Comfortable six-point lead into super four

Mohammedan flattered

Mohammedan Sporting advanced into the super four with a monumental lead of six points from their nearest rivals when the popular Motijheel outfit recorded a 2-1 win over holders Muktiyoddha in a crucial Keya Premier Football League match at the Bangabandhu National Stadium yesterday.

The black-and-whites could not hope for a better way to finish the first phase when the only unbeaten outfit in the 10-team elite echelon took a 2-0 lead at the breather of an enterprising encounter of the two heavyweights in Dhaka football.

Anwar Hossain, a sensational finding of Mohammedan this year, gave his side a 23rd minute lead, side-footing a Matur low cross from the left. Alfa then demonstrated his class as the country's top marksman when the dark and dapper striker scored the second at the stroke of the short whistle with a beauty of a right-footer.

Nakib tried to emulate Alfa's brilliance when the former national striker came up with a spectacular header in the 69th minute, but that goal was hardly enough for Muktiyoddha to avoid their second successive defeat. Abahani had ended their unbeaten run with a lone-goal victory in the previous match.

The win also exacted a sweet revenge for Mohammedan against Muktiyoddha, who won both their previous Federation Cup meetings.

Hit hard at the start of the season when Mohammedan failed even to make it to the final of the Federation Cup, the all-local Motijheel outfit has had a wonderful run in the league. It was Mohammedan's eighth win against a draw, letting them finish the first phase with 25 points, six points clear of second-placed Muktiyoddha and eight points ahead of their arch-rivals and third-placed

Mohammedan, however, had a nervous start on the day, as Muktiyoddha walked into their last match of the first phase in search of a desperately needed victory. But once Anwar broke the evening's duck from the first positive attack, they never looked behind.

The goal originated from a combined attack down the left flank. Alfa set Motijheel up with a fine through pass and the latter made a great run down the left before releasing a low cross deep inside the Muktiyoddha box. Although the onrushing Anwar had failed to connect with his right foot, the nimble forward eventually managed to get enough meat on the ball with his wrong foot to hoodwink Muktiyoddha's custodian Biplob.

The nervous man under the bar can be held partially responsible for the first goal, but the reserve national goalie had no clue when Alfa released a guided missile from the top of the box, which crashed into the net after hitting the right-foot post.

Stunned by the double blow, Muktiyoddha, who had a disappointing first half, came out firing with a spectacular header in the 69th minute, but that goal was hardly enough for Muktiyoddha to avoid their second successive defeat. Abahani had ended their unbeaten run with a lone-goal victory in the previous match.

The win also exacted a sweet revenge for Mohammedan against Muktiyoddha, who won both their previous Federation Cup meetings.

Masud made a wicked run to break open an offside trap. He was successful in getting hold of Hasan al Mamun's lob on his pet left foot, but he shot miles over the bar with only Ponir at his mercy. 'Super 4' demands supermen

The 'super four' phase of Keya Premier Division Football League will start from Tuesday August 3, Dhaka Metropolis Football League Committee (DMFLC) president Abdur Rahim said yesterday. Although the earlier decision was to begin the 'super four' from August 2, the DMFLC deferred the start for a day because of Monday's hartial called by the opposition parties.

"We have to hand over the Bangabandhu National Stadium to Bangladesh Football Federation (BFF) for the Bangabandhu Cup after August 18. So we have no choice but to make such a tight fixture," said Rahim. He added that the DM-
