But Kargil action has proved that our army can throw out intruders, he added.

Dhaka protests deployment of Indian troops along border

Bangladesh has expressed its concern over the deployment of Indian troops along the border, a foreign office spokesman said yesterday, reports BSS.

The spokesman said Bangladesh High Commissioner to New Delhi Mostafa Faruque Mohammed met Indian Minister of State for External Affairs Basundara Raje and expressed Dhaka's concern over the development along the common border.

Mostafa Faruque also expressed the government's grave concern over a series of border incidents in recent times in which a number of Bangladeshi nationals, including BDR personnel were killed. He further stated that there was also intrusion by Indians into Bangladesh territory, the spokesman



Ban around EC as Opposition prepares to lay siege tomorrow

The BNP-led opposition alliance has taken elaborate preparations to lay siege to the Election Commission office tomorrow to press the Chief Election Commissioner to quit immediately paving the way 'for fair elections'.

As part of the programme announced on September 22, the BNP, Jatiya Party, Jamaate-Islami and Islamic Oikya Jote (IOJ) will separately march tomorrow morning to lay siege on different spots converging on the EC offices.

The government, ahead of the planned 'siege' programme of the opposition, has imposed a 24-hour ban from 6am on Thursday over a wide area (about two kilometres) around the EC on holding any gathering, procession and demonstration.

The Dhaka Metropolitan

Police Commissioner under two specific articles of the DMP Ordinance has imposed the restriction fearing disruption of peace and discipline as well as security of life and property. On a previous occasion, the

BNP after the Pabna-2 by-polls "laid siege" on the EC office on December 17 last year demanding resignation of CEC Muhammad Abu Hena for his alleged failure to maintain neutrality. At that time the prohibited area for gathering was smaller than this time. The restricted areas are

The Chief Metropolitan magistrate, Dhaka yesterday issued warrant for arrest of three businessmen and attachment of their property for their alleged involvement in smuggling of 24.1 kg heroin into the country recently. The three are Abul Kamal,

Mohiuddin and Jahangir. The Department of Narcotics (DNC) sought warrant for arrest of four businessmen and attachment of their property. The court issued warrant against the three as specific address of the rest one - Hanif - could not be submitted to the court.

DNC Sources yesterday said that acting on a tip-off, they conducted an operation at the Palwel Market at Naya Paltan in the city late Monday night to

arrest two more persons allegedly involved in the racket But they fled away. The DNC personnel then arrested two other persons --

Nurul Afsar and Mir Hossain -from a travel agency office at the market on charge of helping the suspects flee. The arrested two were pro-duced before the Metropolitan Magistrate's court. The court sent them to Dhaka Central

The consignment of heroin which was recovered from Hotel Rajmoni Isa Kha in the city on September 20 was flown to Dhaka in a PIA flight from Pakistan. Some PIA men might be involved in the racket, DNC sources claimed.
