

Daei saves Iran

YOKOHAMA, Japan, Sept 9: Former Bayern Munich player Ali Daei scored a sizzling shot from a free kick as Asian Games champions Iran held Japan to a 1-1 draw in a friendly here Wednesday, reports AFP.

The free-kick was awarded after Japanese keeper Yoshikatsu Kawaguchi found himself out of the area after jumping to catch a rebound following a left corner by Mehdi Mahdavi.

Daei, who now plays in the Bundesliga for Hertha Berlin, calmly struck into the left side from just outside the area in the 68th minute.

"It was a difficult match. They have physical strength and experience and a very good forward like Daei," said Japan's head coach Philippe Troussier of France.

"The 1-1 draw was a good score for Japan, because Iran had so many chances to score. We might have been beaten."

Japan bagged a lucky goal only 10 minutes into the match when Daisuke Oku's shot from outside the area hit a defender's leg and went into the Iranian goal.

But a lacklustre first half rather frustrated 35,600 spectators at the Yokohama Stadium -- which will be the venue for the 2002 World Cup final -- with the Japanese hitting only three shots on goal and the Iranians five.

The visitors moved into top gear in the second half and repeatedly threatened the Japanese goal.

Daei's shot from the left hit Naoki Soma and then the left post in the 57th minute while Mahdavi's shot went just wide one minute later. Farhad Majidi narrowly missed a one-on-one battle against Kawaguchi in the 60th.

"My players couldn't move very well in the first half because it was too hot for us. I told them at half time to play more aggressive and they started to move much better," said Iranian coach Mansour Pourhaydari.

McEnroe made skipper

NEW YORK, Sept 9: Former tennis bad boy John McEnroe has gone establishment, taking charge of the United States Davis Cup team with an eye to keeping top stars Pete Sampras and Andre Agassi in the fold, reports AFP.

"Needless to say it's one of the proudest moments of my life," McEnroe said here on Wednesday when the announcement was made at the US Open.

Judy Levering, president of the US Tennis Association, spoke with Sampras, Agassi, Todd Martin and Jim Courier about who they wanted. From a small group of candidates, McEnroe was the man.

"They all said they would like to play for John McEnroe," Levering said.

The consensus at the end of the decision was made.

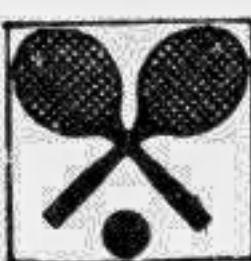
McEnroe replaced Tom Gullickson, a friend of Sampras who had been the US captain since 1994. Gullickson was criticized for his handling of the US team in July's Davis Cup quarterfinal home loss to Australia.

Asked about how far Sampras went in having Gullickson replaced, Levering said:

"I had his blessing on the naming of John, yes."

"Tom skillfully brought Davis Cup to where we are today," Levering said.

Kafelnikov tames Krajicek



NEW YORK, Sept 9: Open champion Yevgeny Kafelnikov overcame a record 48-ace barrage by Richard Krajicek, taking one of his greatest triumphs despite breaking the Dutchman only once in five sets, reports AFP.

Kafelnikov captured a 7-6, 6-3, 6-6, 7-6 victory here Wednesday that ranks with his 1996 French Open and January Melbourne triumphs as the best of his career.

"That match stands together with the matches I have played in the Grand Slam finals. That's a big effort to beat a player like Richard," Kafelnikov said. "I didn't think it was going to be as exciting as it was."

The 25-year-old Russian advanced into a US Open semifinal against second seed Andre Agassi to decide which will replace Pete Sampras as world number one and play for the year's final Grand Slam crown.

French Open champion Agassi of the United States advanced to the last four by defeating Frenchman Nicolas Pietrangeli 7-6, 6-3, 6-4.

"I'm sure it's going to be like lighting," Kafelnikov said. "The fans are going to go ape."

Krajicek, the 12th seed, broke the ATP and Grand Slam record of 46 aces in a match set by Goran Ivanisevic in a first-round loss to Sweden's Magnus Norman at Wimbledon in 1997. That kept Kafelnikov scrambling.

"I just tried to hang on and pray something might happen," he said. "I felt like there wasn't going to be much opportunity to break Richard's serve in the final set. I was trying to hang on until the tie-breaker."

"I was thinking just to get to that lottery, praying for one double fault or one mistake. Richard gave me the chance to win on his second serve and that was what gave me the chance to get the lead."

Third seed Kafelnikov squandered three match points before serving an ace to win the match.

"Here we go, your chance, win the match or lose the match. That's how I felt," Kafelnikov said. "I knew basically it's all the year that I was working on basically on that point."

Nice feeling to get through that."

For Krajicek, it was a disappointing end after winning more points than Kafelnikov and breaking the Russian four times while surrendering only one, that to be forced into a first-set tie-breaker.

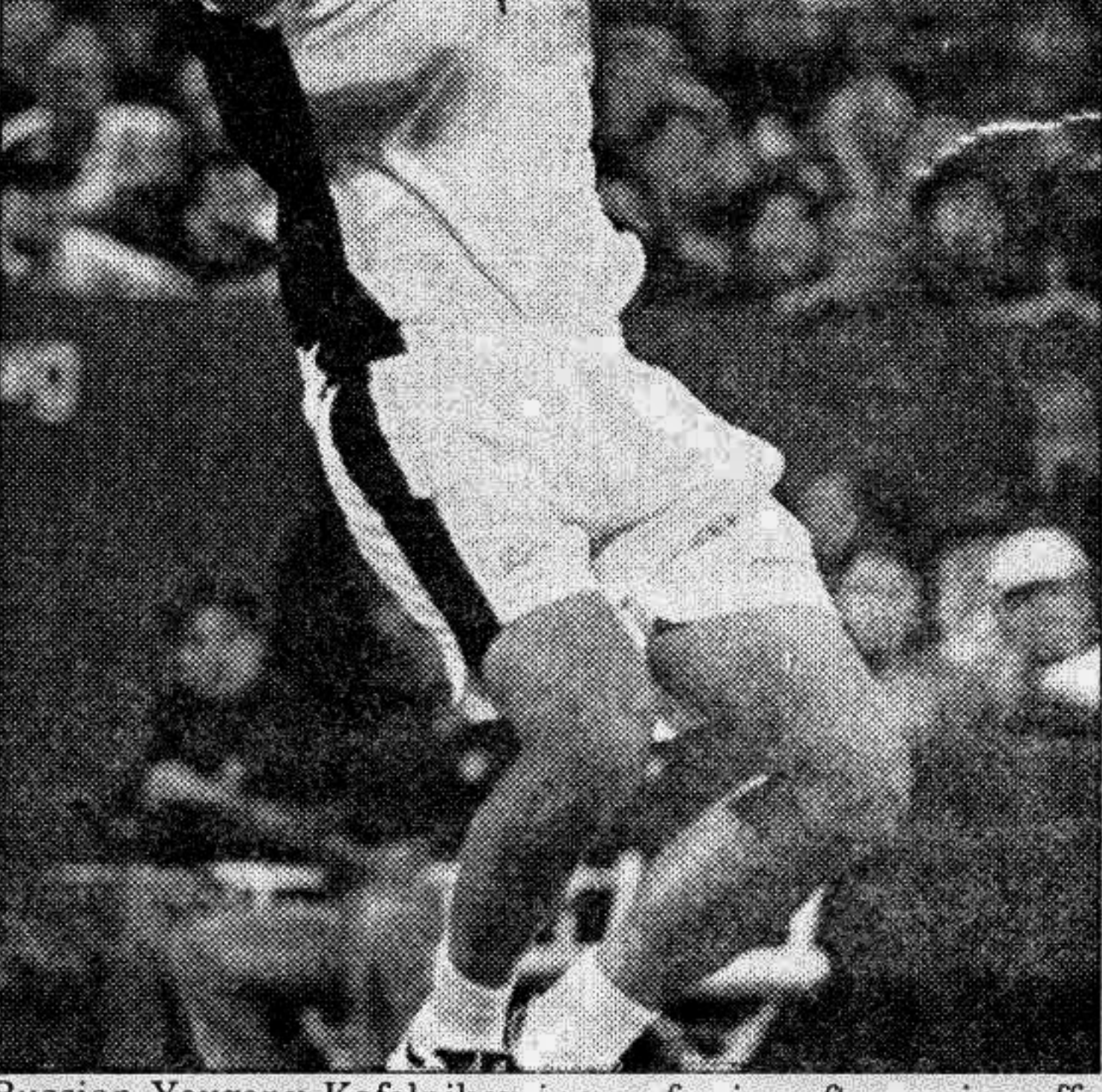
"I basically did everything right. He just played better tiebreakers," Krajicek said. "In the fifth set, he picked up his game and started serving better."

Despite his fate, Krajicek said the US Open should not do away with fifth-set tiebreakers, saying, "I don't think I can complain about it. I saved three match points. He felt the pressure. It brings out the drama."

Kafelnikov attacked Krajicek's second serves, especially before the sun set and the trickiness of Krajicek's serve rose along with his confidence.

"When I was fresh I was able to read it," Kafelnikov said. "We started the match in the daylight. I won the first two sets and started to feel a little bit tired. I never thought he was going to do that after 2 1/2 hours of playing. I gave Richard a little bit of freedom and he picked up his game."

Kafelnikov has done the same, but he was shamed into it after a woeful performance following his rise earlier this year to world number one, dropping seven matches with humiliation mounting with every failure.

OPEN NOTEBOOK

NEW YORK, Sept 9 (AFP): World number two Andre Agassi has reversed his stance about never playing Davis Cup again and is looking forward to having new captain John McEnroe directing the US team.

Agassi got his wish for direct player input on the captain's choice and the players, through Agassi, will be able to express their preference of sites and surfaces to the US Tennis Association for home ties.

But while Agassi wanted McEnroe, world number one Pete Sampras was a dear friend of ousted US captain Tom Gullickson. USTA officials said Sampras gave his approval for the switch but Agassi knows his rival's return to the squad is no sure thing.

"It was pretty unanimous," Agassi said. "Now we just get on board and we're all good. We've still got the players. Let's get it done."

Britain's Greg Rusedski was still feeling the pain of squandering a two-set lead and losing to Todd Martin in a round of 16 match at the US Open.

The heartache of the defeat equalled that he felt in dropping Davis Cup matches to Martin and the decider to Courier earlier this year.

Obviously I was distraught at losing the Courier match," Rusedski said. "It's just as bad because I really felt I had a good chance in this Slam. For me to come out and lose this way is the worst thing I could do."

Giving away a chance at a Grand Slam crown without such star rivals as Pete Sampras and Pat Rafter still in the way was agonizing for Rusedski.

"You've got so little chance at Slams," he said. "To come out and lose like this is just terrible. I felt I had a great chance. It's a tough one to swallow. There are many more opportunities, but I can't afford to let these ones go. My goal was not to beat myself. That I failed on."

Injury blow for Aussie Davis Cuppers

BRISBANE, Sept 9: Australia's hopes of beating Russia in the Davis Cup semifinals were shaken Thursday when it was learnt Mark Philippoussis would very probably join Pat Rafter on the sidelines, reports AFP.

Australia's prospects of advancing to their first final since losing 4-1 to Germany in 1993 received a major blow when Rafter was ruled out of the September 24-26 clash with the shoulder injury which forced him out of the US Open last week.

Then Philippoussis, Australia's No. 2 singles player, broke down while attempting a comeback from knee surgery. He is expected to confirm his unavailability later this week.

It could be left to teenager Lleyton Hewitt and late blooming Wayne Arthurs to repel the Russians.

Captain John Newcombe will not reveal his revamped squad until he has to submit the names of his four selected players to the International Tennis Federation on September 14.

But the injuries to Rafter, who could be out at least six weeks, and the almost certain withdrawal of Philippoussis, has opened the door for the big-serving Arthurs to make a Davis Cup debut at the age of 26.

Doubles specialist Mark Woodforde, Andrew Ilie and Jason Stoltenberg are the other candidates.

Serena storms into semis



NEW YORK, Sept 9: Serena Williams needed just 15 minutes to reach the semifinals of the US Open Tennis Championships here on Wednesday, reports AFP.

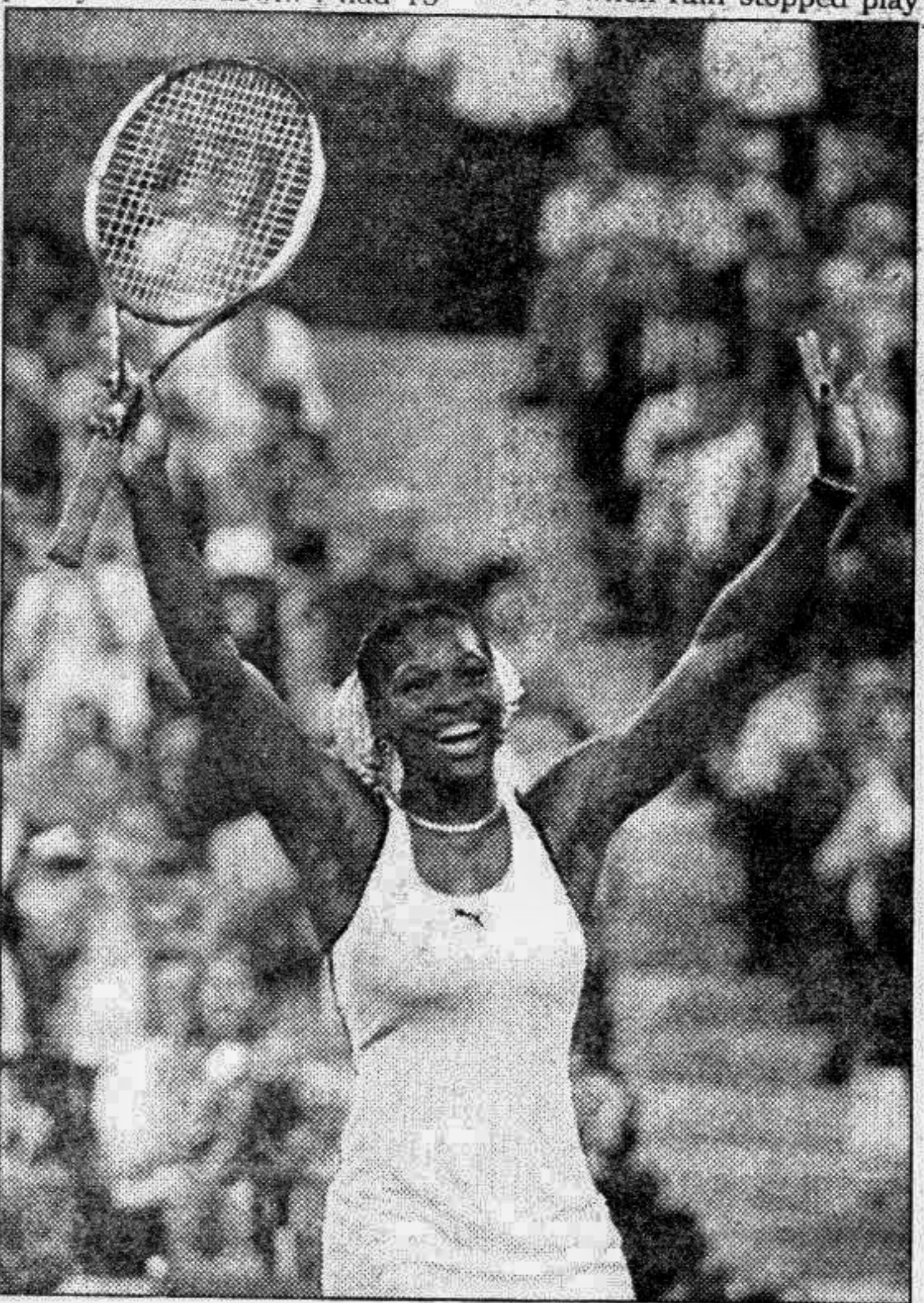
That's just the number seventh-seeded Serena blasted past fourth seed Monica Seles in a 4-6, 6-3, 6-2 quarterfinal triumph.

"I was a little nervous when I came out," admitted the 17-year-old Serena, who was in the quarterfinals of a Grand Slam for the first time. "But I completely calmed down. I had 15

aces! Wow!" The American joined her elder sister Venus, the third seed, in the semis, the first time in the history of the US Open that two sisters have made it to the final four.

There she will face defending champion and second seed Lindsay Davenport, who survived two match points and a rain delay to defeat fifth seed Mary Pierce 6-2, 3-6, 7-5.

"I should have been home when the rain came," admitted Davenport, who had just saved two match points against Pierce and broken to level the third set at 5-5 when rain stopped play

for 70 minutes.

"I should have been on my way to Manhattan and packing to go home tomorrow morning."

Instead, the 23-year-old world number two, who claimed her second Grand Slam singles title at Wimbledon in July, came back and won the last two games, advancing when Pierce coughed up her seventh double fault on match point.

"I think my serve let me down today," said Pierce, who was referring less to the fateful double than to her overall struggles putting her first serve in play.

Pierce broke Davenport in the seventh game of the third set to serve for the set at 5-4. Up 40-30, Pierce was helpless against Davenport's crosscourt backhand right on the line.

She double faulted to give Davenport a break point, saved it, then nailed a forehand winner to give herself another match point.

Her own backhand cross-court was in the alley by inches. Davenport went on to break and then the misty rain struck.

"I'm sure it was worse for her," Davenport said. "I would have liked to have kept going, but I didn't want to run on that court, especially after what happened last week."

On Sunday, Mary Joe Fernandez suffered a strained thigh muscle when she slipped on a rain-slick court. Pierce also had Fernandez in mind as the sprinkles began in the ninth game.

But Pierce said a desire to finish the match off before a possible interruption wasn't her problem in that game.

"I think probably Serena raised her level in the third, and I dropped quite a few levels," Seles said. "I wasn't getting up to the ball as much and moving as well as I did in the first set."

Serena's nerves came early and evaporated as she got Seles on the run in the second set.

She took a 4-0 lead, and even though the nine-time Grand Slam singles champion narrowed the gap to 4-3, she couldn't cope with Seles's power.

Indian duo make history



NEW YORK, Sept 9: India's Leander Paes and Mahesh Bhupathi, the world number one doubles team whose relationship hit a low

two weeks ago, pulled together here at the US Open to make tennis history, reports AFP.

Paes and Bhupathi advanced to their fourth Grand Slam men's doubles final here Wednesday, becoming the first duo in the Open era to reach all four Slam finals in the same year.

"It's a fantastic feeling," Paes said. "When I started playing with Mahesh, this is something I wanted to get. It's something I wanted to do for India. At the time I thought it was a little far-fetched a goal."

"We have proven to India we can produce champions, even if it only doubles. We can produce champions of this magnitude if we work hard."

Off the court, Paes and Bhupathi must also work on their relationship, which hit a low when they paired with others

making a bid for a Slam sweep. "Keep things simple. That's most important for the next couple of months and years," Paes said. "It'd be a shame if things didn't work out."

Bhupathi and Paes had only one match together between Wimbledon and here, losing at the ATP Championships.

"Being number one, a lot of things come with that. One of the things is people want to be on the bandwagon," Paes said. "Mahesh has his group. I have my group. People want our individual best interests."

"Suddenly, there is a communication barrier. It's something we're working on. It's something I hope gets better."

Getting both camps together is the difficult but crucial task awaiting Paes and Bhupathi after their US Open final.

Paes climbed to a career-high 73rd in singles rankings last year, and wants to crack the top 50. But he has plunged to 180th this year in a bid to concentrate on doubles and his relationship with 301st-rated Bhupathi.
