Law and order worsens

SHARIATPUR, July 28: The law and order situation in sadar thana may assume a disastrous proportion unless appropriate steps are taken to crack down on the criminals, reports UNB. Locals alleged that murder, robbery, burglary, rape, snatching, mugging and kidnapping have become commonplace in the thana. They accused the police administration of their failure in maintaining law and order. Recently, a police officer has been closed on charge of negligence to his duty.

Bhairab, a ghost town

KISHOREGANJ, July 28: Like many small towns of the country Bhairab riverport has worn a ghost look due to poor roads, drainage system and inadequate streetlights, reports UNB.

Townsmen alleged that they were being deprived of basic civic amenities as the authorities concerned are turning a blind eye to their demands. Criticising the elected representatives, they further alleged that the political leaders are busy making their fortunes. So, they have no time to work for their areas, they said. "When the election comes, they visit us frequently begging votes and they disappear soon after the election," lamented a schoolteacher.

Day labourer electrocuted

JHALAKATHI, July 28: A day labourer was electrocuted at Uttara Kathipara village in Rajapur thana on Sunday, reports UNB.

The victim was identified as Razzak, 25, son of Abdul Aziz Howlader of Subidkhali village in Mirzaganj thana of Patuakhali. Witnesses said Razzak was killed as he came in touch of a live wire while cutting down the branches of a tree to install a tubewell at the house of Kashem Mridha.

Pipe gun recovered

SATKHIRA, July 28: Debbata thana police on Sunday recovered a pipe gun with a live cartridge from village Sesendra under Debbata thana, reports BSS.

Police said acting on a tip-off police led by the officer-in-charge of the thana raided the place and recovered a pipe gun with one round of cartridge from the house of Abu Bakar Mridha.

Two unnatural deaths in Gaibandha

GAIBANDHA, July 28: Two unnatural deaths occurred in two separate incidents in Shaghata thana on July 19.

In first incident Bijoy Majhee, 18, of village Ulla Sonatola committed suicide by taking pesticides following family disagreement. The victim died on way while being shifted to a hospital. In another incident, Milon, 17, of village Daldali drowned while crossing a bridge. He was returning home from his grandfather's house. On way while he was crossing the broken bridge suddenly he fell into deep water and drowned. Body of the victim was recovered the next morning from the roadside ditch.



Brahmanbaria Poura budget

BRAHMANBARIA, July 28: Brahmanbaria Pourasabha approved a Taka 18,21,13,566 budget with an expenditure of Taka 16,13,50,000 for the fiscal year 1999-2000.

The budget shows a surplus in total resources including poura taxes, government revenue, government grant and aid to the tune of Taka 2,07,63,566. 700 landless families yet to get possession of khas land

GAIBANDHA, July 28: Over 700 landless families here are yet to get possession of khas land despite receiving valid lease deed.

The district administration disbursed khas plots among 717 landless families of sadar thana, Fulchari, Gabindaganj, Sunderganj and Shaghata. But till date no step was taken to get possession of the plots. All the plots are now under the possession of local influential land grabbers.

Many of the lease holders of khas lands tried to take posse-

sion of grabbed plots but they could not do anything against the muscle power of grabbers.

Last year one person of Fulchari thana and another of Jumarbari union in Shaghata thana were killed by the supporters of land grabbers when the victims went to take possession of plots.

Two cases were filed in the respective thanas but future of the cases are almost uncertain as the grabbers are active to influence the proceeding of cases.

No measure was taken from the administration concerned to recover the grabbed plots as

yet.

The landless families are 350 families of Moller char union, 29 families of Baljamjhar union, 20 families of Kamrajani union in Gaibandha sadar thana, 47 families of Haripur union in Sunderganj thana, 30 families of Fulchari union in Fulchari thana, 54 families of Salmara union, 86 families of Katabari union in Gobindaganj thana, 33 families of Kachua union, 18 families of Kamalpara union and 60 families of Jumarbari union in Shaghata thana.

Jhenidah phone subscribers not getting proper service

JHENIDAH, July 28: Telephone subscribers of Bangladesh Telephone and Telegraph Board (BTTB) in Jhenidah district are not getting proper service from the state-run phone service provider.

The 1,400 line analogue board installed at the district headquarters is in a dilapidated condition, causing immense suffering to the subscribers in the district.

Subscribers have been suffering a lot as in the peak hour as lines remain dead. Trouble becomes serious when subscribers dial 02 for Dhaka or any other nation wide dialling (NWD) code number. Most of the calls read wrong number, causing financial suffering to the subscribers. Besides, the subscribers can hear only noisy sound.

Moreover, subscribers trunk dialling (STD), NWD and overseas calls booking numbers are not available in Jhenidah district for the last two months, depriving the government of huge revenue income.

At Kaliganj thana headquarters a 600-line phone exchange has been installed. But the subscribers cannot use phones at their convenient times as the

installed. Out of total 13 pairs of cords, only four pairs are not able to meet the demand of huge number of subscribers, compelling the poor subscribers to wait for hours for a call.

Moreover, the boards remain dead whenever power goes off. It is a regular feature.

Local people and subscribers said the sufferings of the subscribers were brought into the notice of Post, Telecom and Home Minister Mohammad Narsim during his recent visit to Shalikupa. But nothing has been done yet in this regard, although the minister assured the local people of taking immediate steps to solve the problems.

The condition of 350-line Kotchandpur and 100-line Moreshpur telephone exchanges and 115-line board of Harijanthan thana headquarters is almost the same.

Besides, 150-line magneto board at Khalispur Bazar under Moreshpur thana, 50-line board at Hat Gopalpur Bazar and 100-line board at Sodhuhati Bazar under Sadar thana have no STD telephones, forcing the subscribers to depend on trunk dialling system, which remains dead for many hours.

Dearth of capital hits fish production in S-W dists

KUSHTIA, July 28: The fish production has declined in the south-western districts due to absence of proper planning, dearth of capital, dispute over ownership of water bodies and complexities in demarcation of khas lands.

Government plan to bring silted ponds and other water bodies under pisciculture has not been implemented, declining the fish output.

At least 52,379 ponds and tanks under Fisheries Department in Kushtia, Jhenidah, Magura, Narail, Jessor, Chaudanga, Meherpur, Khulna, Satkhira and Bagerhat districts are yet to be brought under pisciculture scheme.

Fish worth about Tk 5 crore can be cultivated in these ponds and tanks under extensive pisciculture scheme, source in the Fisheries Department said.

According to the source, there are about 6,375 silted ponds and tanks in Kushtia dis-

trict which can produce an additional 13,000 maunds of fish worth about taka 2,13,07,000. There are about 13,432 silted ponds and tanks in Jhenidah district that can produce 27,000 maunds of additional fish worth about taka 8 crore. The 4,692 silted ponds and tanks in Magura can produce 27,000 maunds of additional fish valued at about Tk 8 crore. Narail can produce 14,000 maunds of additional fish worth about Tk 2,23,00,000. There are 3,000 silted ponds and tanks in Chaudanga that can produce additional 500 maunds of fish.

Besides, a large number of water bodies are yet to be brought under pisciculture in Meherpur, Khulna, Satkhira and Bagerhat districts.


It is further learnt that the Pond Development Act has been

revised to boost the fish production. As per the revised act the deputy commissioners and the thana nizamai officers (TNOs) will serve notices on the owners of the uncultivated silted ponds and tanks to bring the water bodies under pisciculture programme.

If the owners fail to cultivate fish in their water bodies within the specific time, those will be declared acquired. And these water bodies will be handed over to any person or organisation on 20 years term to cultivate fish. The original owners will get the fixed amount of money during the period.


Local people have urged the authorities concerned to apply the Pond Development Act strictly to help expedite the fish production in the country.


Prof Md Abdullah, MP, handing over documents of a flood shelter built in Rajrajeshwar union, Chandpur sadar, by Caritas — a NGO.


Construction work on the Tk 1.93 crore Diabetic Hospital in Jhenidah is almost complete.
