

Baridhara plot: B Chy's reply

Deputy Leader of the Opposition A Q M Badruddoza Chowdhury yesterday categorically said that he didn't get any plot during any government.

In a reply to the statement of State Minister for Information Abu Sayeed, Chowdhury said that the house at Road No 12, Plot No 19, Block-K, Baridhara was handed over to him by Jatiya Party leader Muhammed Saifur Rahman on June 27, 1984.

Abu Sayeed in his remark had questioned about the ownership of the said house at Baridhara.

The deputy leader said former Jatiya Party MP from Keraniganj Saifur Rahman got the plot from the then DIT or the Dhaka Improvement Trust. "The plot came to me through private ownership," he added.

He thanked a daily (Sangbad) that published the photo of the house with detail address and "To-Let" signboard. "It would attract the probable tenants," Chowdhury said.

The BNP leader also sent to the press a copy of the document of the plot handover.

Mass in memory of Kennedy

NEW YORK: July 23: At the stately 126-year-old church where Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis often found solace, friends and relatives gathered today for a quiet Mass Friday to remember her son John F. Kennedy Jr. and his wife, reported AP.

An invitation-only group of about 350 people, including President Bill Clinton and his family, was expected at the Church of St. Thomas More in Manhattan.

Dr Richard Freeman and his wife, Ann, the stepfather and mother of Carolyn Bessette Kennedy and Lauren Bessette, arrived about 90 minutes before the 11 am (15:00 GMT) memorial, walking quietly into the church. Earlier, a woman clutching a bouquet of white lilies went in. They were among the first mourners to arrive.

Ordinary people filled side-walks nearby, some arriving as early as 4 am for the chance to be with the family in spirit.

Kathleen Sheehan, 51, who attended Robert F Kennedy's 1968 funeral in St. Patrick's Cathedral, came up from Philadelphia with her 24-year-old daughter, Heather. Although stuck behind a police barricade with the church out of view, they were happy about their trip.

will begin the four-day 'launch march' to Barisal from Sadarghat at 9 am. The launch will proceed through Nasnabad, Munshiganj, Gazaria, Chandpur, Barisal, Naichiti, Jhalakati, Hularhat, Morolganj, Inderhat, Banoripara, Uzipur and terminate at Muladi.

Jamaat leaders and activists led by its Ameer Golam Azam will start the march from Bogra on Sunday morning. The Jamaat march will go through Bogra, Sirajganj, Ullahpara, Bera, Pabna, Chapainawabganj before concluding at Shitiganj where the party will organise a public meeting.

The city unit of Jamaat will leave the capital for Bogra at 2 pm today.

IOJ will start its march to Chittagong from Purana Paltan at 10 am. The marchers lead by Moulana Azizul Haq will proceed through Sonargaon, Daudkandi, Comilla, Majidee, Chowmuhoni, Feni and terminate at Laldighi maidan in Chittagong on Monday. It will hold a public meeting there.

A senior leader of BNP, who is a member of the coordination committee for the road march, said at least 500 motor vehicles are likely to form the caravan. However, another leader claimed that number of transports, including jeep, car, micro-bus and bus will not be less than 1000.

BNP Chairperson and Leader of the Opposition in Parliament Khaleda Zia will lead the main road march to Mymensingh before Azampur bus stand at 11 am.

She will address a total of 27 public meetings in seven districts of greater Mymensingh and Gazipur. The districts are: Gazipur, Tangail, Jamalpur, Sherpur, Netrokona, Kishorganj and Mymensingh.

The Flood Forecasting and Warning Centre gave the latest monitoring report stating that overall flood situation in the Brahmaputra, Ganges, Meghna and Southeastern Hill basins would further improve in the next 24 hours to 6 am today.

However, Bhabar Bazar in the Meghna basin was an exception. The Meghna at Bhabar Bazar recorded further rise by 4 cm yesterday and was likely to swell 5 cm in the next 24 hours.

Rivers in the four basins recorded further fall except the Karatua at Panchagarh, the Teesta at Dalia and the Old Brahmaputra at Mymensingh.

The Padma was flowing 3 cm above danger level at Bhagyaluk while the Surma 55 cm at Karnaikhat and 25 cm at Sumamganj and the Kushiyara 53 cm at Amalsidh.

Bullet-injured youngman dies at DMCH

A young man succumbed to his bullet injuries at the Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) in the early hours of yesterday.

The dead was identified as Muktar Hossain, 20, son of Abul Bashar, a resident of Rajab Ali Sardar Road in east Jatrabari, police and hospital sources said.

According to police, Muktar was shot while sleeping inside a room at his relative Liton's house at Muradpur High School Road in the city's Shyampur area Thursday night.

About eight assailants, led by one Ansar, shot Muktar in his chest from outside the room through its window at about 10:15 pm.

Muktar was rushed to DMCH where he succumbed to his injuries at about 3:30 am.

The motive behind the murder could not be known immediately.

The body was handed over to Muktar's family after its autopsy at the DMCH Morgue. None, however, was arrested in connection with the incident till filing of this report last night.

CHITTAGONG, July 23: Kotwali police rescued a girl and arrested two alleged abductors from a house at Bibirhat in Panchalish Thana today, reports UNB.

The arrested were identified as Kajal Buddha, 25, of Suchia village in Chandaish Thana and Kamal Hussain, 32, of Kadurkhil village in Boalkhali Thana.

Police said some terrorists abducted Annie Akther, 12, a class VI student of Kusumkumar Girls' High School, from Baubazar area in the town on July 18 when she was returning home.

Acting on a tip-off, police raided Uttarpura area in Bibirhat and rescued the girl. They also arrested two persons who locked Annie in a rented house there.

Aftershock jolts Maheshkhali: Death toll 5

COX'S BAZAR, July 23: An aftershock jolted offshore island Maheshkhali in the district on midnight Thursday night within 10 hours of an earthquake in the coastal belt that left five dead and scores injured, reports UNB.

Panic spread to the entire coastal belt after the officially confirmed consecutive earthquakes in Chittagong and Cox's Bazar districts, which affected some 25000-30000 people in Maheshkhali.

The body of Jolekha Akter Baby, 6, daughter of Badsha Mia at Mayarapara, was recovered today from the debris of a betel plantation damaged by the first earthquake, raising the death toll to 5.

Three killed in AJM bomb blasts?

NARAYANGANJ, July 23: Three people were killed and at least 15 injured in bomb explosions at the DIB Colony in Adamjee Jute Mills area at around 6:15 pm today, local people quoting witnesses said.

Names of the victims could not be known immediately.

Adamjee Jute Mills sources said roof of the tin-shed house where the explosions took place, was blown off.

The explosions occurred when some 20 people led by Mintoo, son of Awami League-backed workers' union leader and former CBA president Rehanuddin Rehan, were allegedly making bombs.

President of Adamjee Jute Mills CBA Ruhul Amin Sardar told this correspondent over

telephone that people backed by Rehan were involved in the incident.

Police were intercepted while going to the spot. In the mean time, bodies were removed from the place of occurrence, the CBA president said.

He claimed that four people were killed and many others injured in the incident.

Rehanuddin Rehan was not available for comment.

When contacted, Siddhirkhan Officer-in-Charge Saiful Islam admitted that he had heard about the incident of bomb blast, but none was killed. Workers backed by the Jatiya Party workers' union spread the rumour that three people were killed and many injured in the incident, OC said.

Chittagong Port Security inside protected areas tightened

CHITTAGONG, July 23: Authorities have tightened the security inside Chittagong port protected areas with the deployment of additional army, navy and police personnel and port's own securitymen, official sources said.

Besides, joint patrolling inside the port jetties began yesterday and entry was restricted to outsiders.

Unabated incidents of pilferage, looting of goods and illegal toll collection by some outsiders forced the authorities to tighten the security.

Army and police have been posted at all gates of port jetties for round-the-clock vigilance.

Army and navy personnel were deployed at Chittagong port on September 17 last year to supervise unloading of food items.
