Moderately heavy falls is also expected at places over Rajshahi and Chittagong divisions during the period, said the Met office.

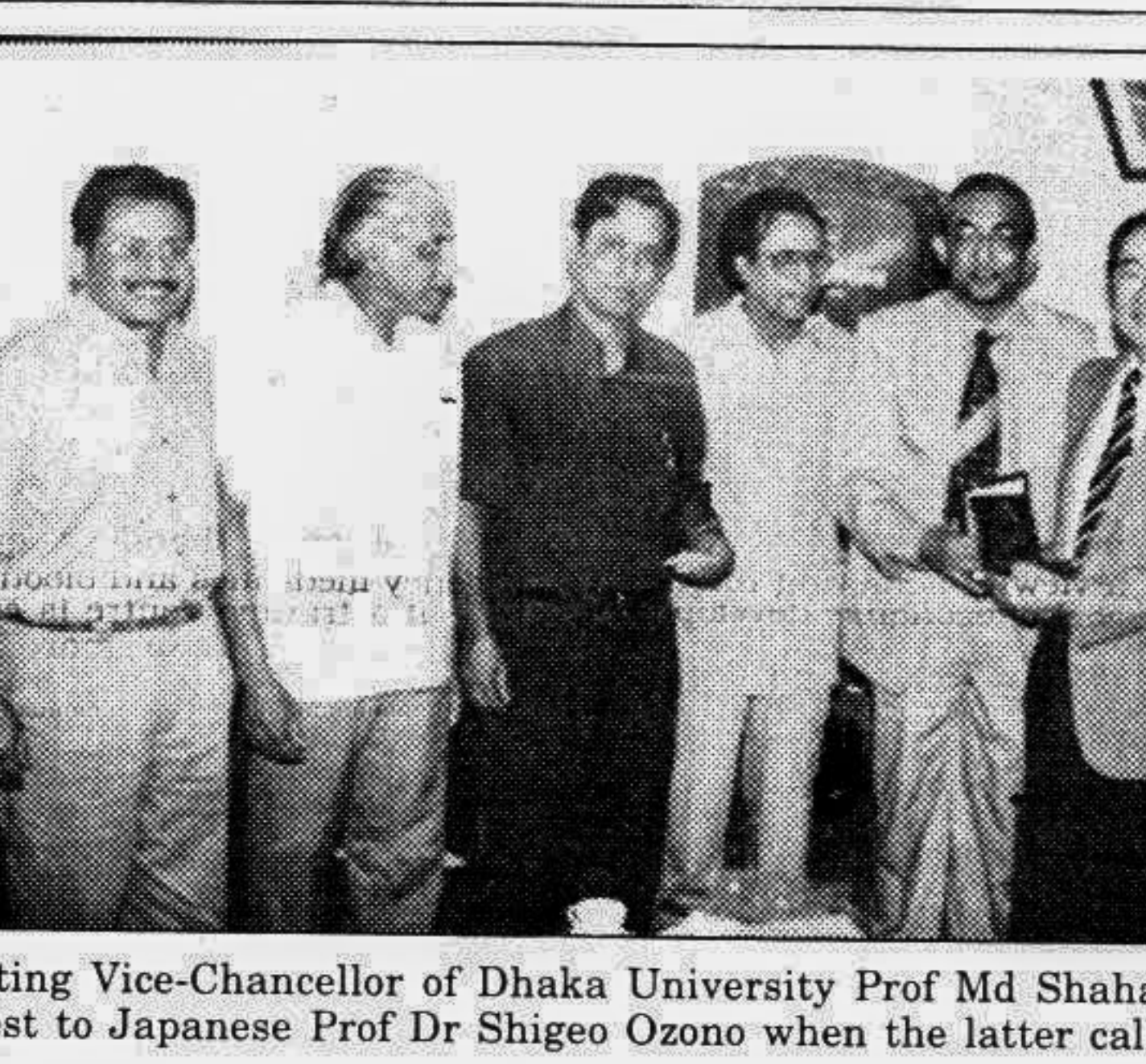
Slight fall in the day temperature is expected over the country, it added.

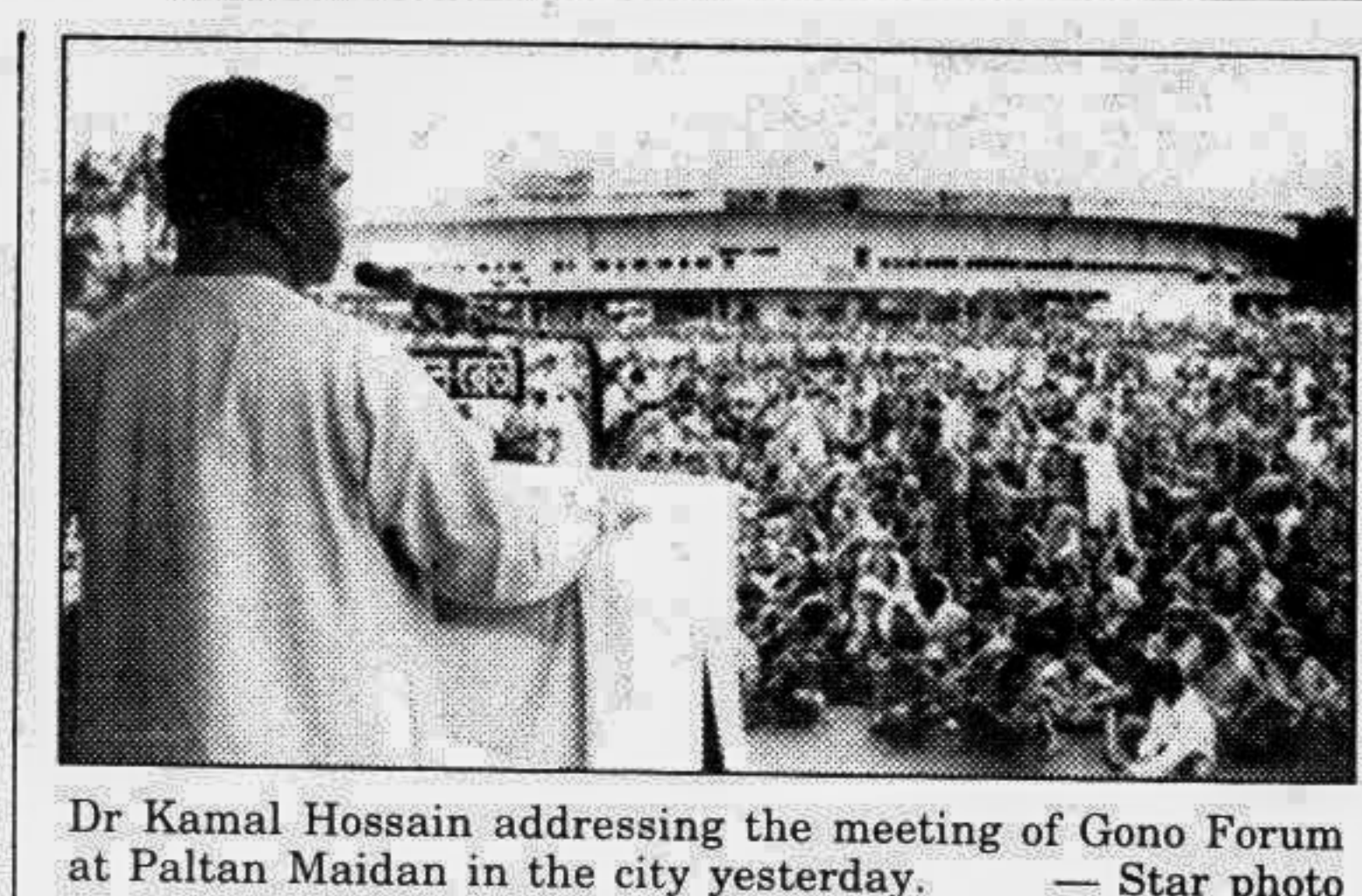

Execution of verdict of Bangabandhu Murder Case demanded

Speakers at a discussion yesterday demanded immediate execution of verdict of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman murder case.

The discussion meeting, organised by Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), was held at the Arts Building (Kala Bhaban) premises of the Dhaka University, marking the National Mourning Day on August 15.

Addressing the programme as the chief guest Mohammad Nasim, Minister for Home Affairs said, "The execution of the verdict is not only the trial of the killers of Bangabandhu but also trial of the war criminals in 1971."

"Justice delayed is justice denied," Golam Sarwar said while addressing the meeting as the special guest.

The speakers also said that the opposition is trying to 'save the killers by a 'deep-rooted conspiracy' to unseat the government.

Nasim also said that the majority of the city people supported the government move of evict slums from the city as the slums were the shelter of the terrorists and drug businessmen.

"Some of the Non Government Organisations (NGO) are denying the eviction as they will lose the foreign aid and donation," he added.

Razzak visits flood-hit areas of C'nawabganj

CHAPAINAWABGANJ, Aug 24: Minister for Water Resources Abdur Razzak visited Tortipur Ghat, 20 kilometre from Chapainawabganj town yesterday to see for himself the erosion affected areas, reports BSS.

He also visited four flood-affected unions under Shibganj. After returning from Tortipur he witnessed the functioning of Morichadava Regulator and the ongoing work of flood protection embankment on the river Mahananda.

Overall flood situation of Chapainawabganj is improving with the recession of flood water of the two rivers — the Mahananda and the Padma.

Rob seeks S'pore investment in fisheries sector

Fisheries and Livestock Minister ASM Abdur Rob has underscored the need for exploring ways to promote the bilateral economic relations between Bangladesh and Singapore, says BSS.

The minister was exchanging views with the visiting Singapore trade delegation at his office here yesterday.

The Singapore High Commissioner highly appreciated the investment incentives of the Government of Bangladesh particularly in the field of direct foreign investment.

The envoy hoped that the business communities of both of the countries would come forward to take effective steps to promote trade and business, especially in the area of food, fish and livestock.

Australian PM to apologise to Aborigines

CANBERRA, Aug 24: Prime Minister John Howard bowed Tuesday to pressure to formally apologise to Australia's so-called stolen generation of Aborigines, saying he would reconsider an apology after all reports AFP.

But he told fellow MPs of his conservative coalition that he would not use the word "sorry."

He said he could accept other wording to express regret about the policy, which the Human Rights Commission said had left tens of thousands of Aboriginal children emotionally or physically scarred.

The commission recommended compensation for the victims in a 1997 report decribing the policy as "genocide", but Canberra is contesting claims for damages currently being heard by the Federal Court in Darwin.

ZAMBOANGA, Philippines, Aug 24: At least three people were believed dead after they were swept away in a series of flashfloods that hit the southern provinces of the Philippines, the military and local officials said Tuesday, reports AFP.

Floods hit Deborok district on the outskirts of this city Sunday, sweeping away homes and a man and woman who were feared dead, military spokesman Major Salih Indanan said.

joining. They have been arguing that they did not violate the constitution, as they did neither resigned from the BNP, nor voted against the party.

However, the controversy went to the Election Commission on August 8 after the Speaker Court had ordered the Speaker to refer the matter to the Commission for a verdict.

The EC asked the contending parties on August 10 to defend their positions in black and white in a week from the date of receipt of the letters. The BNP submitted its reply on August 17, the last date of one-week deadline.

The opposition party argued in the letter that the MPs concerned violated the spirit of the article 70 of the Constitution that categorically bars floor-crossing. It also reiterated its position that the MPs should lose their seats in parliament from the day they had joined the AL government.

But the MPs separately wrote to the Election Commission on August 16 to give them one month for preparing legal arguments. The three-member Commission, headed by Chief Election Commissioner Mohammad Abu Hena, extended the deadline for them to August 24.

The Commission is legally obliged to pass its verdict on the controversial case in 120 days from August 8, the day the Speaker had referred the matter to it.
