

Milan players strike back

MILAN, Sept 23: AC Milan players are hitting back at club president Silvio Berlusconi after the media mogul ridiculed their performance in the Champions League this week, reports AFP.

Berlusconi watched them struggle to a 2-1 win over Galatasaray thanks to some crucial saves by goalkeeper Christian Abbiati and reached a damning verdict: "Great Abbiati, small Milan."

However, the remark has infuriated Milan's old guard led by defenders Alessandro Costacurta and Paolo Maldini. "The president has exaggerated, that wasn't a small Milan," snapped Costacurta. "It was a positive result. Galatasaray are a good team. Try asking other sides who have come against up them. And we beat them."

The veteran libero also argued that small teams don't get results.

"We're top of our group and we're three points in front of the third-placed side. And we're unbeaten in the Serie A," he said.

Costacurta's resentment was also shared by Maldini, who as team captain tried to be diplomatic.

"Talking about a small Milan is a bit simplistic, when you consider how well we played in the first 45 minutes," he said. "But I'm not going to make a drama out of it. The season has barely started."

Maldini also tried to point out the difference between seeing a match and playing in one, saying, "People watching often see a different game."

And he tried to be realistic about Milan's performance.

They may be the Italian champions and Berlusconi may want them to win back the European Cup, but last season's league triumph came after two disastrous years as the legendary era of the club came to an end.

"We've seen worse in recent years," he said. "The important thing with Galatasaray was to win, and in the end, it's the result that counts."

"AC Milan are AC Milan. And we are always going to be compared with our recent past, and it's something which weighs heavily on us."

"Given the current situation, certain achievements are going to be very difficult to repeat, even though everybody is calling on us to do so -- from the press to the critics and to the fans."

Million dollar boost for Sino ladies

BEIJING, Sept 23: China's women's soccer team landed a million dollar sponsorship deal with a Chinese computer maker Thursday and vowed to avenge its World Cup defeat by the US at next year's Sydney Olympics, reports AFP.

The sponsorship deal was struck between the China Football Association and the Legend Group, one of China's leading information technology companies, in what was touted as the largest sponsorship ever for women's soccer in Asia.

"We are setting the goal of a gold medal in Sydney and I am sure that our dreams are shared by China's football fans," Wang Junsheng, secretary general of the CFA said.

China's women's team lost the Women's World Cup final to the US in June. At the time there were reports that Chinese players and coaches were not being paid due to a lack of state funding.

Bobic double sinks Boavista

DORTMUND, Sept 23: Two goals by former German international Fredi Bobic paved the way for a 3-1 Borussia Dortmund victory over Portuguese side Boavista here Wednesday, keeping them second in Group C of the Champions League, reports AFP.

Dortmund, the 1997 European champions, are level with Rosenborg of Norway on four points after Rosenborg drew 2-2 with Feyenoord of the Netherlands in Norway. Feyenoord have two points and Boavista none.

Dortmund worked hard against an uninspired Boavista, who were intent on defence from the outset and who stubbornly failed to revise their attitude even when Bobic struck in the 53rd and 65th minutes to put the home side in command after Andi Moller's 40th-minute opener.

Lloyd calls for physio

UNDATED (Internet report): West Indies manager Clive Lloyd has asked the Cricket Board (WICB) to appoint a full-time physiotherapist to look after injured players.

role hard to deal with at first. Moller's goal was an unexpected breakthrough and came from a 20-metre free kick which curled neatly inside the near post.

Boavista's equaliser four minutes later, a Rui Bento header, was likewise a surprise, but a fair reward because neither side deserved a half time lead.

Boavista coach Jaime Paci eco made an effort to stir things up in the 45th minute when he sent in playmaker Formoso but, with his comrades solely intent on holding off Dortmund with rock solid defence, he had few opportunities to be creative.

The character of the game could have been different had Boavista's Rogerio been luckier with a promising chance after just three minutes but it went begging and Bobic was allowed time to grow into his role as match winner.

His header in the 53rd minute to make it 2-1 came from another Moller free kick after assistance from Otto Addo.

For his second goal the tall Bobic was well served by Brazilian winger Evanilson, who drew the keeper and then passed to Bobic in the middle for a gentle tap-in.

His equaliser gave his new club a deserved point last week at Feyenoord, although his enthusiasm got the better of him as he pulled a shoulder muscle punching the air celebrating his second goal. As a result he was replaced by Heiko Herrlich after 73 minutes.

Bobic laughed off his painful shoulder, even though shoulder injuries and collar bone breaks have been a debilitating problem for him in recent seasons.

"I have to be a bit careful with my shoulder. It tweaked for a moment but then it was okay," the striker said.

Bobic has become adept at scoring valuable goals for Dortmund since moving northward from VfB Stuttgart

this season. Moller said he was wary of the Dortmund fans getting impatient with the side before they finally found their goalscoring touch.

"They knew that Trondheim beat Boavista 3-0 away last week and they thought we would score a sackful tonight as well. It was actually hard work for us. I thought we controlled the game over the full 90 minutes though and deserved to win."

Dortmund coach Michael Skibbe was happy with the three points but annoyed at the way his side almost let Boavista in for a point.

"The Portuguese were rigid at the back and broke fast when they got possession. That made it tough for us and it was a shame we let them equalise just before the break. That goal was totally unnecessary," said Skibbe.

New UEFA home unveiled

Hockeyroos defeat India

SYDNEY, Sept 23: Australia cast aside their goal-scoring woes to qualify for the gold medal game at the pre-Olympic field hockey tournament here today with a 5-3 win over India, reports AFP.

But national coach Terry Walsh was far from satisfied with his players, the Indian opponents and tournament officials.

Walsh was annoyed by a "casual, carefree" second half performance from his players who allowed India to rally from 5-1 down with 16 minutes remaining.

And he was also perturbed by several fiery on-field incidents, believing a stronger action should have been taken, especially after forward Stephen Holt's head was cut by a stick in one skirmish.

"We were told at the tournament director's briefing that any physical contests like that were going to be treated in the harshest of manners," said Walsh.

The officials gave out two green card warnings — one to Australia, the other to India — and three yellow card sinbinnings — to Holt and India's Anwar Khan after their clash and to India's Subhir Singh Gill.

Walsh did not consider Khan's yellow card sufficient. "When a guy has a slash on his head and he is six foot five..." said Walsh.

Oxford erase Everton

LONDON, Sept 23: Second Division Oxford United knocked Premier League Everton out of the English League Cup yesterday as a 1-0 win at Goodison Park gave them a 2-1 aggregate second round success, reports Reuters.

Joey Beauchamp scored the only goal after 13 minutes for an Oxford side that had managed only two wins in their eight league games this season.

Everton, playing a side full of reserves, sent on first choice strikers Francis Jeffers and Kevin Campbell in the second half but could not find the equaliser.

Premier League Coventry City also went out as their 3-1 home victory was not enough to prevent Tranmere Rovers going through 6-4 on aggregate.

Tranmere, bottom of Division One with just four points, did the damage with their 5-1 first leg victory a week ago.

Davenport, Seles glide



TOKYO, Sept 23: US Fed Cup teammates Lindsay Davenport and Monica Seles shrugged off their jet-lag and wasted no time storming into the quarterfinals of the Princess Cup tennis tournament on Thursday, reports AFP.

Top-seeded Davenport, who scored two singles wins over Russia in the Fed Cup final on her home ground last weekend, stayed on the Centre Court for

"I was happy I played so well," said Davenport, who arrived here with Seles Tuesday evening and is still suffering from jet-lag.

"To play well like I did today and to have an easy match tomorrow and hopefully the day after. You never know how I was going to start off, but this is exactly how I wanted to start off."

Davis Cup semis start today Aussies aim at Safin



BRISBANE, Sept 23: Marat Safin, the hero of Russia's tense last start win over the Slovak Republic, will be targeted by Australia as a potential weak link in Friday's Davis Cup tennis semifinal here, reports AFP.

The 19-year-old big-serving Safin was drawn Thursday to face Australian designated number one Lleyton Hewitt in the opening singles rubber.

World number two Yevgeny Kafelnikov, expected to win both his singles matches here this weekend, will take on Australian Cup rookie Wayne Arthurs in the second rubber.

The Russians are favourites to beat the injury-depleted Australians in the semifinal with the winners playing either France or Belgium in the final.

France and Belgium play this weekend in the south-west French city of Pau.

Australia go into the home tie on grass minus world number 3 Patrick Rafter (shoulder injury) and 21st-ranked Mark Philippoussis (knee) and have called on 18-year-old Hewitt (ranked 32) and 28-year-old Arthurs (90) to take the fight to the fancied Russians.

Safin beat Slovak's Dominik Hrbaty to clinch their quarterfinal tie in Moscow last July in the deciding fifth rubber after Kafelnikov had been trounced in the last day's opening singles by Karol Kucera.

But the Australians are working on Safin's perceived weakness playing on grass and have welcomed the pairing of Hewitt against him in the psychologically important opening singles match.

"But I'm at least happy that I had a pretty easy match. I just try to have a good night's sleep. Hopefully I'm able to sleep and just keep ready for tomorrow's match," added the defending champion.

The top four seeds, including Julie Halard-Decugis of France and Amanda Coetzer of South Africa, received first-round byes.

Third-seeded Halard-Decugis had a 6-1, 6-0 win over Nicole Pratt of Australia, while fourth-seeded Coetzer had the toughest time on the centre court to beat Canadian Maureen Drake 6-2, 6-3, 6-4.

Other seeded players avoided any upsets with Amelie Mauresmo of France, Conchita Martinez of Spain, American Amy Frazier and Japan's Ai Sugiyama underlining their better rankings with straight-set wins.

Mauresmo earned a rematch against Lindsay Davenport by fending off the challenge from Shinobu Asagoe in the second round.

The fifth seed from France, who caused a sensation by reaching the Australian Open final beating Davenport on her way, faced a late challenge from the Japanese qualifier before scoring a 6-2, 7-5 win.

Mauresmo took it easy in the lopsided first set against Asagoe, 147th in the world, breaking three games while hitting a double fault to lose her own game in the fourth.

Then she appeared to lose her concentration after taking an early 3-1 lead in the second set to be tied at 3-3, 4-4 and then 5-5.

But Mauresmo steadied herself to take the following seven points in a row before forcing a forehand error off Asagoe on her third match point.

"It's always better playing in this weather than with the roof closed and the rain going on outside, but I don't know it is anything to do with the match," said Mauresmo, who played perfectly with the roof closed Tuesday.

Sixth-seeded Martinez breezed past Tatiana Panova of Russia 6-1, 6-1, while seventh-seeded Frazier, the only player to have beaten Seles in this tournament, downed Japan's Yuka Yoshida 6-3, 6-2 on outside courts.

Eighth-seeded Sugiyama, fresh from her victory in the US Open mixed doubles, continued the momentum beating American Jane Chi 6-2, 6-4.

"This is what we really wanted," said Australian captain John Newcombe after the draw.

"Lleyton can go out against Safin and get the job done and then Wayne (Arthurs) can come out against Yevgeny one-up."

"All the pressure would then be on Kafelnikov and I wouldn't want to be facing Wayne Arthurs in that situation."
