Sex workers slam

Expressing deep concern over the failure of the rehabilitation of Kandupatti she said, "under the existing situation of our society the profession of prostitution could not be stopped through eviction or rehabilitation. Instead they will spread widely in different parts of the country, creating more problems than the existing one."

Referring to the street urchins who are selling flowers, waters at different parts of the city, Sahnaz, president of Durjoy, floating sex worker's organisation said, "these children are in a vulnerable situation. They will be forced to adopt prostitution as profession at any time in order to maintain their daily life."

The authorities should take measures to check poor and under privileged girls into prostitution instead of evicting the settled sex workers from their respective places," Sahnaz said.

"We are not begging on the street, we are earning money through body, if needed we are ready to pay income tax for our flesh trading," she further said.

"Shoot us if we are going to live we are not doing harm to any body," she said.

She said: "Rehabilitate those men who come to us, we need no rehabilitation, we want to give better education for our children as they can live sophisticated life in future."

Momtaz Begum, a sex worker evicted from the Kandupatti brothel, "Many people including a section of corrupt so-called social elite are using us at night, but in the morning they pretend to be very pious people," she alleged adding "the leaders of the society are curbing our freedom and we are even deprived of the basic rights to be buried through religious rituals."

She said "society will not accept us. What the government will give us? who is going to marry us?"

She also called for legal action against the pimps, who were forcing girls to become a prostitute.

Sex workers urged the Prime Minister to understand their problem and to take an effective measures to end the crisis.

Helaluddin, President of Human Rights Council said definitely there is some politics behind this eviction.

"Please do not make them scapegoat of politics," he said. He alleged that the authorities are violating basic human rights of the inmates of the red-light areas by putting restriction on their movement.

Helaluddin informed the rally. Hundreds of inmates of the red-light areas at Tanbazar and nearby Nimtoli are passing their days in near starvation amid fears of eviction. The brothel inmates are running out of money and short of necessary resource to ensure two square meals for them along with their dependents.

Mahbuba Begum, leader of the women and children urged the government to take proper steps to rehabilitate the women and their children dependents of Tanbazar and Nimtoli before evicting them.

A eight-point demand of the sex workers were raised at the rally. This includes: inclusion of sex workers and human rights representatives in all future plan for rehabilitation, withdrawal of all imposition e.g. deployment of police at the red-light area, which is like vi-

olation of fundamental human rights, withdrawal of all imposed government steps including withdrawal of police deployed at the brothel premises, demanding publication of a white paper on the present situation of evicted sex workers of Kandupatti, who were uprooted from the brothel three years back, they demanded educational and health facilities for the children of sex workers, implementation of previous government pledge to rehabilitate the children of sex workers, effective steps to save minor girls have been passing days in uncertainty, to take effective measures to save those girls who had been forced in prostitution, immediate trial and exemplary punishment of the persons responsible for killing of sex worker Farida, Mala and Jesmine, to eliminate all obstacles for burial of sex workers and to ensure their burial after their death.

Later, sex workers brought out a procession chanting slogans against their eviction move, which paraded different streets and ended at the Jatiya Press Club.

method of crop production.

Intermittent irrigation of rice is another technique. Instead of keeping the fields flooded continuously, soil is irrigated, allowed to nearly dry out and then irrigated again.

Better weed management, land leveling and minimizing cracks on lands can also substantially contribute in saving water, an e-mailed IIRI report said.

Meanwhile, contrary to popular concern about fall of groundwater table, other strong versions are there.

According to a 1994 USAID report, "Groundwater Revolution in Bangladesh in the 1980s was a key stimulant to rapid agricultural growth in the 1980s and early 1990s. Nearly 1.5 million hectares were newly irrigated after 1980, in significant part from installation of shallow tubewells spurred by deregulation of tubewell imports."

It noted that although localised problems of groundwater mining have occurred, in most areas in Bangladesh there remains significant scope for further expansion of groundwater within the bounds of natural recharge.

A 1998 report of Compartmentalisation Pilot Project (FAP-20) said "irreversible mining did not occur" despite large scale expansion of dry season irrigation by shallow and deep tube wells.

PM's call to free nation from curse of illiteracy

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday sought cooperation from educated people, public representatives and NGO workers to free the nation from the curse of illiteracy and turn her huge population into human resources, reports UNB.

"Development of human resources is the first and foremost condition for building up a prosperous country. Population can be made the asset of the country by appropriate education," she said addressing the distribution ceremony of UNESCO Literacy Award 1998 at the ICC this afternoon.

The Primary and Mass Education Division of the Education Ministry got the UNESCO Literacy Award 1998 for outstanding performance in increasing the literacy rate of the country. The country's literacy rate has been increased to 56 per cent from 47 per cent in last three years.

UNESCO Country Director Dr Asgar Ali Khan handed over the award to the Prime Minister, and the Prime Minister handed it over to Education

Minister A S H K Sadique. The award included a certificate, a medal and a cheque for US Dollar 15,000 (Tk 742,500).

Education Minister A S H K Sadique, State Minister for Primary and Mass Education Division Satish Chandra Roy and Education Secretary Dr Sadat Hossain also addressed the function. Dr Asgar Ali Khan read out the citation of UNESCO Literacy Award given to Bangladesh.

In the same function, the Prime Minister distributed the National Literacy Award 1998 among different individuals and institutions for increasing the literacy rate.

The Prime Minister said successful education system is the root of the economic development of many countries of Asia. Development programme in those countries have been successfully implemented by way of attachment of top priority to the education and necessary investment thereto.

She said there is a close linkage between education and poverty alleviation, between education and health and fam-

ily welfare. In other words, education is closely linked up with all the fields of development.

The present Awami League government has taken education as a weapon for poverty alleviation and is implementing 80 development projects towards this goal, she added.

Hasina said, "We have taken initiative to organise a silent education revolution in the country by associating people's representatives and local administration in the over all literacy movement."

For this purpose, she said the government has ensured active participation and accountability of local administration and local government institutions.

"Given the combined support and cooperation of the people of all strata, voluntary organisations, and workers associated with nation building activities at government and private levels, we will be able to make ours a literacy-free country within 2006," she said urging all to come forward to accomplish this noble task.

2 abducted businessmen rescued in Ctg

CHITTAGONG, July 22: Detectives of Chittagong Metropolitan Police (CMP) rescued two abducted businessmen from a colony at East Nasirabad under Panchlaish thana last night and arrested one of the abductors along with a gun and four bullets.

Police said Abdul Hakim, 35, and Abdus Sabur, 42, were kidnapped at gunpoint from South Shitalpur under Sitakunda thana on Sunday.

Police quoting family sources said the kidnappers demanded Tk two lakh from Hakim's brother Abdul Salam over a mobile phone.

Acting on a tip-off, the detectives raided Ukler Colony at about 11 pm and rescued the businessmen from a house.

Train dacoity in Sirajganj

SIRAJGANJ, July 22: Armed dacoits swooped on the passengers of a local train and looted valuables worth Tk 2 lakh early today, reports UNB.

Fifteen passengers were also injured in the attack.

Witnesses said the armed gang who were travelling in guise of passengers aboard 553 up Sirajganj-bound train from Ishwardi, attacked the passengers at a place between Jantail and Kaliaharipur stations at about 3 am.

Six of the injured were admitted to Sirajganj Sadar Hospital.

The robbers left the train at Raipur station.

All they need is social commitment to peaceful life

They're back home with hopes to fight their battle of life afresh. A battle that may be easier to them now. Because the six acid burn survivors have been given a better facial look.

Ruma, Nurunnahar, Normita, Khadiza, Monira and Jyotsna returned home on Wednesday after their eight-month treatment in Spain. They all were

All the six girls need follow-up treatment in the country.

Before they underwent treatment abroad, these girls used to use scarves to hide their horrible faces and seldom appeared in public.

All their dreams were shattered following acid thrown on their faces. None even came forward to accept them as better half of life.

help us restore a normal life. I use to cover my face with scarf but it's not needed now, I find my face much better," said Ruma Akhtar, one of the victims.

I never dreamt of getting back my original face. Doctors tried their best. They have transplanted an artificial ear in me. I've the courage, I need your cooperation in my fight

November 1998 after it learnt about them through a BBC and CNN programme broadcast by a Spanish TV channel in February the same year.

The Spanish company representatives said they would visit families of the patients and during their stay here they would select another team of six acid burn survivors for treatment in their country.

"We did everything to create a better facial condition of the patients," said Dr Roberto Molto, one of the Spanish doctors who treated the girls. Dr Molto, however, declined to disclose the expenses for the treatment of the six girls.

Esther Roure, a representative of the Corporation Dermoeestetica, said her company would continue providing such treatment to the Bangladeshi acid burn survivors. But she could not specifically say how long the move would continue. Kazi Fazlur Rahman said his Foundation would work for rehabilitation of the six girls.

Also present at yesterday's press conference were Dr SL Sen, consultant plastic surgeon at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital, who treated the girls earlier, Kazi Fazlur Rahman of the Acid Survivors Foundation that organised the conference, Dr Luna who stayed with the girls during their eight-month treatment in Spain, Foundation Trustee Nasrin Haq and guardians of the acid victims.

Dr Sen told the journalists that the construction of a 15-bed burn patients' hospital would begin near the DMCH next month. DMCH's burn unit, the only of its kind in the country, was not enough to cater to the need for treatment of burn patients. All doctors at the DMCH burn unit have agreed to provide free treatment to the burn patients across the country, Dr Sen announced.

Dr Luna pointed out that the biggest achievement by the girls was the courage to face the real life.

Nasrin Haq stressed the need for punishment to the acid-throwers.
