifying stages for the Champions League, to win the domestic championship for the first time since 1955 rather than any European titles.

Deschamps had been linked to Monaco before he signed a three-year contract with Chelsea, managed by friend and former Juventus team mate Gianluca Vialli and with French World Cup team mates Marcel Desailly and Franck Leboeuf already in the squad.

"I came here because I think it will be easier to win with Chelsea than with Monaco," he said.

Married, and with a three-year-old son Dylan, Deschamps also contributed towards Britain's north-south divide by stressing that he had only wanted to play for a London club.

But the player, whose solid distribution and firm determination in midfield led former Juventus coach Marcello Lippi to list him as one of the players he would never sell, said there was nothing pejorative about the description.

"Being a water carrier is not a negative thing. I've never sought the spotlight," he said.
