Police hunt for Shikdar's associate Jalil Gazi

JHALAKATI, Oct 3: Amid a flurry of speculation that associates of Khulna's top terrorist Ershad Shikdar have taken shelter in different areas of the district after his arrest, police have launched a massive hunt for them, reports UNB.

Police arrested one of his associates Khalilur Rahman of Binayakati in Sadar thana from Palbari in the town on Thursday. They are also looking for Jalil Gazi of Nanguli village in Nalchhiti thana.

Gazi, a former police constable, was said to have seen in the town recently. While he was working in Khulna, Gazi had made a good relation with Ershad Shikdar and later he was transferred to Rangamati.

Instead of joining his new office in Rangamati, Gazi reportedly quit his job and joined Shikdar's cadre.

Bidyut, a local leader of Jativarabadi Sechhasebak Dal. died reportedly in police firing during a clash between policemen and pro-hartal activists.

Tortured maid rescued by HR activists

An employer beat a 30-yearold maid in the city, trimmed her hair and filed a case accusing her of stealing gold ornaments, police and human rights activists said.

The battered maid, Khadiza Begum, daughter of Fazal Miah of Gaibandha district, was rescued by police from in front of her employer's residence at West Nakhalpara at about 11:30 am, Tejgaon police said.

Police took Khadiza into their custody and filed a nonbailable case against her allegedly at the instance of the employer -- Reaz -- and his actress wife Nasima.

But human rights activists later managed to take her into their custody. They also helped the victim file a case against her employer with the same police station.

Alena Khan, a human rights activist told The Daily Star that Tejgaon police had rescued her from in front of one Reaz's house on the basis of their information. Khadiza was mercilessly beaten by Reaz and his wife. Alena alleged.

Police first refused to take any case on behalf of the victim, she alleged. Police later registered a case against Khadiza's employer when human rights lawyers pleaded on her behalf.

Khadiza, when produced before the CMM's court, was handed over to safe custody of human rights activists. Reaz, accused of assaulting the maid, was released on bail.

PM to visit Shikdar's stronghold
