

Posting, promotion guideline for APBn formulated

A high-level meeting in the city yesterday formulated a guideline for posting and promotion of the Armed Police Battalion (APBn), reports UNB.

The new guideline will facilitate transfer of APBn rank and file to other branches of police — constable after 14 years service, Nayak after 16 years, Havildar after 18 years and Subedar after 24 years.

Home Minister Mohammad Nasim was present at the meeting at the police headquarters. IGP AYB Siddiqui and other senior police officials, including DIG of APBn Moinuddin Chisti, attended the meeting.

During the last 10-12 years, promotion of some Havildars and Subedars were held up due to administrative complexity. The meeting decided to promote them according to seniority.

Promotion and inter-posting facilities are a long-cherished aspiration of APBn members. Last week, they vented their resentment over the matter.


He invented Bone Marrow Biopsy and Aspiration Needle which is being used all over the world.

Six injured in Lalmonirhat

LALMONIRHAT, July 21: A fierce clash between two rival groups in the town today left six people injured, two of them critically, reports UNB.

Seriously injured Alam, 22, and Shahjahan, 24, were rushed to Rangpur Medical College Hospital. Police arrested one Masud in this connection.

The clash was the sequel to Tuesday night's attack on the office of Delta Life Insurance (DLI) at Saptan by some unruly youths.

According to police and witnesses, some youths of Kalibari in the town ransacked DLI office at Saptan for refusing to lend them motorcycle.

Youths of Kalibari and Saptan, armed with lethal weapons, clashed throughout the day today. One group set ablaze the house of a DLI officer and motorcycle of the company.

Riot police were deployed to avert further clashes. Shops and business establishments in the town remained closed since morning.

sider lending and weak management.

According to his report, 33 per cent of the loans given by the private commercial banks (PCBs) had turned classified by the end of 1998. For some banks, the figure was as high as 46 per cent.

On the other hand, the PCBs had a total Tk 1028 crore shortfall in loan provisioning, which showed how vulnerable these banks are in case of emergency, he said.

The governor observed that insider lending was a major problem for the PCBs. The central bank inspection teams have already unearthed a number of such cases in which the directors took loans violating laws, he said.

Most of these loans were taken without adequate collateral and by flouting banking rules, he said. Such practices have weakened the positions of the banks and resulted in loan classification and capital inadequacy, he said.

Of the nine PCBs which were given permission during the 1980s, six became 'trouble banks' as rated by CAMEL rating, the governor said. This rating is based on capital adequacy, management, equity and liquidity situation of a bank.

Although these banks have improved their situation to some extent, most are still suffering from weaknesses, he said.

The governor suggested that at least two more money loan courts be set up in Dhaka for quick disposal of loan default cases.

BSS adds: The Standing Committee suggested division of function between board of directors and chief executive of the private banks.

The committee laid stress on the reforms of banking laws and their proper application.

Presided over by the chairman of the committee Prof Mohammad Ali Ashraf the committee called for expanding the banking services in the light of the free market economy.

The committee stressed the need for regular auditing of the banks to ensure transparency and accountability.

people were homeless due to erosion of Ghagot river, the agency added.

Erosion by southern rivers in Pirojpur also devoured ten villages leaving hundreds homeless. RANGAMATI, July 21: Councillor of Chittagong Hill Tracts Regional Council Mohammad Shafi died of cardiac arrest yesterday at a clinic in Chittagong. He was 58, reports UNB.

One of the dominating members of the Chittagong Hill Tracts Liaison Committee, which served as a bridge between Government and the Parbatya Chittagong Jana Sanghati Samity for settlement of insurgency crisis, Shafi left behind his wife, five sons, one daughter and a host of friends and relatives to mourn his death.

Different organisations and individuals expressed their heart-felt condolence on the sudden demise of Shafi.

In reply, the sources said, the Myanmar minister had reportedly told the Bangladesh President that the Rohingyas would be taken back by the end of this year. "One day I will come myself and take them all."

Myanmar has taken back 22,000 Rohingyas out of some 25,000 since the refugees began crossing the border way back in December 1991.

Sikder told the conference that the government responded quickly and general manager Abdul Muqit Chowdhury was released Tuesday night and the factory gate was opened the following morning.

Meanwhile, some teachers of the Ispahani Girls School and College, which is located close to the factory, told The Daily Star that Iqbal had come to the spot on Tuesday at the request of the school authorities to solve a dispute with the owner of the factory building.

The factory building is going through an extension work. The extended part hangs above the school premises. This construction work is responsible for injuring many guardians and staff because various materials like brick, wood, corrugated tin shed, slabs and glass often fall on the school premises," said a teacher requesting anonymity.

The teachers said that the school authorities complained several times to the owner of the building about the matter but he did not pay attention.

They said the students were preparing for a demonstration against the owner of the building, but they postponed it later at the request of Iqbal who is the chairman of the governing body.

Iqbal came with local people and ordered all present in the building to leave. But there was no vandalism, the teachers claimed.

WB to provide \$33m for 4th fisheries project
