#### Squatters still occupying SC premises

By Special Correspondent The squatters yesterday continued their occupation of the Supreme Court premises, increasing the number of makeshift homes built with plastic sheets at the sprawling national prayer ground.

Another group remained camped on the pavement in front of the Bailey Road residence of Dr Kamal Hossain, who filed a writ petition chal-lenging the eviction drive with the High Court and secured a court order halting the government move until August 25. The government began the drive on August 12.

Dr Hossain's 'uninvited guests', numbering about 150, sought shelter at his residence at 2am on Saturday, saying that police had expelled from the Dilu Road slum at Maghbazar where they had been living in shelters built with plastic sheet. Dr and Mrs Hossain, away in London, are expected back

home today. The squatters in front of his house declined to say who had guided them to Dr Hossain's residence. One of them, Monir Hossain, said they had heard he was a good person who would provide them a shelter because he was fighting for them.

The squatter story got a new dimension yesterday as the ruling party MP from Lalbagh Haji Selim claimed in a statement that he is the president of the Bangladesh Bastuhara Samity. See Page 12 Col 1

#### Phensidyl recovery 6 RNB personnel suspended in Dhaka, 10 others 'closed' in Ctg

By Staff Correspondent Commandant of Railway Nirapatta Bahini (RNB), Dhaka, Iqbal Hossain, was suspended yesterday along with five RNB personnel while 10 RNB personnel were "closed" in Chittagong, Railway's Eastern Zone headquarters, in connection with Saturday's recovery of 17000 bottles of banned phen-

The others suspended are two inspectors, two havildars and a naik of RNB, police said. A five-member committee, headed by Din Mohammad Additional General Manager of Railway's Eastern Zone, was also formed to investigate into the incident. The committee is scheduled to submit its report to the DG of Railway within fifteen days.

The phensidyl bottles were recovered from two underground tunnels on the premises of the RNB barrack in the city. Police filed a case with Moti-

jheel thana Saturday night accusing 28 terrorists and drug traders including one 'china' who was allegedly leading the drug business in the area after the murder of his boss Khokon.

Police interrogated 23 RNB personnel Saturday in connection with the incident but arrested none of them.

Police officials said they have recommended to the Railway authorities for taking departmental action against "a number of RNB personnel".

## High Court asks govt Remove squatters from court compound

The High Court authorities have asked the government to evacuate the squatting slum dwellers from their compound for the sake of discipline and security at the country's highest

seat of justice, reports UNB. Home Minister Mohammad Nasim admitted the receipt of an official letter from the High Court, which the DMP Commissioner handed him yesterday

The letter stated that many slum dwellers have been assembling on the Supreme Court premises since about 6 pm on August 18 and creating indisci-

"So it's imperative to evict them immediately from the Bangladesh Supreme Court premises," says the petition addressed to the DMP Commissioner on August 19.

The judicial authorities observed the matter should be considered as very important since it involves discipline and security of the court and urged the police administration to take necessary action on an emergency basis.

Reacting to the High Court letter, the Home Minister told newsmen that he received it yesterday morning and referred

it to the Law Ministry and the Attorney General for legal opin-

"I am considering it with utmost importance since the High Court expressed concern and raised the point of discipline and security," Nasim said.

He said it is unwarranted that slum dwellers trespass and raise slums in the Supreme Court grounds, which under no circumstances can be accept-

The Home Minister said that he would have taken immediate action had the letter been issued at any other time. But the High Court Division of the Supreme Court issued an injunction on August 23 on the eviction of slum dwellers.

In view of the High Court injunction, he will have to study whether it would be tantamount to contempt of court or violation of the honourable judges' orders by his ministry or administration if it goes for eviction based on the letter of the High Court Registrar.

"I will have to seek legal counsel from the Ministry of Law" to see if there is any scope to go for action pending the court's embargo, the Home Minister said.



The dawn-to-dusk hartal called by the BNP-led opposi-tion alliance paralysed normal life and economic activities and halted traffic in the capital and elsewhere in the country yesterday, leaving at least 40 people injured in sporadic inci-

dents of violence. The alliance called the nationwide shutdown to protest killing of a party activist at Narayanganj and attacks on opposition demonstrators in different parts of the country during the DC office programme on August 18. The opposition parties, however, claimed that three people were killed in Narayangani.

The second hartal in less than three weeks also came as a sequel to the opposition campaign to protest the government decision to provide corridor facility to India in the name of transshipment". The opposition parties enforced 30-hour hartal on August 2-3.

ping sources said. CFTC, a Singapore based organisation of feeder vessel operators, took the decision about one month ago.

However, few feeder vessel operators reportedly disagreed with the decision, shipping circle sources said.

Chittagong Port authority and Port Users Forum had earlier protested the decision of CFTC terming it irrational, but CFTC did not change its deci-

# films for 2 months

The Radiology and Imaging Department in Dhaka Medical College Hospital has no supply of X-ray films for the past two months, department sources

Most of the doctors at the Out Patient Department (OPD) greatly rely on X-ray images for diagnosis. "We cannot determine the characteristics of injury/disease unless we see X-ray report. We largely depend on Xrays but we are compelled to advise patients to have X-rays done privately. Unfortunately, only a small number of them can afford the expenses," said a senior doctor.

Dr Abdul Matin Khan, Head of Radiology department, admitted that it had no supply of X-ray films for quite some time. He, however, claimed, "We have sufficient films for emergency and indoor patients. We have no problem with this. Only outdoor patients are deprived of the services."

But nurses and attendants of patients said that many of the indoor patients were also being asked to have X-rays done from

outside during office hours. Around 1000 patients on an average seek treatment at the OPD everyday and about one fourth of them require X-ray imaging.

"There are so many patients who cannot even afford a meal but they are also being asked to go outside the hospital to have X-rays done," said a doctor in Neurosurgery department.

Asked why did not the department notify the hospital authorities about possible shortage of X-ray films, Dr Matin Khan replied, "We regularly send requisitions. The authorities are well aware of the problems. But so far I know the hospital store did not get any supply of X-ray films from the Central Medical Stores Depot (CMSD).

The heads of several other departments blamed the hospital authorities for lack of initiative in this regard.

"Why should the hospital, the biggest and the busiest one in the country, suffer for such a simple reason. The authorities See Page 12 Col 8
