#### BADC at a loss

It had said in a report the Zinc Oxy Sulphate fertiliser contained 6.9 per cent lead and 0.05 percent cadmium and that use of this "spurious and poi-sonous" fertiliser could create neurological problem for children and damage kidney. It could also damage soil.

As the rumour spread, hun-dreds of BNP leaders, activists and supporters gathered at the Minto Road residence of the Leader of the Opposition in Parliament and BNP chief Begum Khaleda Zia.

Hearing the "sad news" at about 7:45 pm, Begum Zia can-celled her 54th birthday programme at her official residence and announced at the gathering that Talukdar's namaj-e-janaza would be held at 10 am on Monday. Talukdar is also a former secretary general

# 25 kg explosives seized from Sealdah station

Terrorists planned serial bomb blasts?

NEW DELHI. Aug 16: India sounded an alert today along its border with Bangladesh after seizing a large quantity of ex-plosives from a railway station in the eastern state of West Ben-

gal, reports AFP. The United News of India quoted West Bengal police officials as saying they had recovered 25 kilograms (55 pounds) of explosives in Calcutta's central Sealdah Station.

"Explosives, batteries, fuse wires. . . to trigger serial bomb blasts on three trains bound for Jammu and Kashmir, Himachal Pradesh and Assam have been detected," said a police official. Police said they had stepped up security checks in railway

They also have their eyes trained on the largely-unmanned international border between West Bengal and Bangladesh to check the movement of suspected Pakistanbacked terrorists.

"We conducted a series of raids after getting a tip-off from the Assam police who have also advised us to seal the border." said a senior police official.

Earlier PTI from Calcutta said, in a major haul of RDX materials in the city in recent

times, police today recovered a carton containing about 15kgs of such high explosives, timers, batteries and wires from the bush Number Eight Platform of Eastern Railway's Sealdah

#### Evicted families move to other slums in city

By Staff Correspondent Hundreds of families evicted from slums along the railway tracks from Kamalapur to Moghbazar last week are moving to other slums in the city, resulting in congestion in those and increase in rent of shanties.

About 5,000 slum dwellers were evicted by the government in a sudden move to "free the city from slum-based crimes".

Many of these evicted families are moving to slums at Khilgaon, Agargaon, Rayerbazar, Kamrangirchar and the flood protection embankment from Kalyanpur to Killarmoar.

Asad Mia arrived at a Rayerbazar slum yesterday in a rickshaw van along with his wife and four children aged between two to ten. The van owner charged Tk 100 for carrying the family and their baggage and utensils from Wireless Gate at Moghbazar.

Asad Mia, a roadside pitha seller, said he has rented a shanty at the slum for Tk 250 with the help of his friend. The slum owner has increased the rent by Tk 50 as the demand for accommodation increased.

"Apart from occasional payment to police, I did not have to pay anything for my shanty near the rail gate. Here, the slum owner is charging more rent from the newcomers' he said. Asad came to Dhaka a year ago from a char area in Sirajganj after his abode was washed away by the Jamuna.

Near Rayerbazar kitchen market, workers were busy building shanties. A young man supervising the work said he will build about fifty rooms and rent those. When asked why the

#### 'I met Home Minister & IGP, but no action yet'

Bhola-3 MP alleges

BNP leader Hasizuddin Ahmed MP has urged the government to control terrorist activities, harassment of BNP activists and political persecution in his Bhola-3 constituency Comprising Lalmohan and Tajumuddin thanas.

Addressing a press conference at the Jatiya Press Club yesterday, he said the ruling Awami League backed by local administration created a reign of terror in his constituency through political repression, harassment and filing of false cases against BNP activists and many other innocent people.

He said he was elected to parliament from Bhola-3 five times and there was no false case against any person in the constituency in about 14 years. But the situation turned totally different as soon as Awami League came to power.

Over 100 'false cases' were filed against some 1,200 people during the last three and a half years in Lalmohan thana only and some 100 others were detained. Besides, three BNP activists were killed in the con-

stituency recently but police refused to take cases, he alleged. "The most unfortunate thing in Bhola is that administration officials seem to be more pro

Awami League than the party-men themselves. Officials concerned do not grant bail even in bailable offences. Loots and other crimes take place in the presence of police," the lawmaker further alleged. Citing eight specific incidents, he said miscreants be-

longing to the ruling party threw acid on a girl student of class ten on the night of May 23 as her father, who was elected Chairman of Ramaganj Union Parishad twice, refused to join that party. "I have called this press

conference not for any political cause. I have here to seek justice for the acid victim as police is yet to record any statement from the girl", he said. He also met the Home Minister and the IGP but no action was taken in this regard till now, he added. The victim. Jharna Akhter

### Bangabandhu remembered, murder mourned

Bangladesh Sunday paid glowing tributes to Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, the founder of the state. on the 24th anniversary of his assassination.

This day in 1975, some disgruntled military officers killed the then president, who had led this nation to Liberation less than four earlier, at his Dhanmondi residence in the capital. All his family members at home and many of his close relations were brutally killed on that fateful night.

His two daughters -- Sheikh Hasina, now prime minister, and Sheikh Rehena -- survived the cruel assault. They were aboard at that time.

Since Hasina, eldest of the

late leader's children, took charge as head of government in 1996, the day has been observed as National Mourning

This year, there was a sense of consolation for the people as the trial court gave its verdict in the Bangabandhu murder case on November 8 last year. All 15 convicts were awarded capital punishment, death by firing squad. Through numerous pro-

grammes marking the mourning day, the nation denounced the cruelty of the August 15 killers and took a fresh vow to consolidate democracy against "the politics of killing, coup and conspiracy"


