

Still, Luxemburgo has planted the seed of a more selfless philosophy and instilled a unity many thought the team lacked at the World Cup, when they lost 3-0 to France in the final.

Against Mexico, who have repeatedly reached the final four in their recent appearances as a guest in the Copa America, Brazil had their finest game.

Brazil was all over Mexico from the starting whistle. Emerson, Ze Roberto, Ronaldo and Rivaldo took turns testing Mexican goalkeeper Jorge Campos.

Mexico rallied gamely, keeping their promise to carry the attack to Brazil. But the front line of Luis Hernandez and Cuauhtemoc Blanco was unable to penetrate a solid defense, while Brazilians had all the space they needed to work their magic.

This is the start of a work looking ahead to the 2002 World Cup," said Brazilian coach Wanderley Luxemburgo. "Our objective is to form a strong team for the Cup and that plays a soccer that Brazil feels."

At the Copa America, Luxemburgo's first major since taking over from Mario Zagallo last year, Brazil's soccer has been a notch above the rest. The upsets, the tiebreakers, the heroes-for-a-day that have made the tournament a succession of surprises have not touched them.

Uruguay has been the giant-killer of the Copa. Despite bringing a young and inexperienced team at the senior level, they have shown remarkable poise in upsets of Paraguay and Chile and has improved noticeably with each game.

Their trouble is, so have Brazil.

Luxemburgo's group underwent endless changes because of injuries, absendencies and even a disciplinary dispensation right up through the first round. From the starting 11 that played in last year's World Cup, Palash scored the lone goal.
