

Anwar Zahid detained for 30 days

BNP leader Anwar Zahid was given a 30-day detention yesterday in connection with Monday's attack on the daily Janakantha office, reports BSS.

The BNP leader was produced before the court of the metropolitan magistrate, Mak-sudur Rahman Patwari, under tight security.

Barrister Khandkar Mahbub Uddin Khokon, Abdur Rejak Khan and Advocate Samauullah Miah moved his bail petition, but the court rejected the prayer and sent him to Dhaka Central Jail.

The court also rejected a remand prayer submitted by police, hearing both sides.

Anwar Zahid was arrested from his new DOHS residence Monday night in connection with three cases filed by the Janakantha authorities with Ramna police.

Our Staff Correspondent adds: Two grocers filed two separate cases with Ramna thana on Monday night accusing Anwar Zahid and the BNP processions of ransacking some shops during the attack on Janakantha.

Meanwhile, one Abdul Latif on behalf of BNP submitted a written allegation at the Ramna thana the same night accusing Liakat, a former Judo League leader, and his accomplices of attacking BNP procession Monday evening.

Ramna thana sources said that police were yet to record the written allegation as a case. But police were investigating the incident, they said.

seats in parliament be declared vacant.

But the two MPs have still been arguing that their conduct does not amount to violation of the Constitution. Speaker Humayun Rashid Chowdhury holds the same view.

However, the controversy went to the Election Commission on August 8 after the Supreme Court had ordered the Speaker to refer the matter to the Commission for a decision.

On August 10, the EC asked the contending parties to defend their positions in writing in a week from the date of receipt of the letters. Replying to the EC on August 17, the BNP re-iterated its original position. The party argued that the MPs should lose their seats in parliament from the day they had joined the AL government.

On August 16, Mohammad Alauddin and Hasibur Rahman sought one-month time from the EC for preparing legal arguments. The Commission extended the deadline for them to August 24. Accordingly, the MPs submitted their replies on Tuesday last. They also maintained their previous position that joining the government did not amount to the violation of the Constitution.

The Commission is legally obliged to give a decision on the matter in 120 days from August 8, the day the Speaker had referred the matter to it.

The meeting adopted a draft agenda for the conference that will consider formation of an organisation, Association of Asian Parliamentarians for Peace, as proposed by Speaker Humayun Rasheed Chowdhury. The proposed organisation will have an executive council comprising a president, a vice president and 12 members.

Replies to a question, the parliament secretary said Opposition members of parliament had participated in the preparatory process of the conference and hoped that they would also join the Asian parliamentarians conference.

Mowla said the conference is intended to create awareness of peace among the peoples of Asia and to mobilise and unite them for the promotion of peace. It will consider ways and means to give a permanent shape to efforts by Asian parliamentarians in this regard, he said.

He said the topics of the conference are: the main reason of war and the culture of peace, institution on human rights and international law, solution to armed conflicts, disarmament and security of people and democracy in Asia.

Participating countries include Indonesia, Malaysia, Kuwait, Sri Lanka, Iraq, Lebanon, Palestine, Pakistan, Qatar, Philippines, Kazakhstan, Nepal, Jordan, South Korea, Singapore, Bhutan, Vietnam, Yemen, China, Laos, Mongolia, Thailand, Saudi Arabia, Cambodia, Tonga, the Maldives and Uzbekistan.



Deadline may be extended 63pc ID cards ready, says EC official

Vendors have so far completed Identity Cards for 63 per cent of the country's six crore voters and only 50 per cent of the voters have been provided with cards.

The deadline for distribution of ID cards to all the voters will expire on September 30. The original deadline was June 30 this year, which was extended.

The Election Commission (EC) is considering a proposal from the vendors to extend the deadline till November 30, sources in the EC said here yesterday.

Till August 22 last, we distributed some three crore ID cards among the voters. Besides, some 78 lakh cards are now ready for distribution," a high official of EC's voters ID card project told the Daily Star.

All the 64 vendors responsible for preparing the cards told the EC authorities concerned on August 29 that they would not be able to complete the job by the September 30 deadline as photographs of 30 per cent of the voters are yet to be taken.

Prime Minister says

Armed Forces to be kept above politics

Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina yesterday said the National Armed Forces would be kept above all political controversies, reports BSS.

The army leadership would be vested in those who are active, conscious, intelligent and have chosen this sacred profession only to serve the country keeping themselves above all partisanship, she said.

The Prime Minister called for selecting capable leadership, who have no political high ambition but would make significant contribution to build up a strong and efficient armed forces to help the government in its development efforts.

Presiding over the meeting of the Selection Board of the Bangladesh Army, the Prime Minister said a strong, disciplined and well-educated armed forces is the symbol of independence of a country. Armed forces are the vanguards of independence and sovereignty and from this realisation the Father of the Nation Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman took steps to build up a strong armed forces.

The Prime Minister said in the past some vested quarters utilised the armed forces for achieving their self-aggrandizement and thus created a difference between the people and the armed forces. But after formation of the government, she said, she re-established the lost glory and image of the armed forces and build up amity between the people and army through involving them in nation building activities.

Turning back to the promotion of the members of the armed forces, Sheikh Hasina said professional efficiency, leadership quality and deep sense of discipline should be the cardinal factors in this regard. Besides, she said honesty, allegiance, faithfulness, physical fitness, faith and allegiance to the War of Independence and freedom of Bangladesh would also be the other main factors for promotion. In addition, seniority, education and social

obligation are also important factors to be evaluated while giving promotion.

The Prime Minister noted with satisfaction that during her government 15 officers were promoted to major general, 60 to brigadier and 101 to the rank of colonel. While giving these promotions the decision of the selection board was given the highest consideration.

She said there are certain rules and regulations in the army which would be strictly followed and every one must have to obey chain of command.

The Prime Minister also highlighted a number of steps her government have taken to develop, expand and modernise the country's armed forces.

Among other things, she

PDB's power generation is around Tk 1.5 per unit. It takes Tk one more per unit for transmission of power to consumers. Since most of the power transmission lines are owned by PDB, the total cost of per unit of power comes to around Tk 2.5.

An Energy Ministry source said, "Power tariff within PDB-DESA-REB should be streamlined as per their actual investment cost."

PDB, the core entity in the country's power sector, is severely affected by financial mismanagement. A total outstanding bill of Tk 2269 crore with PDB till April this year. The amount is equivalent to PDB's 11.4 months' bill. Of the total, government offices owe PDB Tk 111 crore, autonomous bodies Tk 152 crore, private sector Tk 459 crore and DESA Tk 1547 crore.

Recently, in a move to streamline financial affairs in power sector, the government asked all its offices to clear the dues to PDB and DESA.

DESA is not paying PDB its monthly bills since May but has made a chunk payment of Tk 70 crore.

DESA has a system loss of around 26 per cent, PDB 21 per cent and REB 17 per cent. Eight per cent of PDB's system loss is generation, seven per cent is transmission loss and the remaining six per cent is simply stolen. REB's transmission loss is seven per cent and 10 per cent is stolen while DESA's transmission loss is seven per cent and 19 per cent is stolen.

els in the Ganges-Padma system are likely to rise further till 9 am today.

Water levels of some of the rivers in the Meghna and South-eastern hill basins rose and those of some others marked fall.

Out of the 46 water-level measuring stations monitored by the Centre, the major rivers were flowing above danger marks at 12 points, recorded rise at 22 points and fell at 15 points.

In the Brahmaputra basin, the Jamuna was flowing 18 cm above the danger level by 18 cm at Bahadurabad, 28 cm at Sirajganj, and 66 cm at Aricha. The Sitalakhya was flowing 34 cm above the danger level at Narayanganj and Kaliganga was flowing 64 cm above the level at Taraghata.

In the same basin, Dhara was flowing 11 cm above the danger level at Kurigram, the Turag 7 cm above the level at Tongi and the Kaliganga 31 cm above the danger level at Taraghata.

Some vendors will be registered permanently with district level EC offices who will prepare ID cards for new voters, he said.

For this, the EC has a proposed budget of Tk 7.5 crore to cover the expenses from October 1, 1999 to June 30, 2000.

The EC officials concerned are optimistic that the government will disbursed the money from the revenue budget.

ports through our land."

The prime minister ridiculed BNP chief Khaleda Zia's agitation against transhipment move. "The opposition leader is fighting against the action of her own party. Who is it she is fighting against?" she asked.
