Oscar Film Week '99 ends

Oscar film week '99 ended yesterday with a call to establish a film institute in the country to create a congenial atmosphere to make good quality films, reports BSS.

Dhaka University Film Society (DUFS) organised the festival, which screened 21 Oscar-winning films to hundreds of viewers at a moderate charge.

Professor A A M S Arefin Siddique, Chief Moderator of DUFS, said, at least 14,000 viewers from different parts of the country gathered in the public library auditorium here to enjoy the films defying erratic monsoon weather.

The chief moderator observed that Bangladesh lacks a film institute where the young film entrepreneurs can equip themselves with proper training on various sub-disciplines of film industry.

He said though film is a thriving industry across the world, yet our country lacks necessary facilities for producing quality films.

Film producer Kabir Anwar said it is encouraging that people of all ages have shown keen interest attending sessions on classical films. But he observed that necessary technological and intellectual ingenuity are apparently lacking due to scarcity of talents and investors who are determined to produce quality films.

'Science' publishes BRAC's work on arsenic testing

'Science', the prestigious international science journal published by the American Association for the Advancement of Science, has published a report on BRAC's work on arsenic testing in rural Bangladesh, says a press release.

In its issue of June 4, the journal narrated how a field kit was used by the village Shasthya Shebika (health workers) to test the water of tubewells in the village. The article has created a lot of international interest as evidenced by a huge number of e-mail inquiries received by the authors from around the world.

It may be mentioned that BRAC tested all 11,954 tubewells of Hajiganj thana of Chandpur district as well as the 14,000 tubewells sunk in 1998 in other parts of Bangladesh with UNICEF assistance.

BRAC is now working with the Department of Public Health Engineering and UNICEF in two other thanas to test tubewells and different mitigation procedures, and to identify and treat arsenic patients.

CHT law and order situation reviewed

The law and order situation and the system of work of different autonomous organisations working in Chittagong Hill Tracts were reviewed at a meeting held in the city yesterday with Kalpa Ranjan Chakma, Minister of CHT Affairs in the chair, reports BSS.

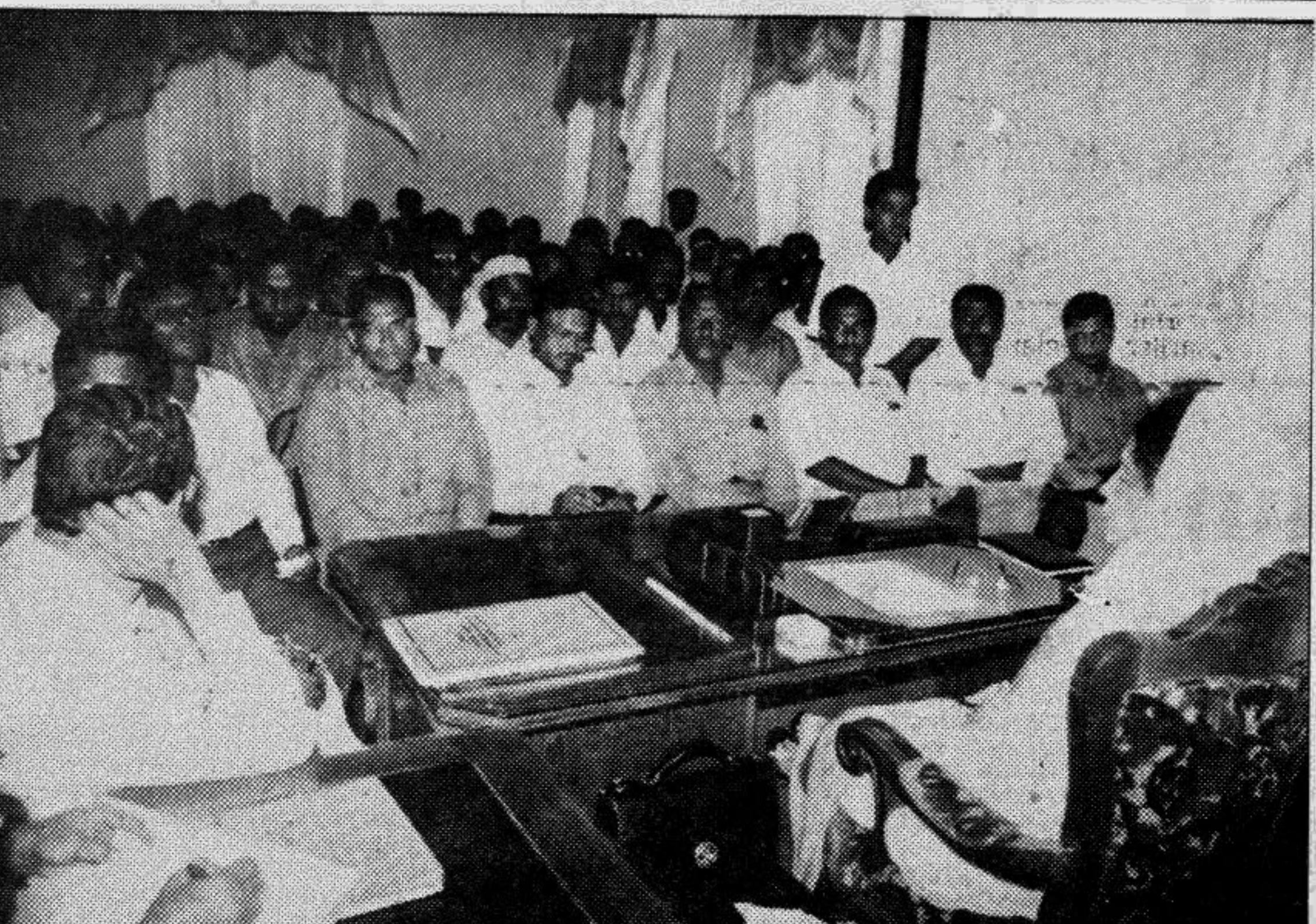
Met office said day temperature may fall by 1-2 degree Celsius over the country during the period.

More emphasis on English in primary education stressed

Instructors of different Primary Training Institutes (PTI) underscored the need for greater emphasis on English language in primary school level and made suggestions for the school teachers yesterday at a workshop at the British Council in the city.

A team of 15 instructors of different PTIs in the country attended English Language Teaching (ELT) courses at the Institute of English Language Education (ILE) in Lancaster University of England in October last year.

The nine-month training course was arranged by the British Council in cooperation with Directorate of Primary

Education of Bangladesh. The project was undertaken by Primary English Resource Centres (PERC) and funded by the Department for International Development, UK.

At the programme the team members delivered a briefing of their training courses regarding use of English in the classroom, interactive way of teaching, coherent lesson planning and more effective use of text books.

They also suggested some changes in the existing module books for the teachers and to translate them into English saying, "There should be a much closer relationship between the content of the modules and the English For Today textbooks."

They emphasised on teaching English through English and not Bengali. "We should explore more interactive ways of teaching other than just classroom lectures," they said.

Among others, Dr Terri Kelly, education advisor, DFID, British High Commission, Dr Simon Kay, deputy director of the British Council, team leader Philip Powell Davis, four Voluntary Services Overseas (VSO) and the instructors were present at the workshop.
