#### Akhtaruzzaman not a UCBL director: BB Governor

By Staff Correspondent Akhtaruzzaman Chowdhury Babu is not a director of UCBL from the Bangladesh Bank's point of view and has no legal right to sit in the board, Bangladesh Bank Governor Dr

M Farashuddin said yesterday. "The board headed by Zafar Ahmed Chowdhury is the only legal body representing spon-sors," the Governor told a group of journalists at his office at around 3pm.

Asked why the Bangladesh Bank sent notices to both Chowdhury and Babu, Dr Farashuddin said the central bank had three options: to keep away from doing anything, to send notice to Zafar Ahmed Chowdhury or to serve notice on both Chowdhury and Babu.

#### A decade-old rivalry

Police have been deployed at the residence of Zafar at Kulshi here, fearing attack by support ers of Akhtaruzzaman.

The rivalry between the two 'friends' started over a decade ago, centring leadership of Chittagong Chamber of Commerce and Industry (CCCI) chamber sources said seeking anonymity. Zafar was an aspirant for

the post of CCCI president after expiry of the tenure of Akhtaruzzaman. But he was not supported by Akhtaruzzaman and this angered him. After a few days, Akhtaruz-




